(2) An interim payment of poundage shall be paid to all Collectors who, on, or before, the prescribed date shall have lodged a sum equal to one third of the first moiety of the current rate plus the full amount of arrears included in the warrant. The interim payment shall be at the normal basic rate of poundage plus 25% bonus. No interim payment shall be paid to any collector, in pursuance of this clause, who

has not lodged the prescribed amount by the prescribed date. (3) After the collection of the entire first moiety and arrears has been closed, poundage at the normal basic rate shall be paid on the balance of the amount collected on which poundage has not already been paid under clause (2), provided however that any Collector who shall not have closed the collection of the entire first moiety and arrears by the 31st day of October, shall forfeit the amount of any bonus paid to him on the interim payment referred to in clause (2).

(4) On the closing of the second moiety of the collection poundage shall be paid at the basic rate to the Collector subject to the approval of the Minister who, as heretofore shall take into consideration the date of the closing of the warrant and the amount of arrears carried forward into the warrant for the next succeeding year.

(5) Any Collector who, on, or before, the 31st day of March at the close of the financial year, shall have lodged more than 75% of his warrant, shall, subject to the Minister's approval be paid a bonus of 25% additional commission on the excess over 75% of the warrant so lodged provided however, that no monies lodged by the Collector to qualify for the bonus referred to shall subsequently be included in the Collector's rate arrears lists. The bonus payable in pursuance of this clause shall be conditional upon the closing of the entire warrant, less the amount of any arrears struck off or carried forward to the next warrant, by a date not later than one calendar month after the close of the financial year.

(6) Where substantial improvement is made in the rate collection, as compared with the preceding year, and where the amount of arrears carried forward does not exceed $7\frac{1}{2}\%$ of the warrant closed the bonus of 25% referred to in clause (5) may, subject to the Minister's approval be increased to 30%.

(7) Nothing in these regulations shall be construed as altering in any way the liability of the Collector or his sureties, or the provisions contained in the Public Bodies Orders regarding the dates fixed for the closing of the first and second moieties of the warrant.

(8) The dates fixed by these regulations may be revised by the Minister in relation to any Collector who, owing to unforseen contingencies, and through no fault of his own, does not receive his warrant for collection until an abnormally late date. The failure or delay on the part of the Collector in closing the preceding year's collection shall not however, be accepted as a cause for the revision of the dates fixed.

(9) Any dispute or disagreement regarding the interpretation of these regulations shall be determined by the Minister whose decision shall be final.

As indicated in Minute No. 5951 of the proceedings of the Galway County Council at its meeting on the 3rd October, 1936, a Committee, consisting of the Chairman of the Council, Councillors Martin Quinn, Martin Cooke, Martin O'Regan and Thomas Flanagan, was appointed to inquire into the revenue received from the Town Hall, Galway, the expenses

,

incurred in connection with the building, and the utility of the premises, with a view to submitting such recommendations as the Committee might think fit for the consideration of the Council. A meeting of the Committee was convened for Tuesday, 17th November, 1936, and the following members of the Committee were present:—Councillor Martin Quinn, Chairman of the Finance Committee, Councillor Mn.

O'Regan and Councillor T. Flanagan. A schedule was submitted giving particulars of the average expenses incurred in connection with the Town Hall during the four years ended on the 31st March, 1936, and disclosed that the average annual expenditure for the four years referred to was £201 16s. 11d., in addition to which a Fire Insurance Premium was paid, the net amount of the new premium being £9 5s. 9d. per annum. It was pointed out to Mr. Hardiman, who was in attendance at the meeting, that the net revenue derived by the Council from the letting of the premises under the present arrangement was only about £3 17s. 4d. per annum on the average experience of the last four years, and that in these circumstances the Council could not reasonably be expected to contemplate the expenditure of a sum of £614 estimated by the County Surveyor to be necessary for the repair of the roof of the Town Hall, unless arrangements could be made for the review of the present

It was unanimously decided to recommend to the Council that the County Council expend such sum as may be necessary in the opinion of the County Surveyor on the repair of the roof of the Town Hall, that the rent of the premises be increased from £180 to £300 per annum, and that the lessee be granted a ten years lease of the premises, subject to the general conditions with the second to the premise of the premises.

The rent of £300 per annum was arrived at by taking the existing rent of £180 per annum and adding to it (a) a sum of £80 per annum being the approximate amount which would be required to redeem a loan equivalent to the amount of the estimated expenses of the repairs over a period of ten years with interest at the rate of 5% per annum, and (b) a further sum of £40 in consideration of the proposed lease for a period of ten years, and with a view to increasing the

net revenue of the Council above the present absurb figure. It was the opinion of the Members, however, that if the County Surveyor could have the necessary repairs carried out satisfactorily at a lower figure than is estimated the additional sum of £80 added to the rent to recoup the Council for the expenses to be incurred on the repairs might be reduced accordingly by reference to loan tables to ascertain the amount required to redeem a loan of the sum which would be necessary for the carrying out of the repairs.

Mr. Hardiman indicated that he was not prepared to accept the proposal made, and it was intimated to him that it was open to him to submit an alternative proposal for consideration by the Council in conjunction with the recommendations of the Committee.

6099. Collection of Rate Arrears:

The following report was submitted by the Secretary on the collection of Rate Arrears:—

Chairman and Members

of the County Council.

Collection of Rate Arrears.

I have been continually impressing upon the Rate Collectors the necessity of paying special attention to the collection of rate arrears with a view to preventing the accumulation of arrears on any holdings in their districts. Notwithstanding the numerous Circulars sent to the Collectors it appears that they are not paying adequate attention to this matter, and their neglect would appear to be attributable to their reluctance to incur legal expense in connection with the collection of rates in their districts.

The total arrears carried forward at the end of the year 1935/'36 amounted to no less than £22,045, and at this late date practically all of that amount should have been collected, but from the reports which I have obtained from the Rates Inspectors it appears that only about £4881 has been collected up to the present, leaving £17164 still outstanding on account of rate arrears due for 193/'36 and earlier years. This state of affairs is very serious as the continued neglect of the Collectors is, as previously pointed out, likely to result in an accumulation of arrears which may ultimately have to be written off as irrecoverable.

There are few rate collection districts in which the collection of rate arrears is progressing satisfactorily, but the following cases which are particularly bad necessitate special mention:—

Rate Collector A. J. Manning. The arrears carried forward to this Collector's warrant amounted to £1943, reprecenting 16% of his 1935/36 collection. He has collected up to the present only £220, leaving £1723 still outstanding. There are admittedly some large items due, the recovery of which precents special difficulty. Rates due on the lands of Mr. J. Elder cannot, I a minformed, be recovered until the lands are taken over by the Land Commission. These would amount to about £346. Rates due on the lands of P. J. Caynor, amounting to £179 10s. 9d., are also being discharged by the Land Commission. There is also a sum of over £130 due in respect of arrears on lands owned by Mr. J. McKeigue. There is, I understand, some difficulty in recovering these rates at present, but according to information which I received some time ago I understand that these rates could have been recovered if the Collector had taken the proper steps to recover them at the appropriate time.

Apart from those items which present special difficulty there are a very large number of items due in respect of arrears for which the Collector appears to have taken no adequate steps for recovery.

This Collector has been extremely unsatisfactory and the backward state of his collection has been brought to the notice of the Council on numerous occasions. The Council should issue a special warning to him, and should make it clear to him that if his collection is not in a satisfactory condition at the close of the financial year the warrant will not be issued to him for the year 1937/38.

Rate Collector R. Muldoon. The collection of arrears in this case is deplorably backward. The total arrears carried forward amount to £738, representing 16.9% of the Collector's warrant for the year 1935/'36. Out of this sum of £738 only £8 has been collected, leaving £730 still due. There are admittedly rates due on island holdings which present difficulty, but these would amount to less than £100. The rate collection in the town of Clifden and in the surrounding district is extremely unsatisfactory. The Rate Collector attributes this to some extent to the absence of Pound accommodation in Clifden. I have been endeavouring to hasten the provision of such accommodation there, but while its absence up to the present may have had some slight affect on the rate collection I am not satisfied that the Collector could

not have made greater progress with the collection of the Poor Rates in her district if she had availed more readily of the assistance of the Courts.

Rate Collector J. Flaherty. The arrears brought forward in this case amount to £1487, representing 14.3% of the Collector's warrant for the year 1935/'36, and of this amount only £301 has been recovered leaving £1186 still uncollected. Even when due allowance is made for the difficulty of collecting rates on Island Eddy, the rate arrears on which amount to between £120 and £130, the progress made by this Collector with the collection of rate arrears must be regarded as extremely unsatisfactory, and a warning should be issued to him in the same terms as to Collector Manning.

Rate Collector M. Finnerty. The arrears carried forward in this case amount to £2140, representing 13.2% of the Collector's warrant for the year 1935/'36. Of this amount only £564 has been collected, leaving £1576 still outstanding. This Collector does not appear to be able to cope with the work involved in the collection of rates in his collection district, which is the largest collection district in the County, and in common with the other Collectors he appears to be reluctant to take legal proceedings and defers taking action until the accumulated arrears have become so great that it is difficult to recover them even with the assistance of the Courts. He should be warned that if there is not a substantial improvement in the condition of his arrears at the end of the present financial year the warrant for the year 1937/'38 cannot be issued to him.

Rate Collector T. Corbett. This Collector's rate collection is, without exception, the worst in the entire County. The arrears carried forward into his warrant amount to no less than £2160, representing 19% of his 1935/'36 rate collection, and of this amount only £482 has been collected, leaving £1678 still outstanding. The Collector does not appear to exert himself sufficiently to collect the rates due by the ratepayers in his district, and he does not carry out the instructions given to him regarding the taking of immediate action for the recovery of arrears at the commencement of the financial year. He defers taking any legal proceedings until near the close of the financial year, and even then it is only in a small number of cases that he avails of the assistance of the Courts. If he were more energetic and availed of the powers given to him under his warrant there is no reason why the condition of his rate collection should be so extremely unsatisfactory.

Rate Collector J. Hobbs. The arrears carried forward in this case amount to £961, or 9.7% of the Collector's warrant for the year 1935/'36. He has up to the present collected only £93 on account of these arrears leaving £868 still uncollected.

Rate Collector M. Goode. The arrears carried forward in this case amount to £1044 or 12.2% of the Collector's warrant for the year 1935/'36. Of this amount only £132 has been collected leaving £912 still outstanding on account of arrears

The Collection of Poor Rate in the Loughrea Collection District is notoriously bad, and the present Collectors do not appear to be making any efforts to improve it. In the Portumna Area Collectors J. Hobbs and M. Goode have made some improvement on the extremely unsatisfactory record of their predecessors, but the progress of the rate collection in Portumna must still be regarded as unsatisfactory. Portumna and Loughrea are undoubtedly the worst districts in the County for the collection of Poor Rates.

At the end of the present financial year the Council should consider what steps should be taken regarding rates due on Inishboffin, Inishmaan, Inisheer, Turbot Island, Inishark, Island Eddy and Inchaquin. With regard to Island Eddy and Inchaquin I would suggest that if an undertaking is given by the ratepayers on those islands that they will pay their rates regularly in future only two years arrears of rates should be carried forward to be collected with the rate for the year 1937/'38.

3.—Age Limits—Candidates must be not less than 20 or more than 30 years of age on the 1st May, 1937. A person who has National Service (see No. 5 below) may, in reckoning age, deduct the number of years served from his actual age.

4.—Candidates must have been ordinarily resident in County Galway or be the children of persons ordinarily resident in County Galway on the 1st January, 1937.

5.—The duties shall be such as may be assigned to the officer from time to time by the Secretary of the County Council.

6.—The apointment will be made on the result of a competitive examination in Irish (oral and written), English, Arithmetic, History and Geography. The standard of the examination will be the Intermediate Certificate. The pass mark will be 50 per cent for Irish and 333 of the maximum for the remaining subjects. The Council shall have power to add ten per cent to the aggregate marks obtained by any candidate who had had National Service between 1st April, 1916 and 30th September, 1923 as a member of the Irish Republican Army, the Irish Volunteers, Fianna Eireann, or in the case of a female applicant, Cumann na mBan, Applicants for additional marks will be required to submit satisfactory evidence to the Council.

The candidates who pass in every subject and obtain the highest aggregate marks will, subject to satisfactory evidence as to age, health and character, be appointed to the posts. In the event of two or more candidates obtaining the same aggregate marks, the order of merit will be decided by the marks obtained in Irish.

7.—The Local Offices and Employments (Gaeltacht) Orders, 1926-1932 will apply to the appointments, which will be made subject to the sanction of the Minister for Local Government and Public Health.

8.—Female candidates, if appointed, will be required to resign on marriage, and to give one month's notice to the Secretary of the County of her intention to get married.

9.—A Candidate, when appointed, will enter on a probationary period of one year, and will not be finally appointed until the Secretary of the County Council certifies as to his or her fitness for the post. During the probationary period the persons appointed must, if required, become proficient in typewriting.

Labourers' etc., Wages:

Submitted recommendations of Committee appointed by the County Council under Minute No. 6267a, dated the 8th January, 1938. Recommendations made at meeting of the Committee held on the 11th January, 1938, as follows:—

The following Members of the Committee were in attendance:—Councillor E. Corbett, Presiding; Councillors McKeigue, Martin Quinn, Fury, King, Lambert, O'Regan, Mannion, Nestor and Joyce.

The following officials were in attendance:—Mr. C. I. O'Flynn, Secretary, Mr. G. Lee, County Surveyor, Mr. M. Sweeney, A.C.S., Mr. R. W. Powell, A.C.S., Mr. E. Lynch, A.C.S., Mr. J. B. Collins, A.C.S., Mr. M, F. O'Keeffe, A.C.S. and Mr. M, A. Martyn, A.C.S.

Road Labourers' Wages:—The Committee recommended that the wage of the ordinary road labourer, at present employed at 27/- per week, be increased to 30/- per week, the increase to take effect, subject to the sanction of the Minister

for Local Government, as from the first Monday succeeding the 1st day of April, 1938. It was decided, however, that this increase should not operate in the case of works financed by Grants allocated for the relief of unemployment. The increased rate is, however, intended to operate in connection with all ordinary maintenance works and road improvement works.

Carters:—It was recommended by the Committee that carters henceforth employed on all works whether financed out of the Council's own funds or out of Grants allocated by the Government be remunerated at the rate of 50/- per week instead of 54/- per week as hitherto, or at the daily rate of 8/4d. instead of 9/-.

New Works:—In order to meet portion of the expense which will be involved in the operation of the new increased rate of pay for labourers, the Committee recommend that a sum of £12,000 which is usually allocated for new works carried out in pursuance of Notices of Motion submitted by County Councillors and included in the Road Works Scheme be reduced to £8,000 for the year 1938/'39, and that having regard to the large allocation made in respect of Minor Relief Scheme Grants to the Oughterard Area the sum of £8,000 proposed to be allocated for new works for the year 1938/'39, be allocated to the County Electoral Areas of Galway, Tuam, Loughrea, and Ballinasloe.

In submitting its recommendations the Committee had regard to the rates of pay obtaining in other Counties and to the expenditure of County Galway on road works compared with the amount expended in areas administered by other local authorities. It also had regard to the disparity between the existing rate of remuneration of carters and the existing rate of wages paid to ordinary labourers.

It has been estimated that an increase of 3/- per week for ordinary labourers will involve a net increase of £6,800 in the amount payable out of the Council's own funds in respect of road works if the volume of work to be carried out during the year 1938/'39 is to be similar to that which is being done during the year 1937/38. Against this increase of £6,800, however, there will be a saving of £4,000 if the Committee's recommendation regarding new works are accepted, and the reduction in the rate of pay to carters will save about £2,500 further.

5

The Council will not, however, reap the entire benefit of this £2,500 as 40% of that portion applicable to Main Roads will be lost on the recoupment of Main Road Expenditure. The net saving to the rates accruing from the reduction of the carters' remuneration will be about £1840 and the effects of the Committee's recommendations may be summarised as follows:—
