THE COUNTY GALWAY CIVIC IMPROVEMENT SCHEME.

INTERPRETATION

1. In the interpretation of this Scheme except where excluded by the Context:

"THE COUNCIL" means the Council of the County of Galway.

"THE FUNCTIONAL AREA OF THE COUNCIL" means the County Health District of County Galway, "THE SCHEME" means the County Galway Civic Improvement Scheme. but it does not include the Borough of Galway, or the Urban District of Ballinasloe.

"THE PURPOSES OF THE SCHEME" shall include all or each of the following purposes: (a) The provision of money, lands, buildings, or other facilities for the advancement or improvement of the education of persons residing in the Functional area of the Council;

(b) the provision of Scholarships for Secondary schools, Vocational Schools of every kind, Agricultural Colleges, Training Colleges, or Universities for the benefit of children of persons residing in the Functional area of the Council;

the provision and development of Public Parks and recreation grounds of all kinds; the provision, development, and improvement of Swimming Baths, or Bathing places;

the provision, development, and improvement of Halls and other buildings as Libraries, Theatres, Art centres, Dance Halls, Gymnasia or recreation centres for Towns, Villages, or other groups of people in the Functional area of the Council;

the provision of financial aid, land, buildings, or other facilities for the development

and improvement of outdoor Sports and Athletics of every kind; the development and improvement of rowing, sailing and aquatic sports of every kind, and the provision of financial aid, land, buildings, or other facilities for the development of the inland waterways and lakes in the Functional area of the Council.

the development and improvement of the Fisheries in the Functional area of the Council; the maintenance, repair, and upkeep of any lands, buildings, or other facilities pro-

the provision of financial assistance, land, buildings, or other facilities for anything which, in the opinion of the Council may tend to improve the amenities of the Functional area of the Council, for which in the opinion of the Council is conducive to the welfare of the inhabitants or any class of inhabitants of the Functional area of the

"THE OPERATIVE DATE" means the date on which the Scheme is adopted by the Council.

2. The Scheme shall come into force on the operative date, and as from the operative date all gifts, rievices, or bequests of real or personal property for the purposes of the Scheme which shall be accepted by the Council shall be administered and managed by the Council in accordance with the Scheme.

3. (a) When property is vested in the Council for the purposes of the Scheme without declaring any particular purpose towards which it is to be applied, the Council shall in its uncontrolled discretion apply such property and the income thereof for or towards all or any of the purposes of the Scheme. Such property is hereinafter referred to as "property held for the general purposes of the Scheme."

(b) When property is vested in the Council and any special trust is declared in respect thereof by the instrument creating the trust, the Council shall apply such property and the income thereof in accordance with such special trust and subject to such trust (if any), if there shall be a surplus of such property or the income thereof after satisfying the purposes of the trusts so declared, the Council shall in its uncontrolled discretion apply such surplus for or towards all or any of the purposes of the Scheme. Such property is hereinafter referred to as "Property held on Special Trusts."

(c) The provisions of the Scheme shall apply to property held for the general purposes of the Scheme, and to property held on Special Trusts and the Income thereof respectively.

The Council shall have power to accept or decline to accept any property or trust.

The Council shall not, without the consent of the Department of Local Government and Public Health, accept any property, which shall entail upon it any liability to make any payments (other than rates and Taxes) to any Corporation, person, or persons other than for the purposes

(c) It shall be lawful for, but not incumbent on the Council to pay or discharge any rent, or other outgoings, charges, or payments in respect of any property held by it for the purposes of the Scheme, and to improve, maintain, and repair such property, and to insure the same against loss or damage by fire, and to defray the costs and expenses incurred by them in so doing out of the income or capital of that property, or if such income or capital shall prove insufficient, then out of the income or Capital of any property held for the general purposes of the Scheme, or in the case of property held on Special Trusts at the discretion of the Council wholly or partially out of the income or capital of property held for the discretion of the Council wholly or partially out of the income or capital of property held for the general purposes of the Scheme.

5. The Council shall create a Fund to be known as "The County Galway Civic Improvement Fund" (hereinafter called "The Fund") into which shall be paid all monies given for the purposes of the Scheme and the Income and rents and profits from all property whether real or personal which shall be vested in the

6. The Council may accept all or any gifts, devices, or bequests of money, stocks, shares, securities, or other chattel property, or of freehold or leasehold, lands rent charges, or other hereditaments which are given to the Council for the purposes of the Scheme, and in the acceptance of such gifts all the said moneys shall

be paid to the credit of the Fund, and all personal chattels, freehold lands, leasehold lands, rent charges, or other hereditments shall be vested in the Council for the respective estate or interest on which the same

7. It shall be lawful for the Council to pay or transfer any property held by it, or vested in it for the general purposes of the Scheme to any person, or persons, or to a Corporation, who shall undertake to apply the same for or towards such of the purposes of the Scheme as may be determined by the Council without the Council being responsible or liable for the loss or misapplication thereof.

8. The Fund and all real and personal property vested in the Council for the purposes of the Scheme shall be managed by the Council and it may at its absolute discretion :-

Apply the whole or any part thereof whether capital or income,

(1) In or towards the payment of the expenses of the Scheme provided that the general expenses of the Scheme shall not be paid out of property held on Special Trusts. (2) For or towards all or any of the purposes of the Scheme.

(b) Raise money by Mortgaging the same, or any part thereof, but so that no mortgagee shall be concerned to enquire into the necessity or propriety of raising money, or as to the amount required, or

(c) Sell the same, or any part thereof, and concur in making partition or exchange thereof, or any part thereof with power to give or receive money for equality of exchange or partition, and to sell, exchange, or partition the surface apart from the minerals, or the minerals apart from the surface, and to execute any conveyance for the purpose aforesaid, provided that upon any sale, exchange, or partition purporting to be made in pursuance of the power of sale, exchange, or partition, hereinbefore contained no purchaser or purchasers dealing bona fide with the Council shall be bound or concerned to enquire whether the occasion for executing or exercising such power has arisen, nor shall the purchaser or purchasers be concerned to see to the application of the purchase money.

Let the same, or any part thereof for such term of years or shorter term at such rent and subject to such conditions, stipulations, or provisions as the Council shall determine, PROVIDED ALWAYS that no letting other than a letting expressed to be for the temporary convenience of the Council for a period not exceeding one year, shall be made without first obtaining the approval in writing of the Department of Local Government and Public Health thereto.

Invest any moneys in the Fund which are not for the time being required to be expended in any manner in which according to the law for the time being in force Trust moneys may be invested, or in

the purchase of freehold or leasehold property with power from time to time to vary such investments. PROVIDED ALWAYS that any moneys or investments arising or made under the powers contained in this Clause and the Income thereof shall be held upon the Trusts on which the property represented by such moneys or investments and the income thereof respectively would have been subject to if such property

9. (a) The Council may from time to time and either expressly or by implication, delegate such powers of management as it may think fit over any specified property to such Committee or Committees as the Council shall appoint in such manner and for such period as the Council shall think fit PROVIDED that the Council shall not under any circumstances be liable or responsible for the acts or omissions of such Committee or Committees.

Where a Committee is appointed by the Council for the purpose of the immediately preceding sub-paragraph, the Council may at any time in its uncontrolled discretion either wholly or partially revoke any powers delegated to such Committee or Committees, or remove all or any member of such Committee from office.

10. Where powers of management over any property are delegated to a Committee it shall:-

(a) Exercise such powers in accordance with such directions as may from time to time be given

Pay and discharge all rents, rates, taxes, and other outgoings, charges, or payments in respect thereof, maintain such property in good and substantial repair and condition to the satisfaction of the Council, and insure and keep insured any buildings thereon in an office to be approved of by the Council, against loss or damage by fire, and insure and keep insured the Council and the Committee against any liability that they may incur under the Employer's Liability Act, 1880, or the Workman's Compensation Act, 1934, in respect of any injury to any person employed by them in respect of such property, and defray the costs and expenses thereof, and the costs and expenses incurred by the Council in ascertaining that the provisions of this Clause are performed by the Committee out of the income coming to their hands of the Trust property, or out

(c) Render such accounts as may be required by the Council and produce proper vouchers for the same.

11. The Council shall have power to prescribe such regulations as it shall think necessary for the administration of the Scheme provided that such regulations shall not be inconsistent or at variance with any provisions of the Scheme, or of the Local Authorities (Acceptance of Gifts) Act, 1945.

12. Every question which has to be decided by the Council in connection with the management or administration of the scheme shall be determined by a majority of the members of the Council present at the meeting of the Council at which such matter comes up for determination.

13. The receipt of the Secretary for the time being of the Council shall be a valid discharge to any Executor, Trustee, or other person who is desirous of paying money or transferring chattel, property, stocks, shares, securities, or real or personal property to the Council for the purposes of the Scheme.

14. It shall be lawful for the Council in pursuance of a resolution passed by a majority of the members present at a meeting of the Council.,

(a) To declare additional purposes to be purposes of the Scheme; (b) To revoke or vary any of the provisions herein contained.



7407. Minutes.—Minutes of the County Council to No. 7406, having been circulated, were taken as read and were signed.

7408. Loan for Provision of Road Machinery.—Report, dated 30/1/47, from County Engineer, was submitted, indicating that the cost of machinery supplied and on order was £32,651. It was also pointed out that it was proposed to order machinery to the value of £12,349, but the proposal was being deferred, as the limitation of the Council's borrowing powers would not permit the raising of a loan for the total amount.

Councillor Keane proposed, Councillor Beegan seconded, and it was unanimously Resolved:—

"That, subject to the approval of the Minister for Local Government, the Council approves of the raising of a loan of £32,650 from the Commissioners of Public Works for the purchase of road machinery, the loan to be repayable over a period of ten years, with interest at the rate prevailing at the date of issue of each instalment."

7409. Loan for Extension of Waterworks Scheme at Loughrea.—Consulting Engineer's report, dated 12/2/47, submitted, showing total estimated cost of scheme as f13,821.

Councillor Ashe proposed, Councillor Carty seconded, and it

was unanimously Resolved:

"That, subject to the approval of the Minister for Local Government, the Council approves of the raising of a loan of £13,850 from the Commissioners of Public Works for the extension of the waterworks scheme at Loughrea, the loan to be repayable over a period of twenty-five years, with interest at the rate prevailing at the date of issue of each instalment."

7410. Loan for the Provision of Sewerage Scheme at Headford.—Report of Consulting Engineer, dated 10/2/47, submitted, showing total estimated cost of scheme as £10,450.

Councillor O'Connor proposed, Councillor Fury seconded, and

it was unanimously Resolved :-

"That, subject to the approval of the Minister for Local Government, the Council approves of the raising of a loan of £10,450 from the Commissioners of Public Works for the provision of sewerage scheme at Headford, the loan to be repayable over a priod of twenty-five years or such longer period as may be sanctioned, with interest at the rate prevailing at the date of issue of each instalment."

7411. Loan for Erection of Buildings at Woodlands Sanatorium.—Mortgage Deed for loan of £25,000 was submitted for completion.

gage to them this day, executed by this Council, but prefer to receive the same by instalments as occasion may require, IT IS RESOLVED that the requisition for each advance shall be intimated to said Commissioners by the Chairman of this Council for time being, countersigned by the Secretary, and that each requisition shall be forwarded to the Accountant of the said Commissioners, and that all such advances shall be lodged to our account in the Galway Branch of the National Bank."

7412. Extension of County Buildings.—Letter, dated 22/2/47, from County Manager, was submitted, stating that the plans prepared for extension of the County Buildings within the estimated cost of £12,000, already sanctioned by the Council, were not approved by the Department of Local Government; that the estimated cost of the scheme now prepared by the Architect is £18,000, and before instructing the Architect to proceed with the preparation of the documents the approval of the Council was requested to the expenditure of this sum.

The Council unanimously approved of an expenditure of £18,000 for the extension of the County Buildings in lieu of the sum of £12,000 previously approved.
