I have examined the Sanitary Fixtures
and Anexes in connection with the
Hospital proper, and beg to report
thereon as follows.

There are ³⁰ closets in
all, viz three on the male and female sides
of the House respectively, two of which,
situated on the ground floor are set apart
for the respective uses of the Medical Staff
and the Hospital servants, the remaining
four situate on the ward or upper floors are
for the exclusive use of Patients attending
the Hospital.

Each W. C. compartment
contains a floor area 5' 6" long x 3' 8"
wide, in other words 20 superficial feet,
which is totally inadequate to meet the
demands made upon it, as each ~~has~~
of the four Patients closets has to
serve a two fold purpose in addition to
its own, from the fact, that bed pans,
Urinal bottles and such like articles, are
daily washed and shelved therein, causing
congestion, a most objectionable practice,
which cannot be too strongly deprecated,
as the odour given off during the process
of emptying and cleaning these articles,
is anything but desirable.

the cheapest quality, and consequently

of a very inferior type, being subject to constantly recurring clogging, and as a result superfluous expense in the continual clearing of same, and in the absence of proper Stop Stoppers, the W. Co. become a receptacle for all kinds of matter.

The old lead lined flushing cisterns are in a decayed and semi rotten condition, and are being replaced by the supplemental tanks erected prior to the installation of the New Waterworks.

In my examination, I further observed the complete absence of anti Siphon Pipes, a most necessary adjunct to obviate the passage of effluvia gas thro an unsealed trap, which is liable to occur should any two vertical closets be flushed simultaneously.

The Urines are constructed of local brick built in lime mortar, and by their exposure are becoming disintegrated and decaying under the action of atmospheric influences, that on the South West or West side is parting from the main Building, so much so that sunlight is visible from the inside thro the rent or fissure caused by apparent subsidence of the foundations.

If it be desired to effect a permanent improvement, there is nothing for it but simply to abolish the present Urines, and reconstruct same on an increased area and up to date principles.

I think it opportune to bring under the notice of the Board the fact that the water supply is nightly cut off the Hospital from 3. a.m. to 6 a.m. the reason being that the pressure is diverted on to Denmore Barracks during the interval between these hours.



Dear Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of 1st inst., and am directed to inform you that the only way in which you can obtain supplies of sugar is to apply to the sources used by you in 1915.

I enclose herewith a circular showing the method of distribution for the period which commenced on the 1st January last.

The Commission cannot make any exception in this case and your proper course will be to take up the matter with those who supplied you in 1915 on the basis of the new arrangements. If anyone declines to act accordingly you should apply in writing and on their refusal should submit the correspondence to this Commission, sending at the same time figures to show how much sugar the wholesaler in question supplied to you in the whole of 1915 and how much he has supplied since January 1st 1917.

MEMORANDUM.

Wholesale Distribution of Sugar:

1st January, 1917, until further notice.

1. It has been decided to continue, until further notice, the present scheme of wholesale distribution based on the distribution of 1915, and that for this purpose the First day of January shall be considered to be the commencement of a fresh Period, no adjustment being made in this Period as the result of any irregularity in the preceding Period.

2. In all calculations the basis is the quantity supplied during the whole of 1915 and not during any particular portion of that year.

3. *British Refiners* will continue to issue sugar only to their 1915 customers. The quantities to be issued will be proportioned to those of 1915, but the proportion will vary from time to time in accordance with the general proportion which all available supplies bear to the total quantity used or distributed in 1915.

4. *The Sugar Commission* will continue to distribute its imported sugar (and such quantities of British Refined Sugar as it may have at its disposal) to its 1915 buyers according to the index number of each. This will give each buyer as his share of available supplies, the amount proportional to his total use or distribution in 1915 of all sugar other than British Refined.

5. *British West Indian Sugar*.—The sale of this and other sugar imported under licence will continue to be regulated by the West India Brokers' Committee, which will report all sales to the Sugar Commission. These will be taken into account when determining the quantities of Royal Commission Sugar which should be allotted to the buyers. There will thus be no "free" sugar in 1917.

6. All Wholesale Dealers are instructed to distribute to their customers on the same principle; that is to say, to let each of their customers of the year 1915 have his equivalent proportion of the supplies of all descriptions, and from all sources, which they have at their disposal.

7. Experience has shown during the past six months that for a Wholesale Dealer who has some thousands of customers, a distribution on the basis of a fixed percentage of each customer's purchases in 1915 would be the most satisfactory method of procedure.

It will be readily understood that it is quite impossible under present circumstances to determine in advance the exact percentage of 1915 supplies which will be available, and the Commission accordingly recommends to all Wholesale Dealers who experience a difficulty in carrying out the instructions contained in this Memorandum:—

- (a) forthwith to agree with their 1915 customers as to the quantity delivered to each in 1915, which is the quantity upon which the distribution for 1917 should be based. This basic quantity should be the total of all descriptions obtained from all sources.
- (b) to distribute during January on a fixed low basis of, say, 50 per cent.
- (c) to distribute during February on the fixed percentage of all supplies actually received during January, and so on from month to month.

This method will tend to obviate the difficulties arising from the adoption of too high a basis at the commencement, and the consequent inconvenience caused by subsequent adjustments.

8. The Commission must impress upon all those engaged in carrying out the distribution the extreme importance of adhering rigidly to the rules laid down. Haphazard distribution by the Wholesalers leads to innumerable complications and hardships for others. Any departure from these rules will render the offending Wholesaler liable to be excluded from obtaining further supplies.

9. Copies of this Memorandum may be obtained through the same sources as those through which sugar is supplied.

SPIRIT DUTY GRANT.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD,
DUBLIN, 8th June, 1917.

SIR,

I am directed by the Local Government Board for Ireland to inform you that grants from the Exchequer are now available in relief or part relief of the duty paid upon spirits used in Voluntary Hospitals solely for medical or surgical purposes. Forms on which to make application for a grant are enclosed herewith in duplicate.

The grants are not available to institutions conducted for gain, but are intended to give relief in respect of payments of duty involved by the use in Voluntary Hospitals, supported by charitable contributions, of duty paid spirit or drugs containing duty paid spirit for medical and surgical purposes. Methylated spirit or spirits obtained free of duty under Section 3 of the Finance Act, 1902, should accordingly be excluded from your return. The limiting phrase "for medical and surgical purposes" is to be regarded as excluding also brandy, whisky, and the like.

Applications for grants may now be made in respect of the use of duty paid spirits in the calendar years 1915 and 1916. For the purpose of assessing the grants the Treasury rules require that the Board shall be furnished also with the particulars shown in the form for the calendar year 1914. It will be observed that it is only in respect of the calendar year 1914 that figures are required showing the consumption of spirit. Such consumption should be allocated as between in-patients and out-patients, and the allocation should be made as accurately as possible. The Board should be informed of the method by which the allocation is made and the data on which it rests and of the definition of "new out-patient" adopted by the Hospital.

A copy of the printed Report of the Hospital for each of the calendar years, 1914, 1915 and 1916, should be enclosed with the form of application, and, when the printed reports do not show separately the receipts other than from charitable contributions, a statement of such receipts should be furnished by the Treasurer. Subsidies from State or municipal funds, payments made to the Hospital in respect of supply of nurses, by patients, or by the War Office or Admiralty, in respect of the accommodation of Soldiers or Sailors, would appear likely to be the principal items not falling within the category of charitable contributions.

It is requested that the form of application may be returned to the Secretary, Local Government Board, Dublin, not later than the 30th day of June, 1917.



WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION (War Addition) ACT, 1917,

To

A.D. 1917.

Provide for an addition during the present war and a period of six months thereafter to the amount of the compensation payable under the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1906, in cases of total incapacity.

Be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by authority of the same, as follows:—

Temporary increase of amount of compensation in cases of total incapacity. 6 Edw. 7, c. 58.

1.—(1) Where any workman is at any time during the period for which this Act continues in force entitled during total incapacity to a weekly payment by way of compensation under the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1906, he shall, whether the incapacity arose before or after the commencement of this Act, be entitled to receive from the person liable to pay the compensation, by way of addition to each such weekly payment payable in respect of any week within the said period, a sum equal to one-fourth of the amount of that payment.

(2) The additional weekly sum payable under this Act shall be deemed to be part of the weekly payment under the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1906, for the purposes of—

- (a) The provisions relating to the recovery of weekly payments;
- (b) Any order made with respect to payment into court of a weekly payment;
- (c) The provisions of paragraph (19) of the First Schedule to the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1906 (which prohibits the assignment, &c., of weekly payments);

and shall, notwithstanding that the liability to make the said weekly payment is redeemed subsequent to the commencement of the Act, continue to be payable in the same manner as if that liability had not been redeemed.

Provision with respect to certified schemes.

2. Where an employer is liable to pay benefits under a scheme certified by the Registrar of Friendly Societies under section three of the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1906, the Registrar may direct that workmen who are at any time during the period for which this Act continues in force entitled to benefits under the scheme as on account of total incapacity shall receive such additional benefit as is specified by the Registrar in the direction as being in his opinion of equivalent value to the additional sum payable under the foregoing provisions of this Act.

Commencement and short title.

3.—(1) This Act shall come into operation on the first day of September nineteen hundred and seventeen, and shall continue in force during the continuance of the present war and for a period of six months thereafter.

(2) This Act may be cited as the Workmen's Compensation (War Addition) Act, 1917.

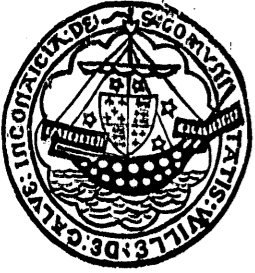

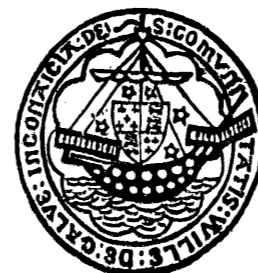
