The medical Staff having, in compliance with the request of the Board of management, as conveyed to them by the click, considered har Lydon's horice of Motion, beg to report that they object to the proposed resolution. In their opinion it would not all to the efficiency of the Hospital.

The existing medical staff is more than ample; without counting the House Surgeon it is larger in proportion to the number of beds available than in other Nospetals and Infirmaties, and would be capable of discharging efficiently the duties of a Hospital with double the accommodation.

The Hospital is not unpopular in Salway, and any objection to it from any remote past of the county would not the removed by further balway appointments.


