

the cost of their own muntenance in the Hospital. The result of the treatment of patients shown in the freturn, the medical Staff regard as satisfactory, the mortality in the Surgical and Synecological hards will bear favourable comparison with that of other Hospitals in similar circumstances, seeing that most of the Great operations in Surgery and Equicology were undertaken. These facts the medical Staff submit to the Board of Management as evidence that the Horpital has, in great measure, fulfilled the purpose for which it was founded.

The conversion of an old building into a modern Hospital is necessarily expensive, and the legal difficulty which is said to prevent the Board of floorks from making Building Lvans, to be upaid fin a term of years, has imposed on the Boards of Management the hardship of executing permanent works out of the year, income. In these circumstances the medical staff desire to express their secognition of the readiness which the Board has shown to Cerry out, with the limited means at their command, any suggestion for improvement made by the Staff.

the objects of the Hospital come so clearly within the Policy which allows loans for pathie purposes, that an amending clause in the Hospital act might reasonably be applied for. The hursing continues to be satisfactory, and the training scheme is proving of public service in supplying temporary muses edrought the Gunty. The training scheme would be made more effective if brobationers were selected by the recommendation of the medical Staff, on whose Ifinal certificate the public hatually rely. The medical Staff invite the consideration of the Board to the increased charge lately made for laying laterts. He usefulness of the Hospital would seem to be diminished by that increase, and it is a question whether The Hospital act Policy is consistent with a actual cost to the Horpital.




