That owing to the sad death by drowning of four fishermen while endeavouring recently to bring a boat-load of herring into the Ballydagh, we respectfully urge upon the Government the necessity of having a Pier erected at Salt Hill for the purpose of enabling fishermen to unload their cargoes of fish, and which we consider would be a safeguard in the future to both trading and fishing boats in stormy weather, and would be the means of preventing a recurrence of the sad accident which recently happened.

That the present is a very opportune time

for making such a Pier as a great want of employment for labourers and artisans in Galway exists, and it would be the means of enabling them to tide over what we fear will be a very severe and trying winter and spring owing to the almost complete failure of the potato crop, and the scarcity of turf on account of the wet summer.

That copies of this resolution be forwarded to the Chief Secretary, the Board of Works, and the Congested Districts Board.
