We consider that as taxpayers, ratepayers, and employers, the inhabitants of this country are entitled to Governmental custom. We also declare that it is unfair that an Imperial system of accounts should debit Ireland with an expenditure which does not pass through the hands of Irishmen, but is exported to countries competing with Irish products, whereby the taxes paid by the Irish people are utilized to encourage foreign competition. That copies of this resolution be forwarded to the Lord Lieutenant, his Chief Secretary, the Secretary for War, and the various Irish public bodies."
