The Board would not object, however, to the quardians allowing the ablebodied adult sons of widows whose names are on the lists to be employed instead of their mothers.

Whenever a substitute is employed for any of the reasons above stated the fact should be noted in the observation column of the Bay sheets as well as the age of the person substituted, and the Board will only pay three fourths of the wages of persons other than those named on the lists where a satisfactory reason is given by the Guardians for placing them on the works.
