Read Letter from L. G. B. No 127/a dated 16th Sept. stating that

they have had for some time under consideration the exceptionally high death rate in this country from Pulmonary Tuberculosis (Consumption), but before issuing any instructions to local authorities as to the best means of preventing this disease it was deemed advisable to await the result of the discussion at the International Congress on Tuberculosis recently held in London. The Board have now before them the recommendations of the Congress, and they desire to place before local authorities, for the information of the public, the practical advice given in the annexed posters and leaflets, suggesting that these posters and leaflets be printed and circulated.

Order this suggestion to be carried out.

20th Sept. 01. From Dr H. A. Lyden, Medical Officer of the Galway No 2 Disp. Dist., enclosing a certificate from Dr W. W. Breton that he (Dr Lyden) is suffering from Bronchitis and Haemoptysis and will not be fit for duty for fourteen days.
