25th March } Approving of the appointment of Ellen Hamiffy as Wardmaid in the Workhouse Fever Hospital at a salary of £6 a year with rations.

16.166/1902 }
25th March } Referring to Minutes of the 19th inst. the Board desire to state that they consider that it is incumbent on the Guardians to institute legal proceedings against the three milk contractors

tractors named in the Minutes, as it appears that the principal food of many of the sick poor and of all the infants in the Workhouse has been adulterated.

Order A copy of this letter and of the Analyst's report to be furnished to each of the three milk contractors in default, with a severe caution, the Guardians consider that this will have the desired effect.

24th March, 52. From the Clerk of Union, Ballinacloe, forwarding a copy of a resolution adopted by the Board of Guardians of that Union as follows: -
Resolved - That we heartily congratulate our fellow County Guardian, Mr. Thomas Grainger, Chairman Mountbellew Union, and Mr. Lynam, a thorough Nationalist, on their escape from the jaws of a third trial at Ballygar Sessions, where it was evidently arranged to convict, and send them to gaol.

That this Board tender to the Editor of the "Western News," "Longrea Guardian," and "Galway Leader," its best thanks for their able and courageous exposure of the arrangement by frequent adjournments to secure the conviction of these men, as to exposure alone is due the abandonment of an unjust and tyrannical prosecution.

Read Letter from L. G. B. No 14469/1902 dated 19th March. stating that

They they consider that the condition of the watercloset at the rear of Craunmore Dispensary, as mentioned in the last Quarterly Report of the Medical Officer of the District, demands the attention of the Guardians. Extract from Medical Officer's Return Form L. "The watercloset at rear of Dispensary is in a most insanitary state owing to faulty construction and should be remedied at once or done away with."

Order - Mr. P. McDonald, plumber, be directed to examine this watercloset and report to the Guardians at next meeting.

14850/1902, 20th March. Referring to entry on the Minutes of the 12th inst. of a copy of the Medicine Analyst's Report on the samples of drugs submitted to him for analysis from the Craunmore Dispensary District, and requesting that a copy of the Report may be forwarded to the Contractors for any explanation they may have to offer thereon relative to the *liuimentum belladonnae*, methylatum unfaourably reported on by the Analyst.

The quantity of this drug in stock at the Dispensary should be returned to the Contractors, and a fresh supply of standard quality obtained in lieu thereof.

The Board also request that the Medical Officer of the District may be called upon to explain why samples of drugs delivered at the Dispensary

dispensary on the 18th December last, were not forwarded to the Analyst till the 1st inst. The Analyst signed his report on the 8th inst., thus nearly 3 months elapsed between the delivery of the drugs and the Analyst's report.

The clerk informed the Guardians that on receipt of this letter he complied with the directions contained therein. The explanations called for have not, up to the present, been furnished.

Resolved - That the consideration of applications for the appointment of Midwife for the Galway 1 & 2 Dispensary Districts, be adjourned to next meeting, when a notice of motion to rescind the order for the advertisement for a Midwife will be considered.





