20th April, 91. From Lavee, stating that they cannot comply with the allowance the Guardians wish to take off of $\frac{7}{14}$ waste and rotten potatoes: that they must insist on being paid in full.

²⁷ April, 91. From the Accountant, Office of Public Works, Dublin, transmitting a draft for £ 582.8.0 being the balance of loan recommended by the Local Government Board to be made to the Guardians for the purpose of supplying seed potatoes. Enclosing receipt form.

The form of receipt was duly signed and sealed and transmitted to the Accountant, Office of Public Works.

²³ April, 91. From the Solicitor, acknowledging receipt of instructions to proceed for recovery of Rates in the cases—Guardians & Gleeson. Same Vizins of Presentation Convent.

²⁵ April, 91. From Messrs. A. Gross & Sons of Glasgow, acknowledging receipt of Clerk's letter of 23rd instant in which they were informed that the Guardians cannot remit more money till the balance of seed loan be obtained, stating that the account must bear interest from the due date until it is paid. That they cannot see what right the Guardians have to deduct 2. 14^{t. c.} of potatoes from account when remitting balance. Such a proceeding must be agreed upon with the sellers before it is done. That they will insist on this account being paid in full.

Order. The balance of their account less interest and the cost of 2. 14^{t. c.} of rotten potatoes to be remitted to them.

No 17755/91. Referring to remittance of the Guardians of the 15th instant 23rd April, on the subject, and enquiring at what price the Guardians have bought for the use of the inmates of the Workhouse the surplus seed potatoes purchased for distribution in the Union, and whether the Electoral Divisions for which the seed originally was obtained have been credited with the price now paid by the Guardians for it.

The Clerk informed the Guardians that he replies as follows that the Guardians are selling to the public generally the surplus seed potatoes at the rate of 4/- per cwt. and that the same charge is made for the quantity consumed by the inmates. The Electoral Divisions for which the seed originally was obtained will be credited with the price paid by the Guardians and the public for it.
