

The Gulardians bely to betate in reply that a definite Charge has been made against Mi the Difrey the Superintendent and Legistrar of the Galway Cemetery, that the remains of Mary Francis were brought to the bemetery for interment at about 5.30 pour, on the April last, and that he failed to have the interment carried out tell the 2nd May At Arey in an explanation furnished to the Board at theeting on the 20th, altimo etaled that he sent a note to Ma Edward I Athy, the Master of the Worthprise asking how to send some of the pauper immates as usual to bury the remains of this pauper, and that he received a verbal reply that it was not his Me Athypolity to attend to this business but that of the Relieving officer. Hat he Me Darray then called upon Mr. Janes Coleman the Relieving office, for galway District with the view to get him, to Send men to carry out the interment, and Miboleman informed him that he had paid onen to do the work, and that he would

See about it, that ultimately two onen came from the Workhouse and the remains were removed from the Mortheary chapel and interest. 
