"That as the Christian Brothers have rendered immense services to the country by educating the great bulk of the children of the working classes in many cities and towns in Ireland, we regard their exclusion from a share in the moneys voted by Parliament for the Education of the poor in Ireland, as an injustice not only to them but to the parents of those children; and we call upon the Government to redress this grievance as soon as possible."
- 3. "That copies of those Resolutions be sent to the Prime Minister, the Chief Secretary, Mr. Gladstone, and to our City and County Members, and to the several Boards of Guardians in Ireland; and that the attention of our Representatives in Parliament be called to these grievances with a view to their speedy removal."
