The Secretary to the Galway Jown Commissioners furnished a copy of a resolution passed by that Board as follows.

Resolved—"That we invite the co-operation of the public bodies throughout Ireland in pressing upon the Legislature the grievances under which leaseholders in towns suffer, by being compelled, at the expiration of their leases, to pay an increased rent on their own improvements, with the alternative of eviction. This, we believe, is a state of the law which should not be allowed to exist, and we urge on our Parliamentary Representatives the necessity of keeping the matter to the front, until some protective measure is passed in the interest of the long-suffering town tenants.

"We would also urge on our representatives the hardship of allowing landlords to injure the trade of towns by refusing either to build on, or let at a reasonable rent for building purposes, old ruins and waste spaces, which undoubtedly injure the trade of those places where they unfortunately exist. We believe there should be a short Act passed compelling such landlords to do their duty, and giving them the alternative of selling, or of building, or letting at a fair rent, these vacant spaces."

The asoption of this resolution was proposed by the A.G. Scott seconded by Mi, I. b. Macksonnell, and carried unaumonely.
