

Report of Rate Committee and Visiting Committee We the newbers of the Pate Committee attended at the Board Doom on the 18th instant to examine the Arrears Lists in Collector Baileys district, Having gone carefully through the lists we are of opinion that the names of many persons appear on those lists who would have faced their rates are this if the bollector had used more deligence in soliciting payment from them, in the lists appear the names of some landlords who have underrated tenants and those tenants shall lose their granchise if the rates are not paid on or before the 1st processe.
