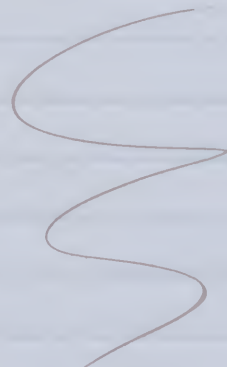

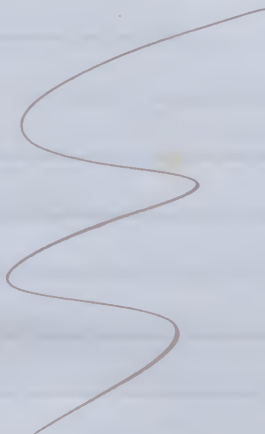

4. Out-door Relief Invoice Account.

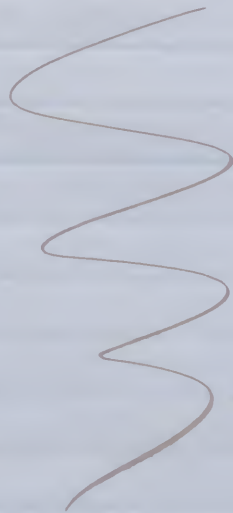

The Committee also recommended that the requisition for new materials for the Hospital, placed before the Board on the 4th instant, be granted - vizt - 220 yards of Linsey, 250 yds of sheeting, 100 yds Flannel 100 yards of check, 120 yds of lining calico, 100 yds Ticken & 150 yds sheeting Calico.

Many of the articles presented to the Committee for cancelling were mere shreds and patches pieces, and could by no means be looked upon as representing whole articles. It was stated in explanation that portions had been used as mopping cloths and dusters, and that this became necessary in consequence of the neglect of the visiting Committee to attend to condemn old things for those purposes. A recurrence of these practices should be guarded against.

The new materials now ordered should be made up without delay, and then any unserviceable articles of clothing or Bedding removed from the Hospital - It should be intimated to the Officers in charge that they are not to break up or destroy

articles of clothing or Bedding without being first examined, and that it is expected that however worn out they may be, the articles will henceforth be presented so that they may be recognised as whole articles.

The Visiting Committee should give better attention to their duties and not leave a similar excuse of necessity to the officers of the House.
