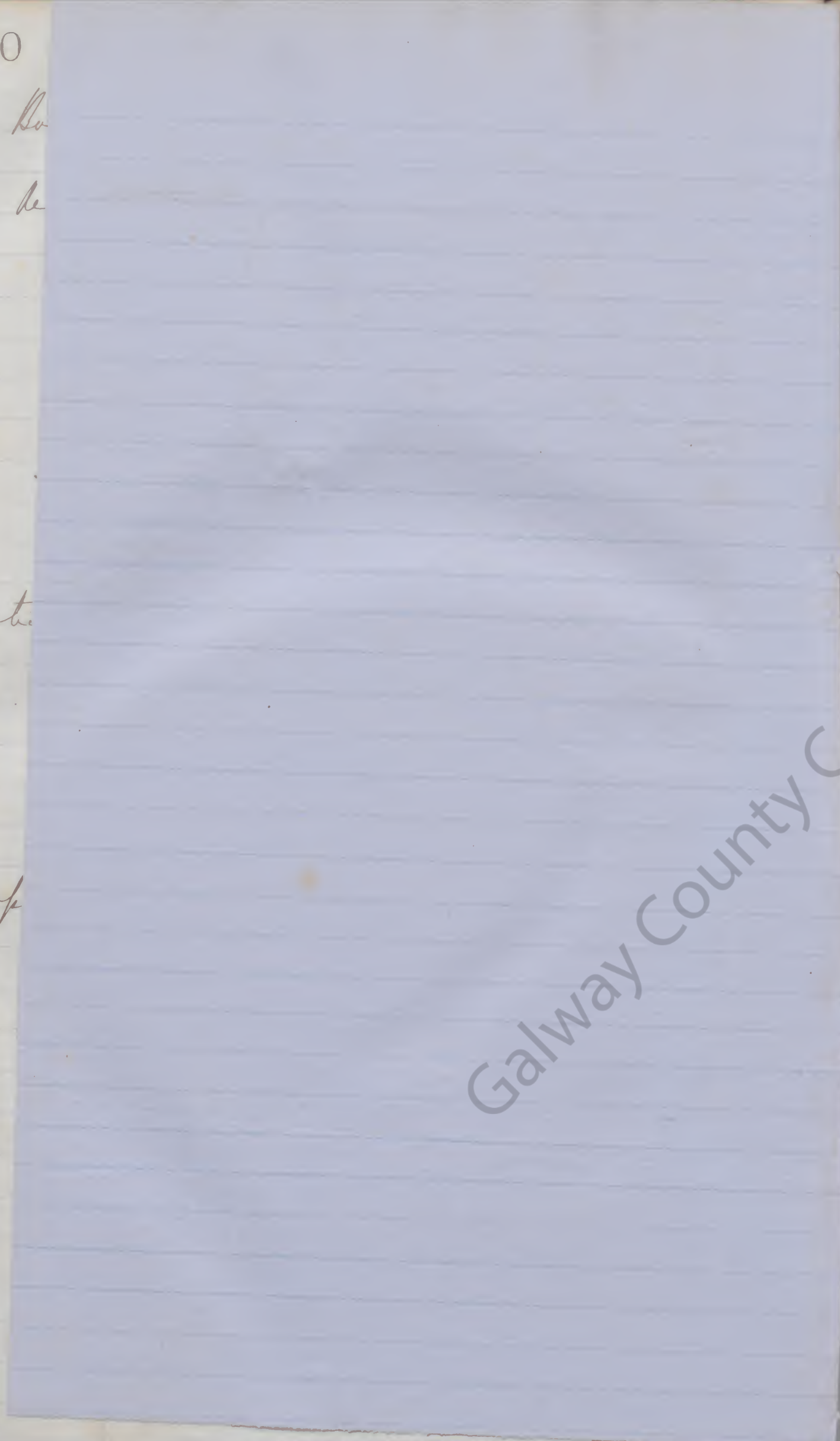

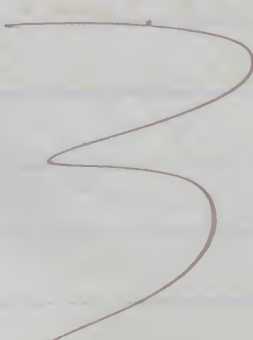

when the Committee, five months ago, met the  
Clergymen of all denominations, in consultation

to the arena of local press letter writing,  
and committed himself to language, that  
it was as unworthy of his Christian calling  
and Position to make use of, as it would be  
of my Position to reply to; and lastly  
Regret, & deep Regret, that the Most Revd  
The Lord Bishop of Galway, has deemed it  
right to allow five months to elapse, bringing  
us to a time, when overcrowded intra-mural  
graveyards are being peremptorily closed

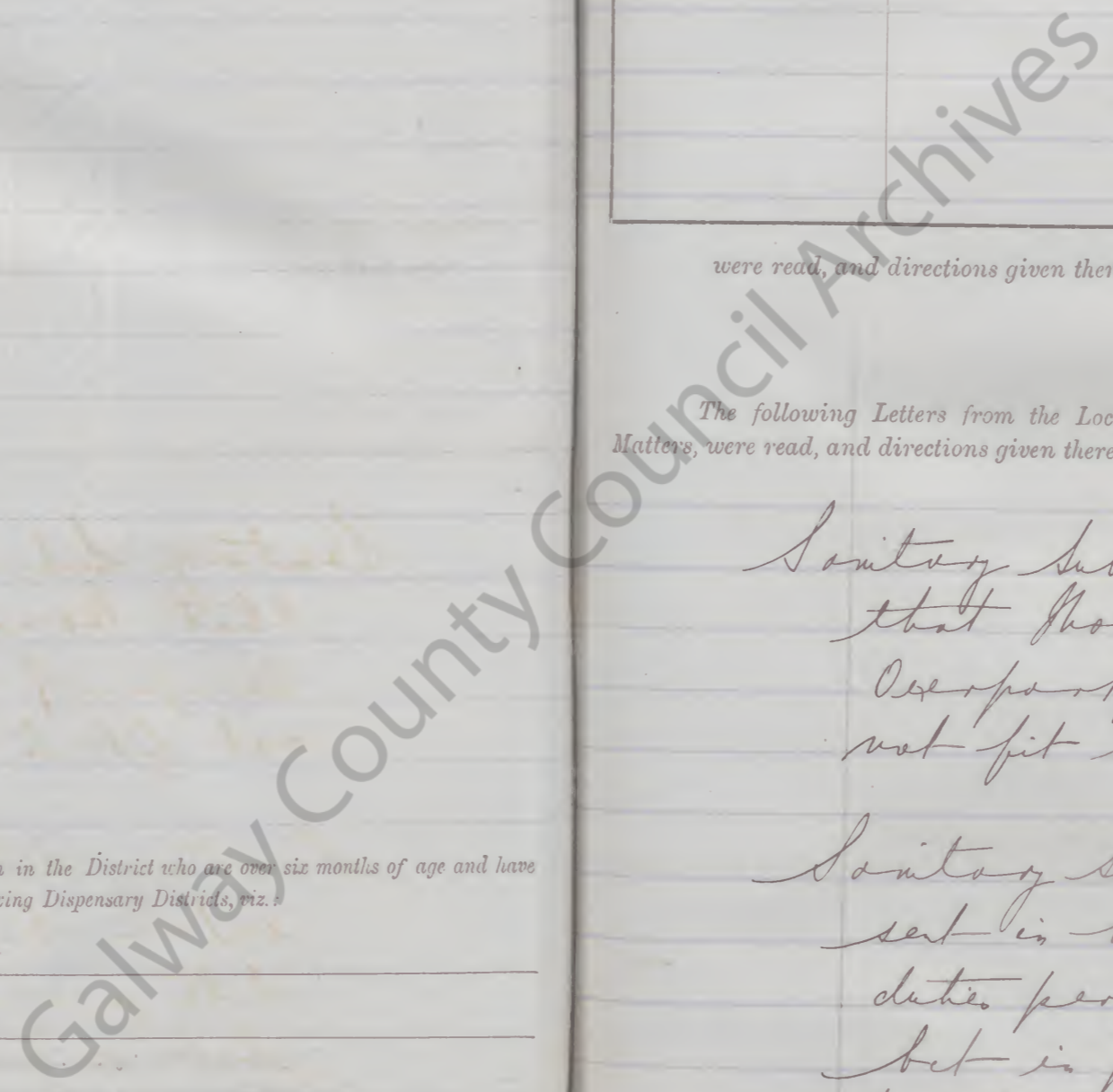

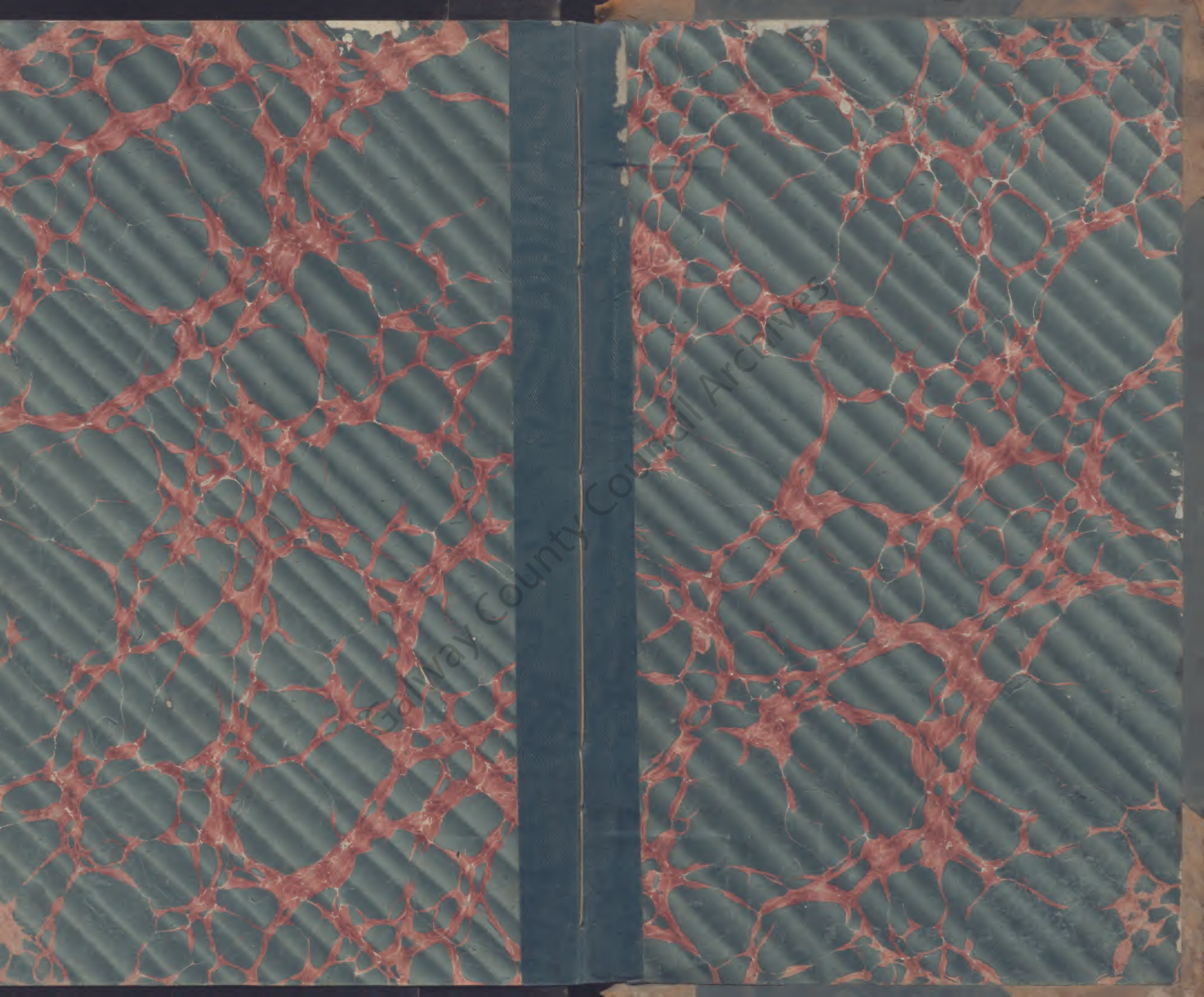
