BURIAL BOARD PROCEEDINGS.

Minutes of Proceedings at Meeting of the Committee appointed by the Board at Meeting on the 23rd instant to inspect and report on the condition of the Abbey Cemetery, Galway, held on the 29th instant.

Mr. Hedington Esq. in the chair.

Other members present - Mess^{rs} J. Davis, J. D. Burke, M. Gill, D. Toarty, & L. Edinard.

After an inspection of the Cemetery, the following resolution was adopted.

"Resolved That we recommend the Burial Board to have the weeds and vegetable matter in the cemetery removed at once; that labourers be employed for the purpose without delay; and that the meeting of the Committee stand adjourned to 12 o'clock on 6th proximo in order to decide what further is to be done so as to put the Cemetery into a proper condition."

The adoption of the report was proposed by M. Gill, seconded by M^r Edinard and carried unanimously.

Ordered - Sanitary Sub-officer Stack to be called upon to employ persons at once to remove the weeds &c. from the cemetery.

Sanitary Officers Report.

"Sir, I have to inform you that I have this day in accordance with your notice, minutely examined the Abbey Cemetery.

It is in a most wild neglected and uncared for state, full of weeds of all sorts, docks, nettles, thistles, &c. A considerable portion of the enclosing wall is entirely broken down, and otherwise on a neglected state. Notwithstanding all this I cannot say that there is in the cemetery anything absolutely unsanitary, and must report accordingly.

It is a disgrace to have in the centre of the city, a cemetery so neglected, when a very moderate outlay would put it in the same creditable state as that of St. Nicholas, an outlay I strongly recommend."

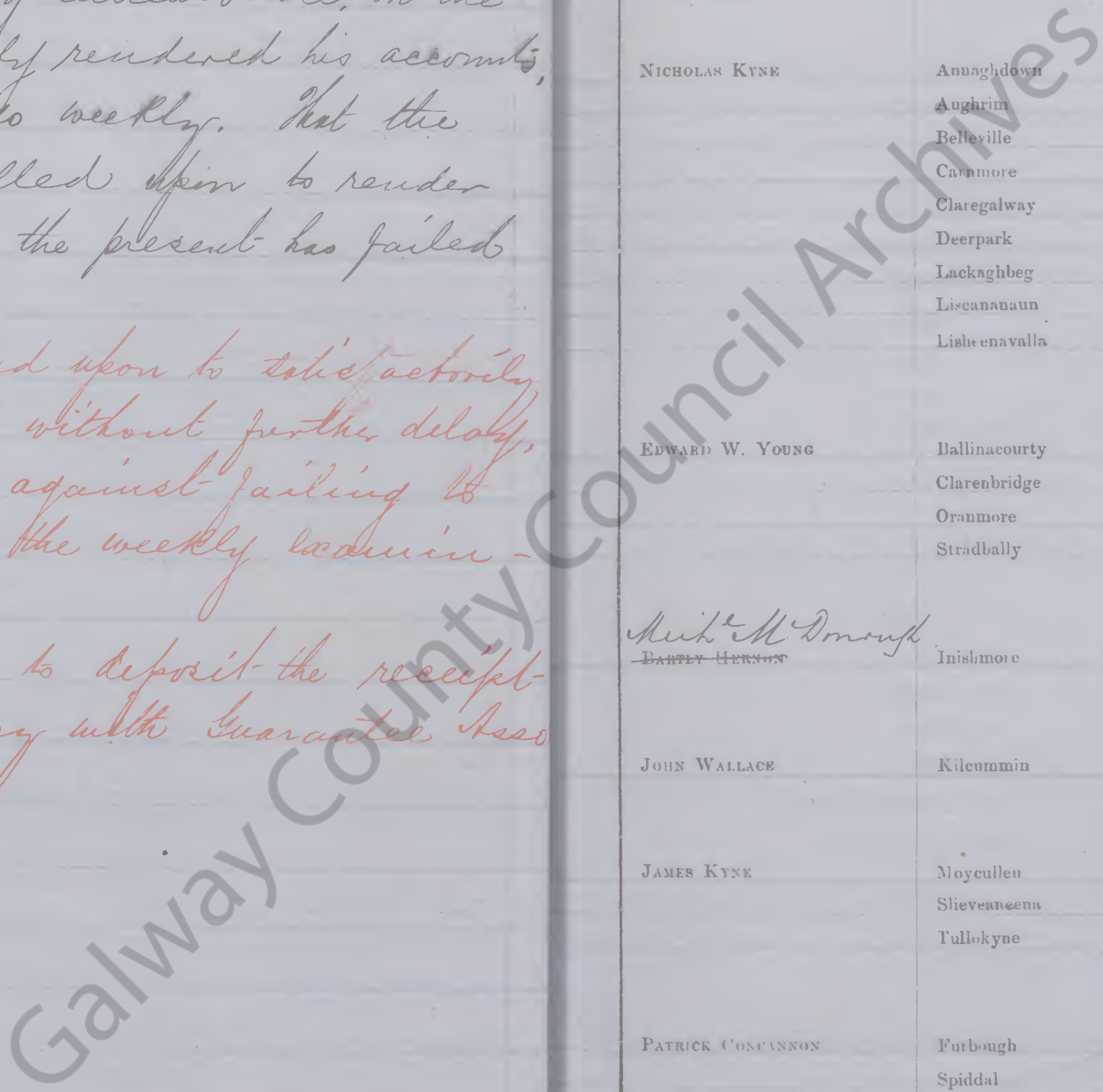

Clerk's Report.

With reference to complaint made by Malachy Haughan, being Pensioner of being overcharged for maintenance in Workhouse. I find he has not been overcharged. The investigation of his case disclosed the following facts.

He was first admitted to Workhouse on the 26th Jan'y. 1880, and discharged 1st April 1880, number of days 66. He was readmitted 5th April 1880, and continued an inmate till 10th April 1882. Since that date he has been in and out of Workhouse several times.

The practice heretofore has been that the Relieving Officer at end of each Quarter received from the District Paymaster of Pensioners, the amount of claims for maintenance of Pensioners in Workhouse. Relieving Officer Stack it appears in this way received the amount of cost of maintenance of Malachy Haughan from 26th Jan'y. 1880, to 1st Jan'y. 1882, being a total number of days 701 and 6th p'day £ 17. 10. 8 Out of this amount he has lodged only 2. 5. 6 leaving amount unaccounted for £ 15. 5. 0

This man Haughan was admitted before my appointment. All charges for maintenance of Army and Govt Pensioners since 1st Jan'y. 1882, have been paid directly to me by the Paymaster of Pensioners, and amounts have been regularly lodged to the credit of the Union, with Treasurer.

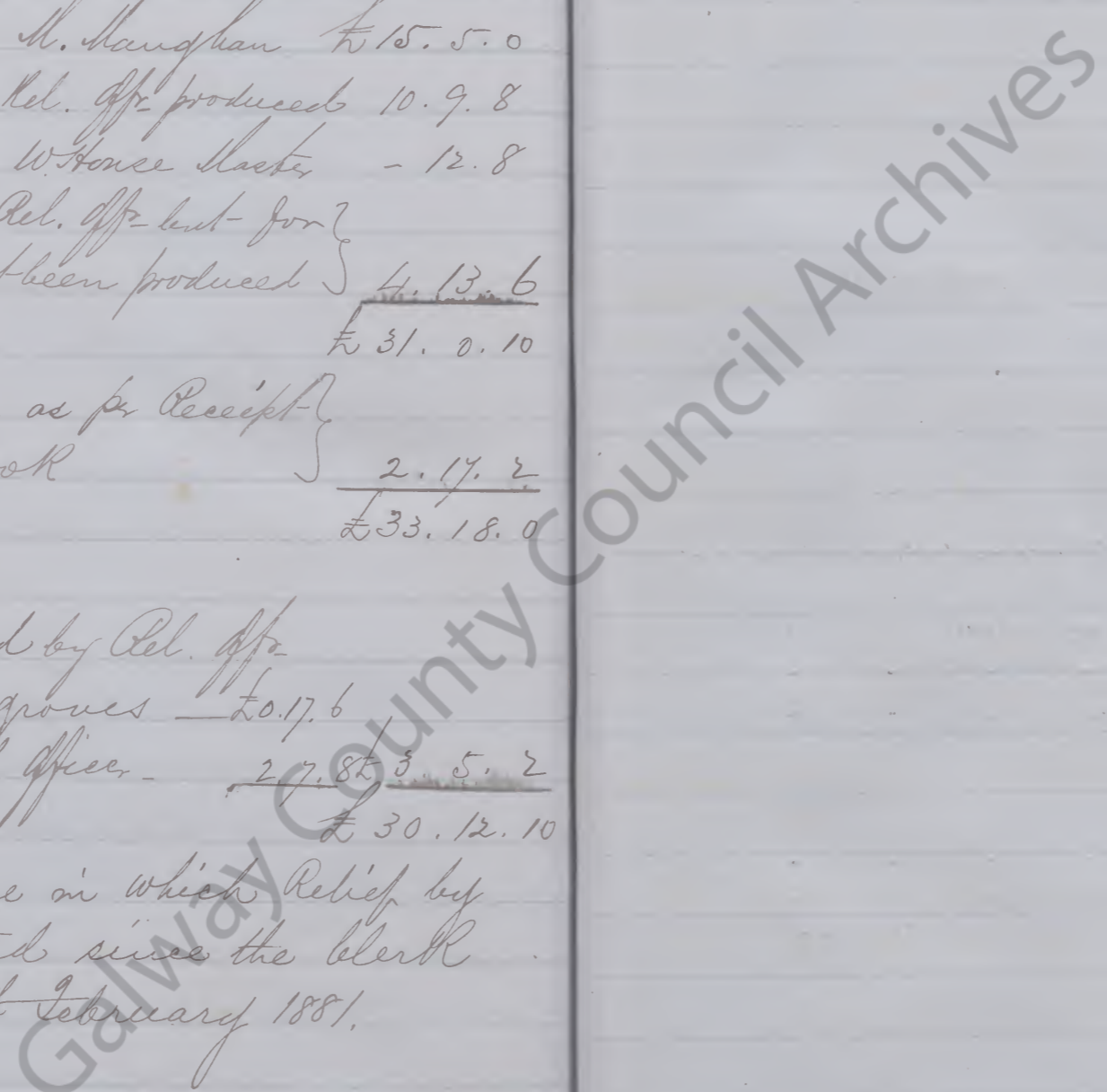

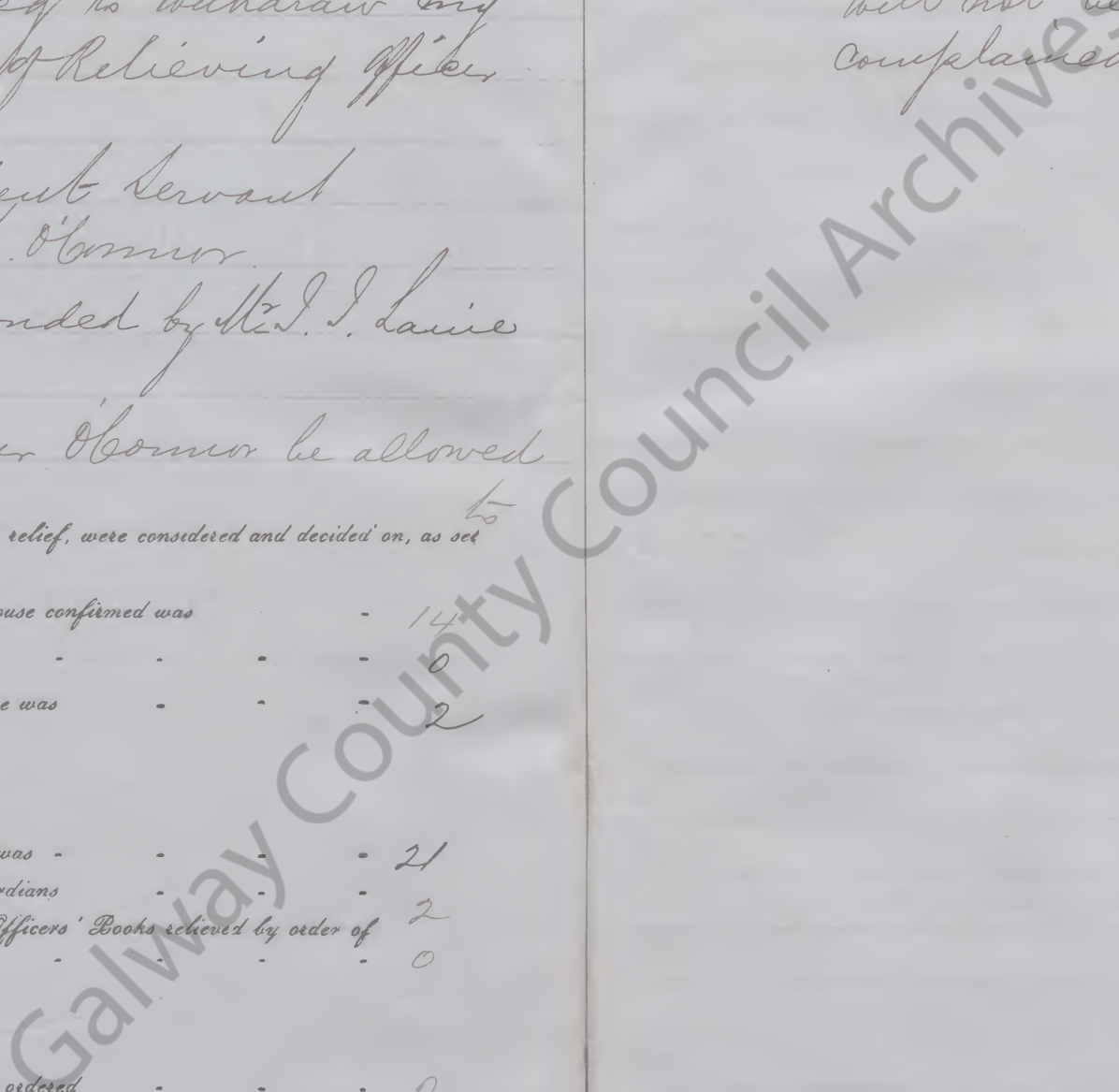

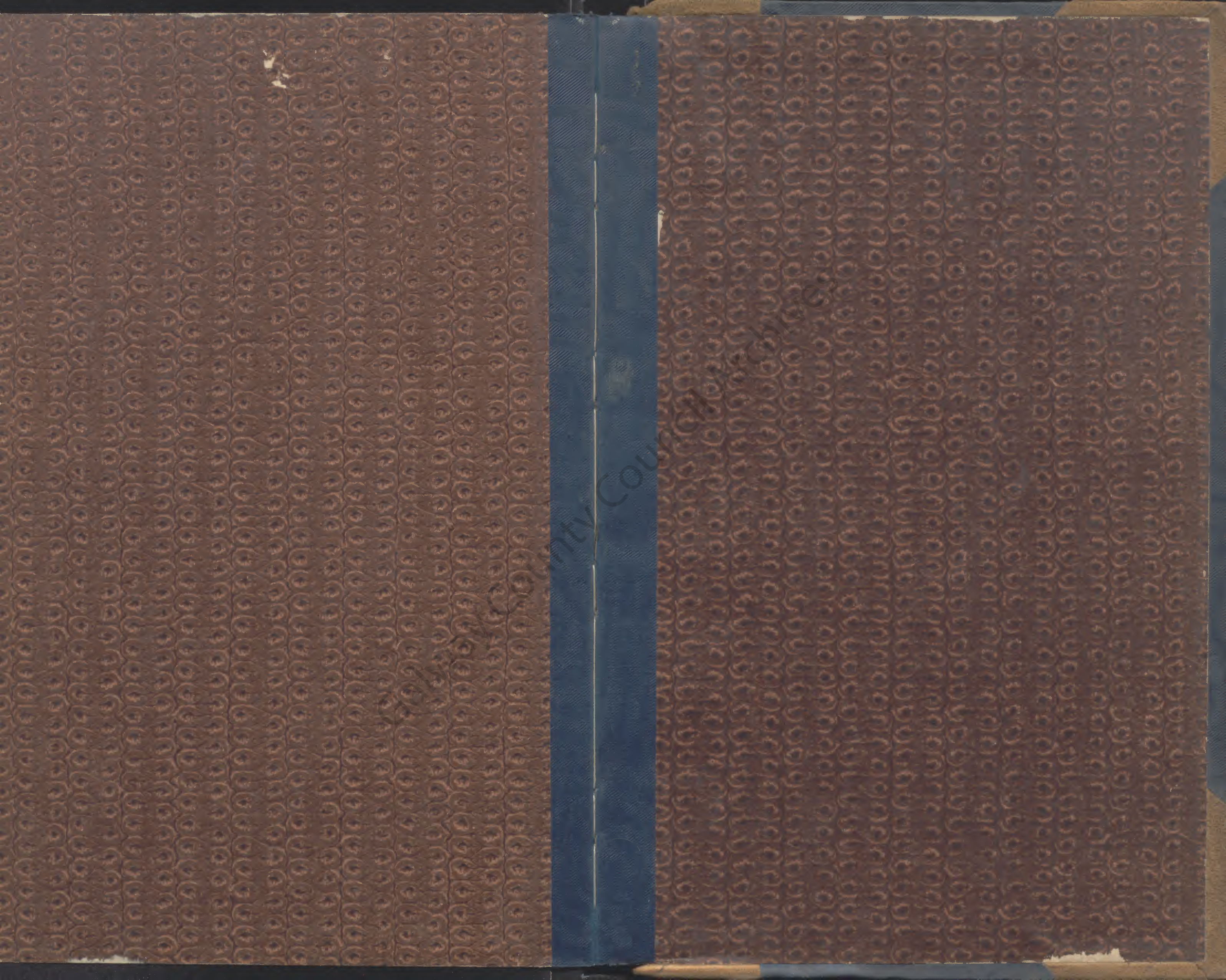
