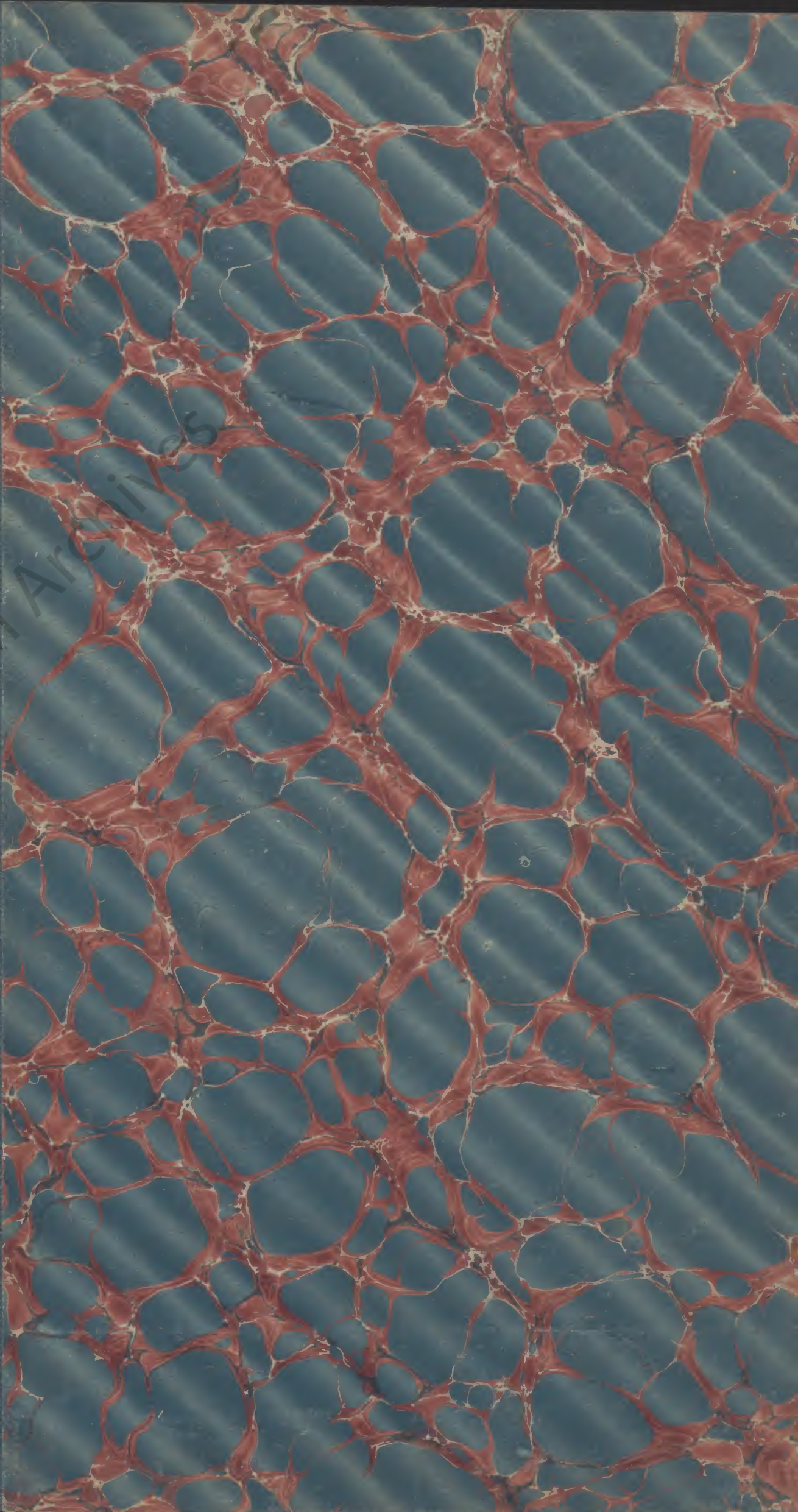
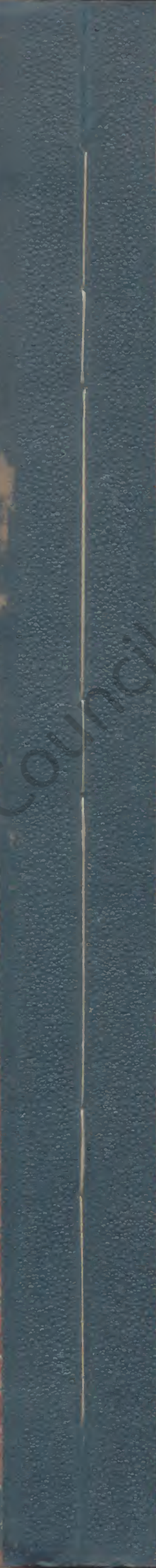
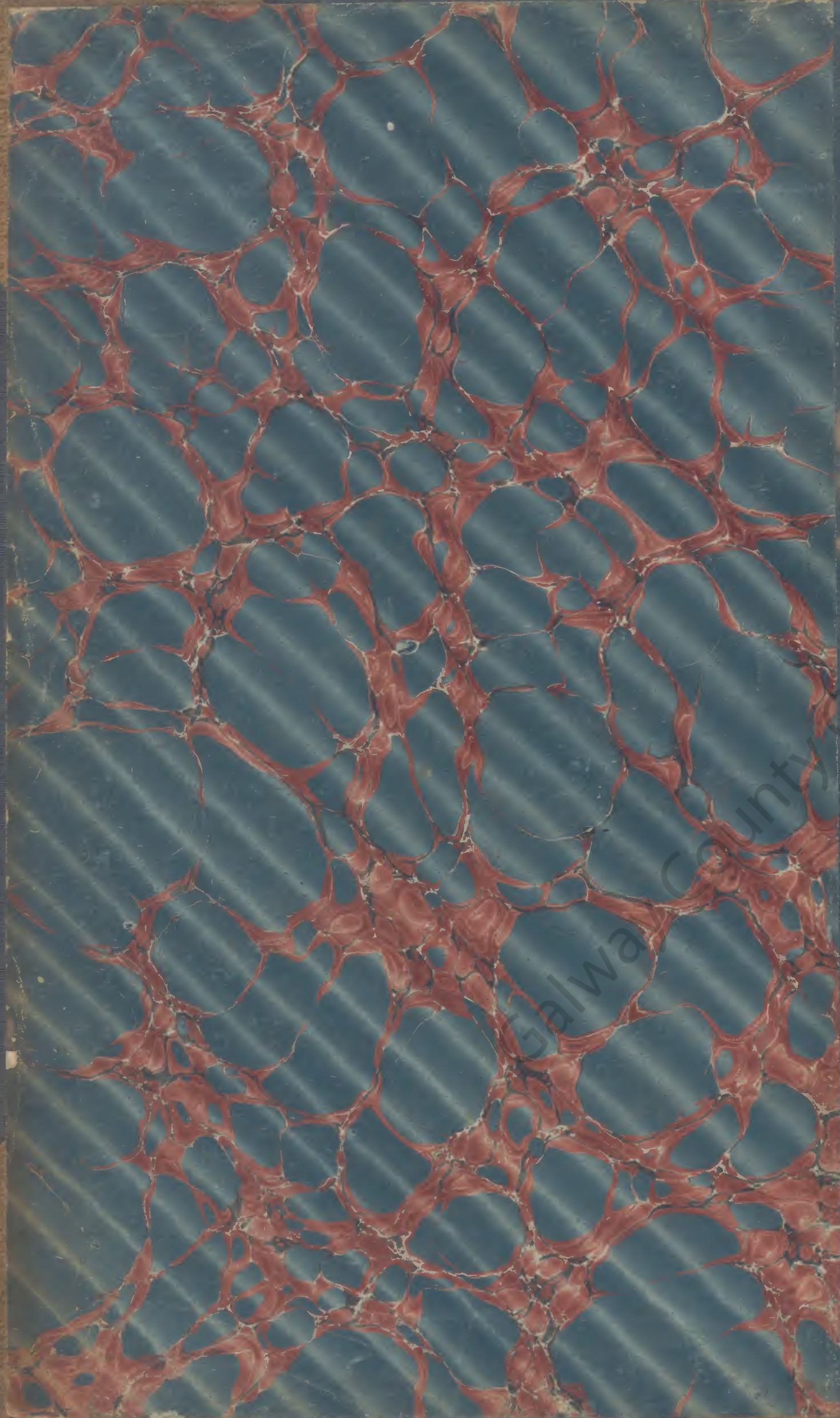

The Committee has to complain that Medicines ordered on the 20<sup>th</sup> March last, has not arrived for the use of the Dispensary up to this date

Dr. Kirwan, Medical Officer of the District handed in the following letter, calling the attention of the Committee to the difficulty of his getting a convenient and suitable residence in the district. To consider this letter the Committee arranged to have a special meeting called for the purpose of deciding what can be done to have a residence built for the Medical Officer. The special meeting to be held on the 24<sup>th</sup> Inst. Dr. Kirwan's letter,

M<sup>r</sup>. Chairman & Gentlemen.

Since I became your Medical Officer, I have used every exertion to obtain in a central position, a residence, but up to this have been compelled to live in lodgings to an amount of discomfort to myself, and patients, I am now forced to take a residence in a still more uncentral position which will not alone entail an amount of extra work, on me but to the people of more than half my district will be of most serious inconvenience. It is unnecessary for me to dilate on the advantages to patients, derived from a dispensary residence, suffice it to say that in the first place it arms the Medical Officer with an amount of dispatch in every case which otherwise cannot be attained, and on days other than dispensary days remedies are within reach for urgent cases, or for the renewal of treatment. Secondly, the drugs are better cared for having the daily supervision of the Medical Officer. Thirdly that the erection of the building is of no burden to the rate payers but that eventually it becomes a source of revenue.

It is agreed by all that in or about Oranmore is the most central position, and as there are many sites to be had, I would advise you not to close this meeting without taking the necessary steps, for erecting during the summer this most necessary building and would suggest that the Committee should view one or two of those sites.

A Special Meeting of the Oranmore Dispensary Committee, was held this day, in the Chair

Mr. P. Dooly, Vice Chairman, other Members present Messrs. Francis Blake, John & Kevin Redmond Mullin Peter Burke, M. J. Cullinan Matthias Linn and John Brady.

The Meeting was called to consider the Medical Officers application to have a residence built. The following resolution, relative to it, was moved by Mr. Mullin and seconded by Mr. Linn, and unanimously agreed to. That the Board of Guardians be requested, to have an advertisement inserted in some local newspapers, for Plans and specifications, of a residence with dispensary attached for the Medical Officer in Oranmore.

The Plans and specifications, to be submitted to the Local Government Board, for selection and approval. The plan approved of to be paid for by a sum of three ~~pounds~~ guineas, The cost of the building not to exceed ~~the~~ <sup>five</sup> hundred ~~pounds~~ <sup>est</sup> pounds.
