We have considered the costs of proceedings in the
inferior Courts, and the Clerk having certified
upon scrutiny as to the business done we
recommend that for the present a sum
of £ 17: 19: 3 be deducted from the account
until 54 decrees for which it is charged,
are accounted for, and that a deduction
of Ten per Cent from the balance be taken as
in the case of the superior Courts Bill of Costs
in lieu of taxation, and it appearing that
payment, if the rates after decrees obtained were
accepted from many parties we recommend
that in such cases the Costs be charged to the
Collectors or to such party as accepted the rates
without the Costs, and that in any cases where
there are decrees against solvent parties on
which Costs are due that the Costs be proceeded
for and placed to credit of the Union.

The Visiting Committee reported that the Workhouse is in good order, that Andrew Pichamy chargeable to Galway No 341 to be supplied with a suit of clothes the expense not to exceed 7/6 as his mother is taking him to America. The Committee have directed the Shed at the rear of the Hospital to be taken down, the passage in the Male Infirmary Ward and the Small Room at end of Guls School Room to be boarded with a portion of the Timber, & nuisance Boxes to be also

The Board having taken the Commissioners Letter of the 10th Ultimo regarding the Salaries of certain Officers into consideration, the following letter was read from Dr. Browne on the subject of His Salary.

Galway 18 April 1856.

Gentlemen

As a letter from the Poor Law Commissioners is to be considered on this day regarding the Officers Salaries. Take the liberty of laying before you some few facts in connexion with my case. The numbers which were in the house in April 1847 when my Salary was fixed at £100 (its present amount) were 798 and the numbers then in the Infirmary were 81. From 1848 up to 1850 the numbers of Paupers ranged from 2000 to 5300, and the number in the Hospital from 120 to 600, during these years the Guardians had five Clergymen, viz. Dangan, Moycullin, West House, Maderia Island, and Merchants Road, every one of which I had to attend to, as well as the Principal House, and Infirmary, and with such a number of such it is unnecessary to say, that it was essential for me to devote a very large portion of time so as to be able to perform the duties to my own satisfaction and the satisfaction of the Guardians. West House, Maderia Island and Moycullin Clergymen were more Hospitals than Clergymen, and I was bound to go to Moycullin daily. During those trying years, and with such an amount of duty to perform, I might, and could have obtained an increase of Salary, but I distinctly told the Guardians that I would not ask it, that I was done from my great exertions then, and arduous labours, that when the times would improve, and the duties lessen, that in consideration of these labours, my Salary would not be disturbed, and I have not up to the present time been disappointed in my anticipations, inasmuch as on the several occasions since 1850 when the question of the Salaries was under ~~consideration~~ discussion, the Board sensible of the justice of my case, and of the matter understanding

or arrangement made with me, that my Salary should be left at £100 - did not reduce it and, it is important for you to know that the question of the Salaries has been the subject of discussion Annually since, and twice or more often. The Medical Officers of the Workhouses received increased Salaries during the Famine years and therefore there is no analogy between my case and theirs, and had I got an increase during these years (which I might have obtained but for my desire to be left at one fixed Salary). I could not now claim exemption from reductions, I now consider myself entitled, by the compact made with me as well as by all the principles of justice to be left at my present Salary, but independent entirely of the arrangement or understanding referred to, I hope the Board will think me entitled to their consideration on two grounds.

1st From my long Services, 2dly from the present Salary not being excessive considering the duties to be performed and 3dly from desire at all times to meet their views by economising as much as possible in the Hospital department, consistent with due care

I have looked upon myself as being always treated by this Board and therefore felt myself bound the more to consult your interests and the interests of the Rate payers as far as possible, and as long as I may continue to be your Medical Officer, I shall consider myself bound to take the same care of your interests, which I have hitherto done, Trusting that you as Gentlemen and men of Honour will consider yourselves equally bound to comply with the arrangement made with me and which I feel certain you will do.

Sealed Order from the Poor Law Commissioners dated 15 May 1856 No 13281 fixing the Salary of the Roman Catholic Chaplain at £70 a year.

The following Letters from the Poor Law Commissioners and others were read by the Clerk, and directions given to answer them respectively, to the following effect (or Orders made on them respectively as follows):

Poor Law Commissioners Letter 9 May 1856 No 13303 relative to the alteration proposed in the Salaries of certain Union Officers on the 2nd Inst. The Commissioners expressed their sanction of the reduction of the Medical Officers Salary from £100 to £90 a year and of the reduction of the Salary of each of the Country Relief Officers from £30 to £25, and they expressed an opinion that the Salary of the Relieving Officer for Galway district might also be reduced.

Poor Law Commissioners Letter 9 May 1856 No 8922 relative to the reduction proposed in the Salary of the Protestant Chaplain of the Workhouse to £20 a year and stating that they have intimated to the Rev. Mr. Crean their concurrence in the course proposed by the Board of Guardians with regard to his case.

Circular from Poor Law Commissioners 15 May 1856 No 13960 transmitting a form to be filled up regarding John Saker whom it is proposed to assist to

to Emigrate,

Poor Law Commissioners Letter 15 May 1856 No 13151 stating that they have received a Report on the state of the Union from D. Brodie P.L.I. in which he pointed out the unsatisfactory condition of the Finances of the Union the debts amounting to £2400, while the rates uncollected amount to about £1100 of which sum moreover it appears, a large sum is deemed to be unrecoverable on the ground that the premises on which the rates were made were unoccupied at the time the rate was signed. In reference to this point the Commissioners requested the Guardians attention to the letters addressed to them on the 3rd Nov 1853 and 18 December 1854.

The Commissioners suggested that a full rate for the Annual expenses should be made in the Districts in which the premises are principally situate at the period when such premises are in occupation so that no difficulty at the period when such premises are in occupation so that no difficulty may be raised on the point. The Commissioners remarked that they observed the Guardians required all the Collectors to close their Warrants on the 16th Inst and they would impress on the Guardians the necessity for taking steps to make a new rate in the Union without.

The Clerk stated that he was preparing the Estimate and would lay it before the Board on the first meeting in June.

After a good deal of discussion on the subject of the Estimate,

The Board unanimously agreed to allow another fortnight to the Collectors to close their collection but not longer.

That a meeting of the rate Committee be held on Thursday the 29 May, and that all the Collectors be requested to attend on that day and have their Collection Closed,

Report of Relieving Officer

May 14th 1856.

"I beg to report that 2 children named Joseph and Margaret Skelton aged 7 and 5 years, were admitted provisionally into this Union on Saturday night under the following circumstances,

On the 12 of last month a Relieving Officer named Cullin of the Galway Union caused the Father of these Children (a labourer then working at the Broad Stone Terraces) to be arrested on a charge of deserting them, and having proved his case, Skelton paid the expense of the Children's maintenance whilst in the Union and their fare by train to Dublin, I understand that he subsequently made a complaint to the Magistrate in Capel Street that his Children were not sent to him according to promise and that he had then gone to Belfast to look for employment. The Children were sent to Dublin by train on last Saturday and arrived at Broad Stone Terraces between 10 and 11 O'Clock, at night unprotected when they were found on the platform by constable D. 82, and by him conveyed to this Union where they remain at present."

Mr Cullin Relieving Officer for the Galway Union has handed in the following Letter of Explanation a copy of which was ordered to be forwarded to the Board of Guardians of the North Dublin Union.

Gentlemen
In reply to the statement put forth by

Mr Gillegan Relieving Officer of North Dublin Union with reference to the two Children Joseph and Margaret Hyland, beg to offer the following explanation.

On the 10th of March last the Board of Guardians directed me to proceed to Dublin to arrest Pat Hyland along with three others for neglecting to maintain their families who were paupers in the above Union. I arrested Hyland at the Broadstone Turnpike where he was then employed he was brought before the Magistrates at Capel Street Police Office on the 12th on proving my charge against him he appealed to the Magistrates to the best of my recollection through an Attorney stating that he was prepared to procure a free ticket or order from the Railway Company to take his Children from Galway to Dublin free of any charge to the Guardians and if committed and sent to Galway he would lose his employment and be thrown on the Union for support. The Magistrates consented to this arrangement and Hyland handed me the ticket, or order in Court signed by Mr Wilson the Company's Engineer giving the Children a free ticket in a third class carriage from Galway to Dublin which ticket I sent by post on some evening directed to Nicholas Sullivan Esq one of the Guardians requesting he would lay same before the Board at their next meeting as I could not return to Galway for a few days having to proceed to Templemore and Tansinstown on Union Business, on the 8th Inst the Board directed me to proceed to the Railway on the following day and see Hyland's Children sent off to Dublin by the 4 o'clock train. In compliance with this order,

I proceeded to the Railway Office and placed the two Children in a third class Carriage. I handed the ticket to the Railway Guard Joseph Connor who promised to pay every attention to the Children having known their Father to be for years employed by the Railway Company.

As to that part of Mr Gillegan's report which states that I have received the amount of expenses incurred in maintaining Hyland's family whilst inmates of the Galway Union together with their Railway fare to Dublin is quite false and without any foundation.

Mr Blakemore attended before the Board and stated that in compliance with the Boards instructions he applied to the Law Life Assurance Company for payment of the rates due by them and he read for the Board along letter which he received from Mr Dockett in reply, from which it appeared that the Company agreed to pay certain rates and objected to pay others on various grounds it concluded by stating that he had given instructions to Mr Robinson the Company's Agent at Ballmahnick requesting him to attend before the Board and go into the account and pay whatever may be found the Company were liable to. Mr Blakemore also read a letter from Mr Robinson stating that he would attend for the purpose on Wednesday next.

Resolved, That as Thursday next is appointed for a meeting of the Rate Committee and the Collectors to attend that Mr Blakemore do write to Mr Robinson requesting he would make it his convenience to attend on that day.

The Clerk stated that agreeably to the instructions of the Board he instructed Mr Blakemore to take proceedings against himself (the Clerk) for recovery of a sum of £31.9.5 rates alleged to be due by him as Immediate Lessor for Property at the Cluddagh, and that he had received a letter from Mr Blakemore requiring payment of the amount forthwith otherwise he should proceed as directed.

The Clerk stated that he considered it his duty as an Officer of the Union before the Board would incur any expense in proceeding against him, to point out to the Board in presence of Mr Blakely the uselessness of proceeding against Henry, as it was not the Immediate Lessor on whom the Rate was made, but on Dennis Taker and the rate bearing date the 1st Oct. 1854 while the Clerk did not get the place until February 1855, that he paid the rate which was made in September 1855 and holds Mr Carter's receipt.

Under these circumstances the Clerk was directed to instruct Mr Carter to serve 30 days notices on the occupiers and proceed by summons against them for recovery of the several sums but before doing so the Board referred the matter to the Rate Committee which is to meet on Thursday next.

Poor Law Commissioners Letter 28 May 1856, N^o 14893, stating that they have received from the Board of Guardians of North Dublin Union a copy of the Board's Letter addressed to that Board on the 16 Inst, and enclosing a copy of Mr Cullen's Letter one of the Relieving Officers of this Union respecting the circumstances, under which two children, named Joseph and Margaret Ireland, aged respectively 7 and 5 years, who were transmitted from Galway to Dublin,

In reference to this case the Commissioners state that it is much to be regretted that the children in question should have been sent to Dublin without steps having been first taken by the Board of Guardians to ascertain whether or not the father still continued in Dublin, and they thought the Board of Guardians have unjustly thrown a pecuniary burden upon the Board of Guardians of North Dublin Union,

It was a serious departure from the spirit and line of their duty, on the part of the Board of Guardians to send Children of such tender age on so long a journey without having previously taken any means to procure provision for their wants, or placed them in the charge of some person who would properly attend to them on their arrival in Dublin,

The Clerk laid the Estimate before the Board of the requirements of each Division of the Union to 29 September 1857, accompanied by the following statement,

6th June 1856.

Gentlemen

I'm laying before you the Estimate of the requirements of each Division of the Union up to 29 September 1857. I beg to make a few observations regarding it.

There will be a Debt on the 29 September 1856 of about £2800 which is accounted for by the following. The last rate struck will prove to be deficient by £1000, this was caused by the Guardians reducing the yearly cost of Maintenance and Clothing of the Paupers to £3, 5.0 per head for the year, while it ^{will} averaged £4, 17.6, since the last rate was struck the Solicitors Bills of Costs from 23 February 1850 to September 1855 amounting to £502, have been furnished no portion of which was provided for in former rates, not being furnished until December last. In case of one of the Sureties of Mr Martin (the defaulting Collector) a sum of £402 has been remitted since last rate was struck, (this is a charge exclusively on the Galway C. Division). Of the rate struck in September last a sum of £623 will prove to be irrecoverable being rates on unoccupied Stores and Houses &c in the Town of Galway. The poundage which each Division will require to cover its proportion of the deficiency which will exist

exist on the 29 September ¹⁰ next is shown in Col 10. of the Estimate but as Galway Co. Division requires a rate of 1/5 to meet its proportion of said deficiency (which amounts to £1875) it may be satisfactory for the Board to have laid before them the items making it up.

In the case of Galway should the Board anticipate a similar striking off of rates for unoccupied stores and houses next year as has occurred this year a further sum of 5 or 6 in the £ should be added to provide for same this would make the rate 3/6.

The Board will observe that the several poundages rates now required are considerably lower than the poundages required last year except in the Divisions of Amadown, Claregalway, Crannore, Liskenavalla, Shevenena, Belleville, Clughrin, Lackabeg, Liskenavalla, Limboogh, and Inshmore, in which the poundages now required are equal and in some instances exceed those of last year, this was caused by these divisions having large balances in

their favour last year which left only small rates necessary, but these balances have since been exhausted and the Divisions above referred to consequently require higher rates now than they required last year but yet the rates in these Divisions cannot be ~~great~~ considered high compared with the other Divisions of the Union and with former rates, in Inshmore & Galway the cause of its requiring so high a rate in future is the re-establishing there a separate Dispensary District as the entire expense of its Dispensary will in future be charged to it and not jointly to Inshmore & Galway as heretofore.

The total sum required to carry out the Union for the year ending 29 September 1857 and to discharge the liabilities which will be due on 29 Sept next is £6783 being £2972 less than the amount required last year which is a reduction of over 30 per Cent.

The Estimate being given in detail I will conclude by impressing on the Board the necessity which exists for striking rates according to the Estimate and the great advantage which will accrue to the Union by your doing so, as the Union cannot be expected to be ever in a satisfactory state until the Guardians are in a position to clear off their Debts and pay for their Supplies Monthly in which position you can never expect to be until rates equal to the requirements are struck.

Ordered that the extra allowance be discontinued unless the Medical Off^r.

certifies that he requires it:

Mr. Little from Mr. Oliver giving notice that unless paid the amount of his debt he would discontinue his supplies.

Mr. Blair told me informed that the Board will have a cheque filled for him on Friday next.

This being the day appointed ~~for~~ for the Collectors to close their collections & hand in their warrants, Messrs. Jolan, Curreen, Dillane, Szym and Conside and Szym attended, Jolan Curreen and Szym handed in their warrants and closed their collections and the Board examined the books of Messrs. Szym and Conside and although the collections were not quite closed, yet the papers made and the general state of the collection ~~was~~ did not appear to be so formidable as it was at their Bonds being put in suit.

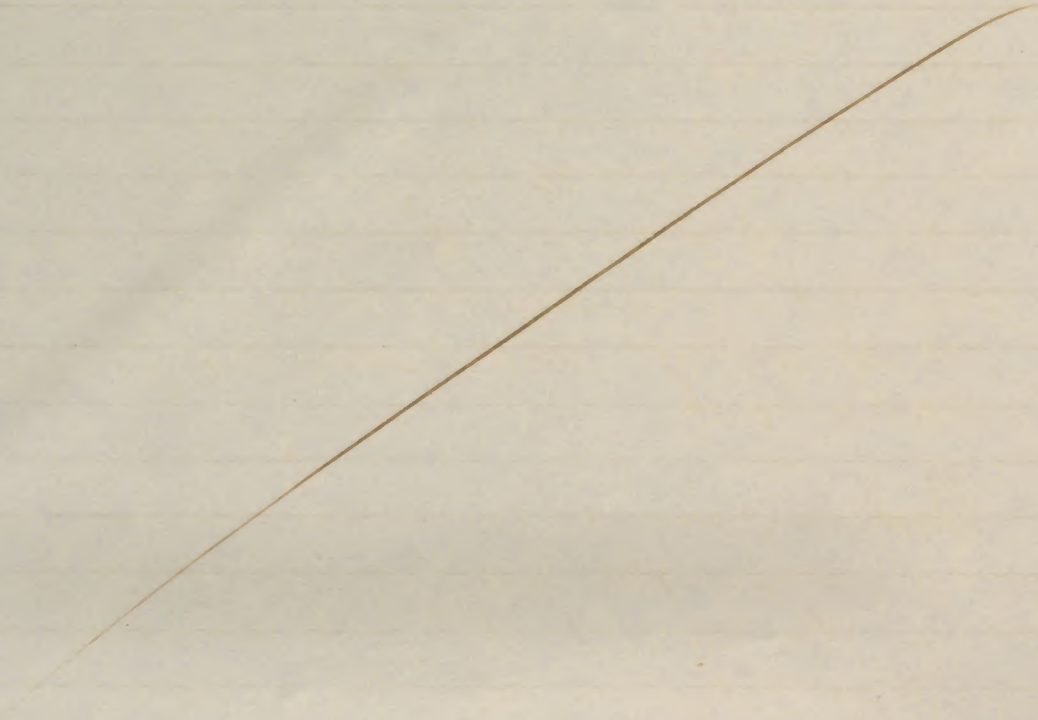

Read Letter from the Commissioners of valuation regarding a Clerical error which has been committed in the case of Dr Doherty's House at Gornmouth that it being valued at £40 instead of £30, and requesting the Clerk to correct same.

Poor Law Commissioners Letter to the Presiding Chairman dated 10th July No 18730 relative to the resolution of the Board of Guardians of the 4th Inst transmitting a Copy of the Rev Mr Daley's letter to the Clerk of the Union in reply to a Letter of the Clerk having reference to matters which formed the subject of the late enquiry.

The Commissioners informed the Board that they have addressed the Rev Mr Daley on the subject stating to him that the Commissioners have been informed that the Clerk was not authorised to address him on the subject of the Enquiry and that he would therefore see that he had been led through misapprehensions into the use of most improper language towards the Board of Guardians of the Union, without any grounds for offence or irritation having been afforded by them. The Commissioners also in their Communication to the Rev Mr Daley, expressed a hope that he will withdraw the offensive expressions used towards the Board of Guardians in his Letter.

The Commissioners are informed that the Clerk had the directions of the Board to Summon all officers to attend the late enquiry (not excepting the Rev Mr Daley.)

Poor Law Commissioners Letter to the Presiding Chairman 10 July 1856 No 18712 transmitting minutes of the evidence taken by Dr Brodie in the late enquiry. Circular from the Poor Law Commissioners dated 26 August 1856 No 201 MSB transmitting a copy of the Burial Grounds Act passed in the late Session of Parliament.

Poor Law Commissioners Letter dated 21 August 56 No 22455 with reference to the order issued by them removing the Rev Mr Daley from the office of Chaplain of the Workhouse. The Commissioners stated that they have instructed their Inspector Dr Brodie to take steps to provide a successor to the late Roman Catholic Chaplain.

After an long discussion the following Resolution was proposed by Mr Murphy and seconded by Mr Gurney.

Resolved, That we the Guardians of this Union feeling that the duties of Chaplain have been always discharged with zeal and assiduity

as well as with advantage to the inmates of the Union by the Rev Mr Daley cannot but lament the precipitancy with which the Commissioners for the Relief of the Poor issued a sealed order for his removal from the office of Chaplain to this Workhouse without any previous intimation to us of their intention and thus deprive us of the services of a Clergyman who for upwards of thirty years has acted as the faithful Minister of the People of this Parish.

We therefore ~~hope~~ request the Commissioners will reconsider the matter with a view to withdrawing the sealed order issued for his removal and in the mean time that the Rev Mr Daley be requested as a matter of favour to the Guardians of this Union to allow his Curates to continue to afford Spiritual Comfort and Consolation to the inmates of this Workhouse

Mr Kinnon moved the following amendment which was seconded by Mr Blake.

The Guardians on mature consideration express their opinion that the Board of Guardians were not justified in including the attendance of either the Protestant or Roman Catholic Chaplains in accordance with their resolution of the 13th June 1856. Having made this admission the Board respectfully request the Rev Mr Daley will withdraw the strong expressions contained in his letter to the Guardians and to his letter to the Commissioners for administering the Laws for the Relief of the Poor. The Guardians further hope that the Rev. Gentleman will permit one of his Curates to officiate at the Workhouse on Sunday next.

Report of acting Clerk -

Gentlemen,

I have the honor to report that in pursuance of the Resolution passed by the Board of Guardians on last day of meeting, I summoned the Collectors to attend for the purpose of closing their accounts. Messrs Carter, Curran, Hernan and Cummins attended. Mr Curran handed me his collecting Book for the Electoral Division of Spiddal which I closed and he reported to me at the same time that he gave up his warrant for the Fumbough Electoral Division some time since, but the Clerk's office being sealed up I was unable to obtain it. Subsequently the Committee appointed to take charge of the Clerk's office met, and the office was opened but Mr Curran had then left and I was unable to close the collecting book for the Spiddal Electoral Division, - Mr Hernan handed me his warrant for the Electoral Division of Quismac having collected and lodged the full amount of the last Rate on that Division, his abstract however could not be found and I could not therefore formally close his accounts. Mr Cummins appeared with his books but having stated to me that there were some arrears which he hoped to be able to lodge by this day I thought it better to postpone the closing of his accounts. Mr Carter attended with his books and lodged at the hour of 12 o'clock. - He assisted me in making out a list of Rates. I would thought it better under the circumstances to have a complete List of outstanding Rates on the west ward made out, which Mr Carter undertook to do, and I am now ready to submit it to the Board, or to prepare from it an amended statement when I shall have obtained the List of arrears struck off by the Rate Committee, - I feel bound to make mention of the exertions with which Mr Carter attended on Wednesday, Thursday and this morning, and of the assistance afforded by him in closing his accounts.

Mr Conidine sent me in his collecting books on Wednesday evening but did not appear himself. Mr Flaherty sent in a note which I shall read to you excusing his attendance, - Mr Fynn attended on yesterday but did not bring his books with him. Messrs Dillane & Folan did not attend,

It will appear from this statement that only four of the fellows attended on the day specified in the guardians resolution, and I have to request that some steps may be taken to compel the attendance of the others.

Galway

12th Sept. 1856

To The Presiding Chairman and Guardians of the Galway Union.—
Gentlemen,

In compliance with your request as contained in one of the Resolutions which by your directions were transmitted to me on Saturday last, I sent a Clergyman to celebrate Mass for the Sumates of the Workhouse on Sunday morning—

I feel that it would be ungenerous in me not to correspond unhesitatingly with the anxious desire of a Board of Guardians who have manifested so much solicitude for the religious comforts of the poor entrusted to their care, and who have at the same time so kindly and cordially acted towards myself in an affair which so deeply and keenly affected my feelings as a man, and my position and character as a Clergyman.— I acknowledge much kindness on your part with gratitude, and having so frequently at your several Meetings repudiated every intention of giving me offence and it being officially allowed by the Guardians that I should never have been required to attend the late investigation held by Dr. Brodie,

P. L. J. I could not feel justified either to my own
Sentiments, or to your repeated professions of respect and regard,
in refusing to comply with the request contained in the unanimous
Resolution of so numerous and respectable a body of Guardians
as attended your Meeting last Friday, or withdrawing any
expressions heretofore used by me and considered offensive; and
accordingly I feel great pleasure in withdrawing such expressions
and sincerely regret that what was only applied to an
