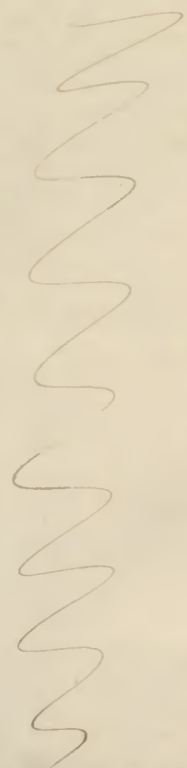

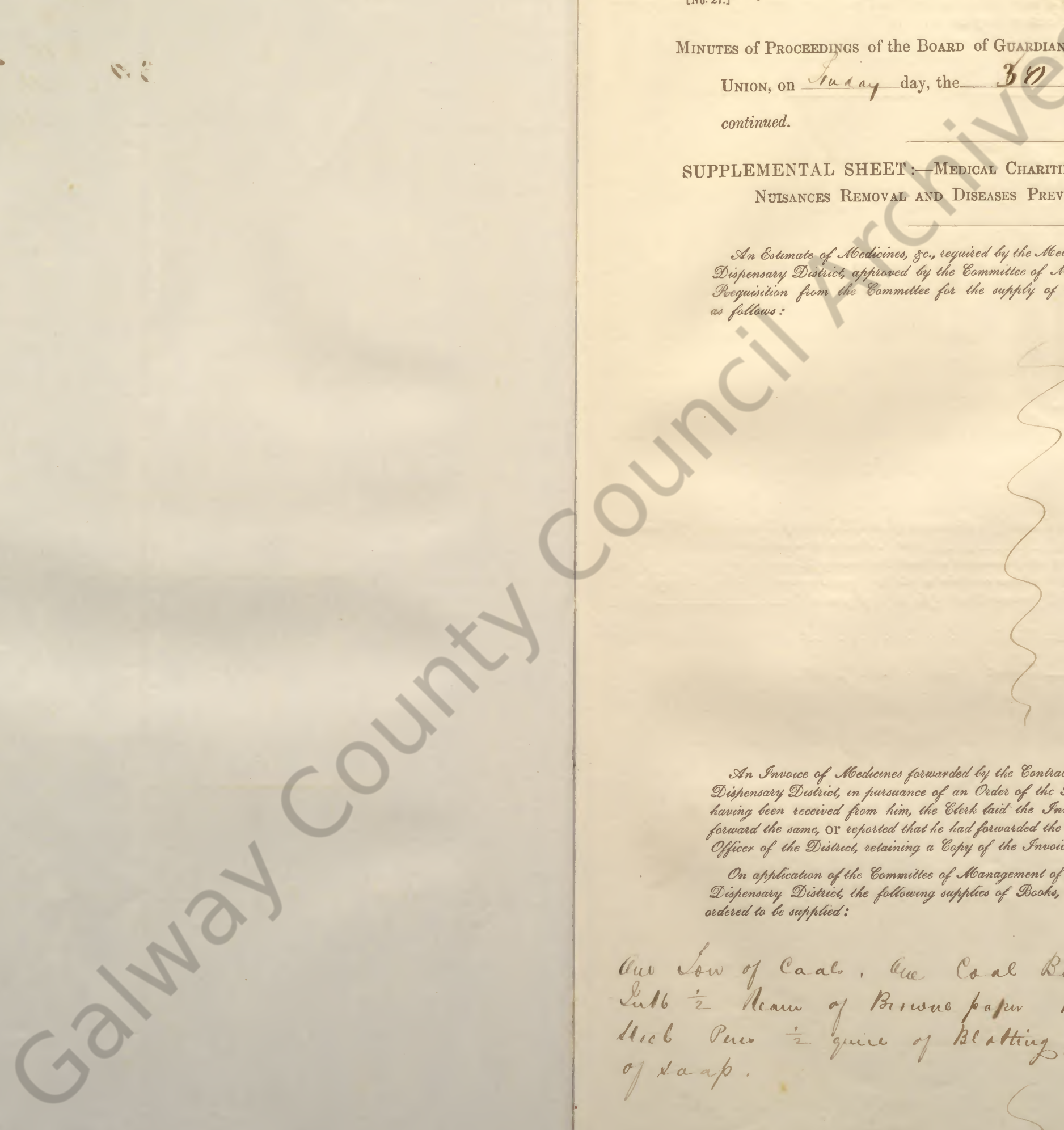

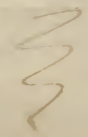

The Commissioners for administering the Laws for the relief of the poor in Ireland desire to state for the information of the Board of Guardians of Aughtward Union that they have received the report of their Inspector Dr. Brodie, together with the Evidence taken at the Inquiring which he was instructed to make with respect to the case of a destitute poor person, named Catherine King to which the attention of the Commissioners was drawn by the Board of Guardians of Galway Union at their meeting on the 30th ultimo.

The Guardians of Galway Union complained that the female in question was, whilst in the last stage pregnancy improperly removed by direction of the Guardians of Aughtward Union to the Galway Union for the purpose of being received there.

It appears from Dr. Brodie's report and the Evidence forwarded by him that "Catherine King, or Crippen and a native Ballinacillan in the Moycullen, E. Division of the Galway Union, but ~~having~~ ^{being} for sometime in the Town of Galway. ~~but~~ being pregnant and desirous of obtaining admission into a workhouse determined to go to Aughtward and endeavour to obtain admission to

To the workhouse of that Union,
 on Sunday the 27th ultimo she accordingly went by the Public car having as she swears paid the fare herself to Aughtead, but on her arrival she was in such a state of weakness, that the car agent Mr. Nelly, was obliged to assist her to get off the car Mr. Nelly states that "she was unable to get off it without assistance, when taken off the car she was unable to stand and fell on the Road,

Mr. Nelly having then placed the poor woman in a sitting position by the Road side drew the attention of Mr. Mow and Mr. James of minor Guardians of Aughtead,

Mr. James having then questioned Catharine King in reference to her desire to be relieved in the Aughtead Workhouse made an observation to her to the effect that she did not belong to the Union, but upon Mr. Nelly representing the urgency of her case stated that he would lay the case before the Board of Guardians who were then assembled,

Mr Matthias Mow, a Relieving Officer of Aughtead Union, came to the place where the applicant Catharine King was placed, and after hearing her account of her self likewise told her that she did not belong to Aughtead Union, and she had he feared "a bad chance of being admitted into the Aughtead Workhouse but that he would bring her case before the Guardians. He states, however in his depositions that if the Board had not been sitting when the female applied to him for relief he would have given her a provisional ticket of admission to the workhouse. The other Relieving Officer of the Union Mr. Mc Donogh also deposed that the woman ought in his opinion, to have been relieved that she appeared, to be in a very bad state. Her feet much swollen and altogether feeble,

Mr. Mow then reported the case to the Guardians, whom he met at the Workhouse, but instead of ordering relief to the destitute and unfortunate female they directed the Relieving Officer to remove her for the purpose of obtaining relief into the Salway Union, instructing him to take her to Moycullen, and give her up to the Relieving Officer there, a course which was contrary to the spirit of the provisions of the 3^d Section of the act 10th & 11th Vict Cap 84

The Relieving Officer Mow, did as he was ordered by the Guardians and it is only an account of the specific and express directions which he received from the Guardians on this occasion, that the Commissioners refrain from issuing an order under seal for his dismissal = In taking this lenient view of his conduct upon this occasion, the Commissioners will consider it necessary to caution Mr. Mow that should he at any time, pursue a similar course, and either fail to afford an applicant in urgent circumstances, relief on the ground that such applicant does not belong to the Union (which is not a valid ground for refusing relief) or if he should again carry out illegal orders of the Guardians as he did in this case the Commissioners will remove him from office.
