Humbly Sheweth

That in this Union the provisions of the Poor Relief Act have been carried out with care economy and attention

That your Petitioners are of opinion that it would remove much if not all, the opposition offered to the working of the Irish Poor Relief Act if the Country were relieved from the repayment of the Loan advanced by the Government for the Building of the Work Houses throughout Ireland

That in the Bill at present before Parliament for the Amendment of the Irish Poor Law Act there is a clause exempting Holders of Property under a certain Amount from the payment of the Poor Rate and imposing the entire on the Landlords

That your Petitioners are of opinion that no class of tenants in Ireland should be exempted by Law from their just proportion of the Rate inasmuch as such a Measure would they apprehend have one of two prejudicial effects. it would either on the one hand tend to increase and encourage Pauperism on the tenements so exempted and would leave the Inhabitants

thereof

thereof no Interest in keeping down
 the Rate - or - on the other hand it
 would present an inducement to
 Landlords to enlarge their holdings
 on their Estates; in Proof, - of course
 adding to the Number of destitute
 Poor and accelerating what is called
 the Charance System

That your Petitioners
 are at the same time would re-
 commend in consequence of the diff-
 -culty of collecting the Rate from
 a vast Number of small occu-
 -pans as well as for the sake of
 the peace of the Country that on
 Holdings valued at or under Four
 Pounds it should be collected like
 the Tithe Rent Charge in the first In-
 -stance from the Landlord who
 could receive the tenants propo-
 -tion along with the Rent

That in
 Reference to the 11th Clause of the Bill
 your Petitioners respectfully object
 to the totally inadequate protec-
 -tion afforded as between the
 several Electoral Divisions of the
 same Union by the definition
 of Residence - the expressions
 being "occupied some tenements

 for six Months or usually slept
 within such Electoral Division

From which your Petitioners Board has been happily free at Meetings of the Guardians respecting the liability of the several Electoral Divisions is more calculated to widen differences and excite feelings of dissatisfaction between the respective Guardians so occupying that time and attention which ought to be devoted to the interests of the Union at large and to the beneficial working of the Law

That with a view of preventing injustices and litigation your Petitioners see no effective remedy except to make the expense of each Work House chargeable to the General Union at large without reference or distinction of Electoral Divisions in the same manner that the Establishment Expenses are at present charged

Your Petitioners pray your Hon^{ble} House will amend the present Law by relieving the County from the repayment of the Advances made by Government for a measure of expiation and by equalizing the rate throughout every part of the Unions and will be also pleased not to exempt any class of Occupiers from a fair contribution towards it Making
