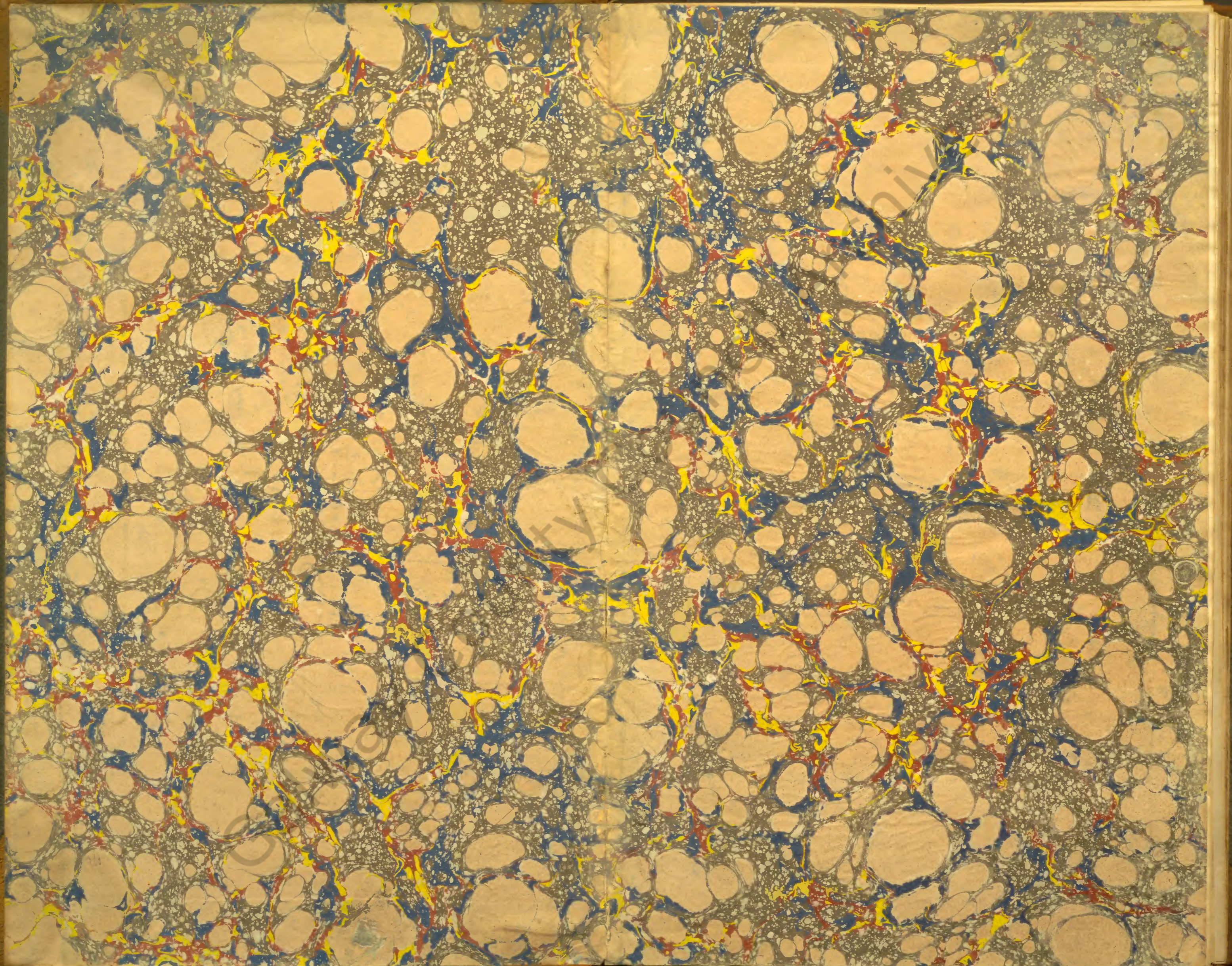

From the Poor Law Commissioners in reference to the Registry of the Religion of Bickely Longdon on the 28th ult^o, and stating it was the opinion of the Commissioners that the Guardians had acted correctly and in conformity to the 49th section of the Irish Poor Relief Act.

Read a copy of the Commission on us letter to the Rev. J. Inman on the subject

Read a letter from the Poor Law Commissioners in reference to the directions given by the Board of Guardians

Guardians on the 4th Inst; to Mr Patrick Martin to proceed under the 2^o section of the Irish Poor Law Amendment Act against embezzlers who are in arrears of rate and forwarding a form of notice to be served in such case

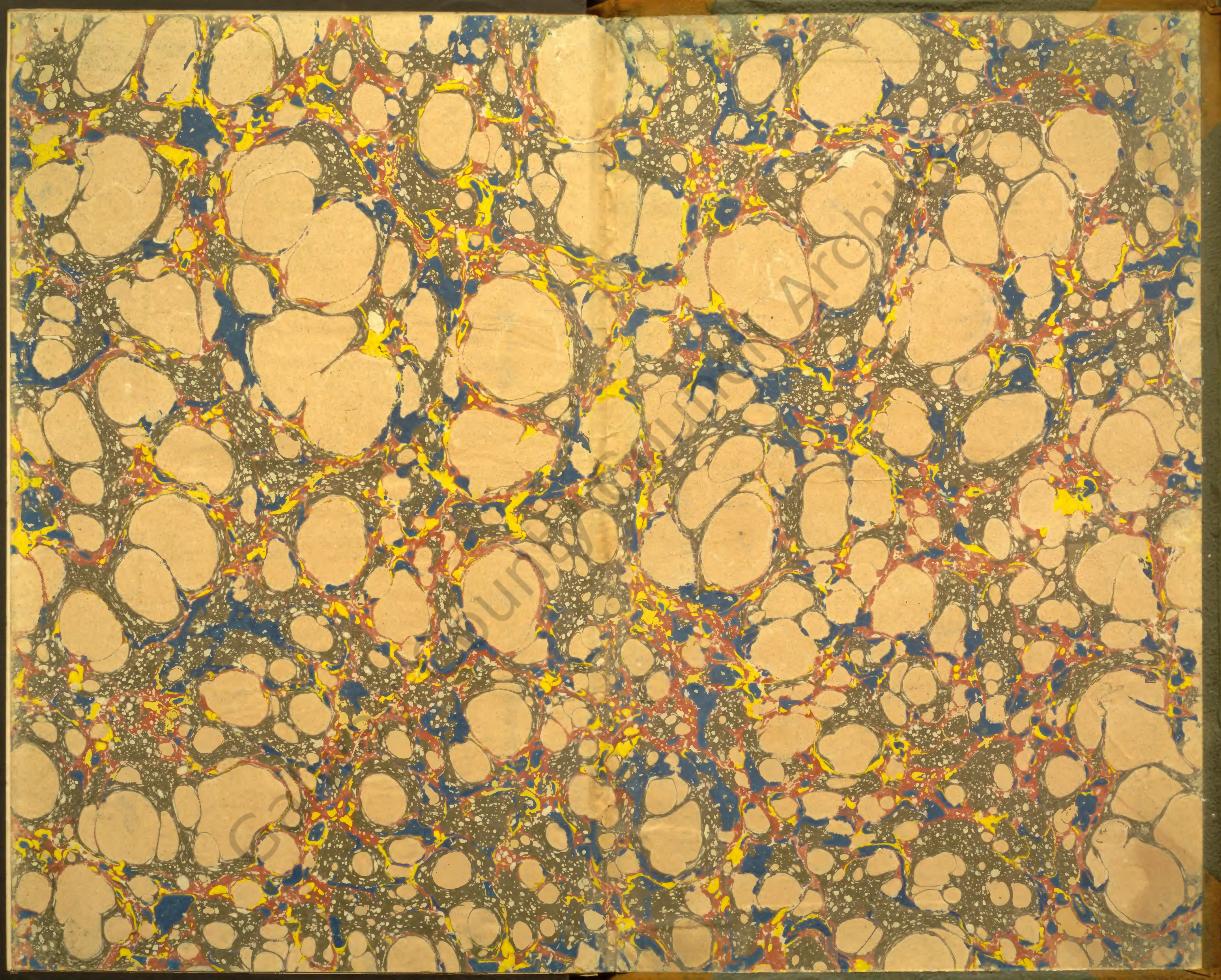

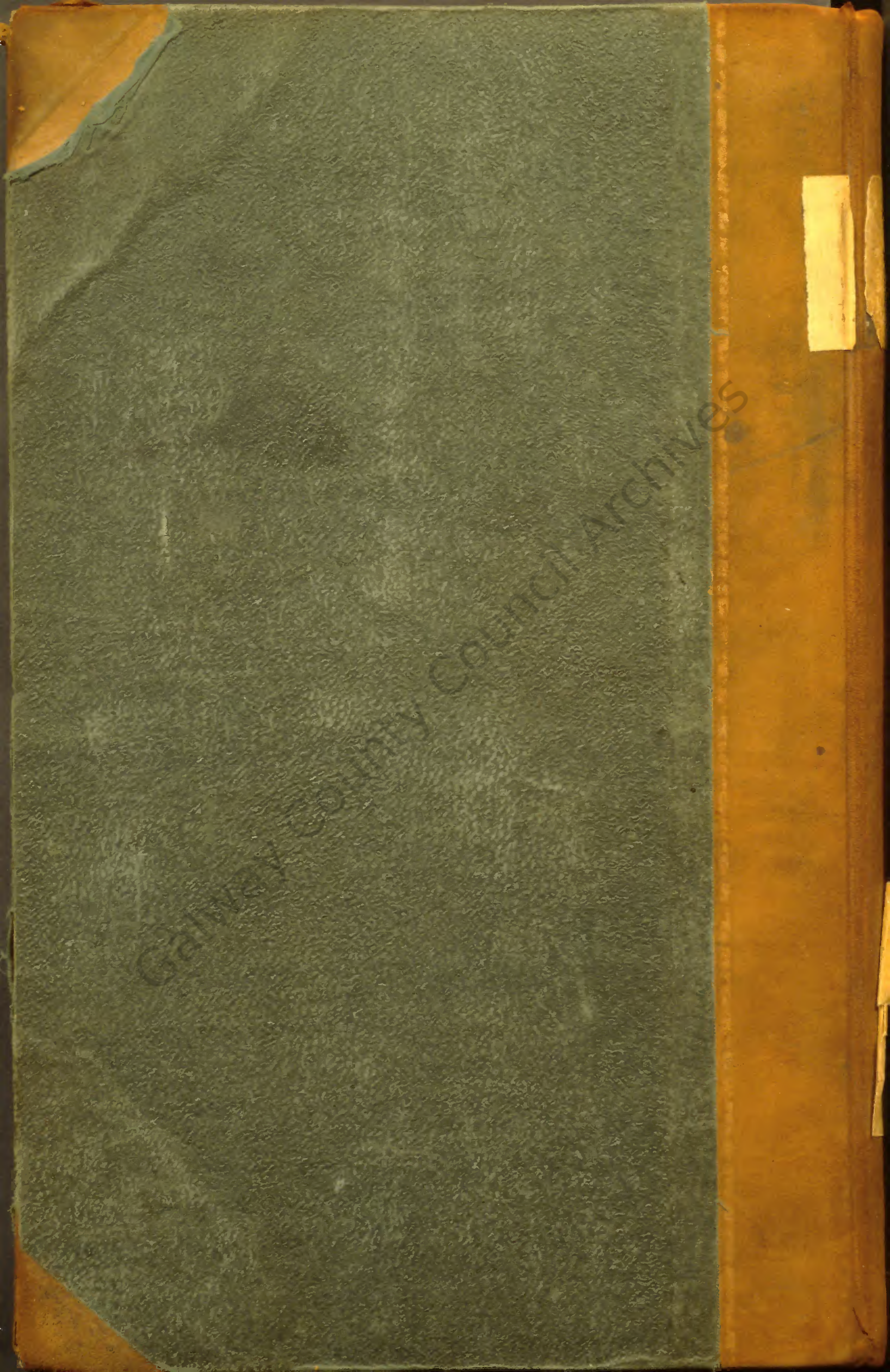
