The Clerk reported that the old Hospital Building at Reamore Point was completely destroyed by fire on the 2nd inst., and that he had reported the matter to the Insurance Company with whom the building was insured, he also said he had consulted the Chairman & Vice Chairman in reference to a telegram he had received from the Insurance Co., that their Assessor would be here on the 3rd inst., and on their ~~written~~ directions he had instructed Mr Binns B.E. to meet the Assessor.

A letter was read from Mr Binns stating that he had met the Assessor (W. Wiseman) & that he had agreed on behalf of the Board to accept the sum of £140= for compensation for the damage done by the recent fire. He recommended that the Railway men should be paid

paid a sum of £1=10=0 and that Morgan the foreman should get £1= for his services at the fire. he further recommended that the military be paid £4= for their services at the fire and in protecting the new building and asked that his fees for assessment at 10% be paid.

The suggestions were agreed to, and it was ordered to pay the sums named.

A letter was read from Capt Caddell asking if the Board would defray the cost of repairing the Military Fire Engine which got damaged in being taken down to Kenmore Point owing to the roughness of the road-way.

As no estimate of the damage to the Engine had been furnished the consideration of the matter was postponed to next meeting of the Board.

A letter was read from W^m Dolan Caretaker, asking to be allowed £1=18=0 for clothes and articles of furniture his property destroyed at the recent fire.

The notice calling the meeting having been read also copies of telegrams sent by D. Sandys & the Clerk to the Local Government Board and reply from the latter.

A letter was read from Mr Mullery, Clerk Galway Union enclosing copy of report of the Medical Officers of the Workhouse (which was also read) Mr Mullery stated that the Galway Guardians had made an order directing that the patients should be removed at once to the Intercepting Hospital at Sluicore and requesting that arrangements be made for their admission to same.

A long discussion followed during which D. Sandys stated he did not consider the present cases very dangerous.

Mr James W. Campbell having moved

"That the patients be removed at once to the Intercepting Hospital" and after further discussion the following proposition made by D. Walsh and seconded by Sir James O'Donoghue

"That we write to the guardians and state that we consider that the cases of Derr. beri at present in the Fever Hospital are not a serious danger to the public and we ask the guardians to re-consider their decision to have the cases removed from the Fever Hospital."

which was agreed to. Messrs J. Campbell & P. Curran dissenting
It was further ordered that pending the decision of the guardians the Intercepting Hospital be furnished for the reception of the patients.

Mr McNeill proposed
"That having heard D. Sandys' statement we are of opinion that he took the proper steps having regard to the circumstances."

A discussion took place as to whether the patients suffering from Beri-beri at present in the Fever Hospital should be removed to the Intercepting Hospital and whether it would be the duty of D. Sandys Port Medical Officer to attend to them whilst there

Mr J. McCampbell proposed "that the patients be removed to the Intercepting Hospital. D. Walsh seconded and it was unanimously agreed to have the patients removed, and the Clerk was directed to ascertain from the Local Government Board if it was the duty of the Port Medical Officer of Health to attend to these cases.

The Clerk submitted a number of accounts for articles purchased by him to prepare the Hospital for the reception of the patients and he was directed to procure any other articles necessary.

D. Sandys suggested the advisability of getting a Telephone or some other means of communication with the Hospital and Mr Crowley proposed and Mr McNeill seconded that a Telephone or some other means of communication be procured, and it was unanimously agreed to, cost not to exceed £5.

D. Sandys called attention to the expenses of visiting the ship in the Bay and also the Hospital but no order was made in regard to same.

The Clerk asked for directions as to how he should meet small payments that would become necessary and it was agreed to advance a sum of £10. to meet Petty Cash payments, and a Treasurer's Authority in respect of same was signed.

was decided that a copy of the
letter be sent to each member of the
joint Board, and that it should be
considered at a meeting of the Board
to be held on the 11th inst and that
copies of the Local Government
Board Sanitary Order Nos. be
procured and supplied to each
member.

that D. Sandys be offered a weekly
allowance of £1.1.0 a week for attending
the patients (There being no second
the proposition fell through.)

Mr J. M. Campbell proposed that
D. Sandys get a bulk sum of £20. in
full discharge of his services for
his attendance on the patients at
present in the Hospital.

Mr Michael Walsh seconded the
proposition which was unanimously

agreed to. Dr. Sandys having expressed his willingness to accept the offer.

A discussion took place with regard to the question of providing funds to meet the expenses in regard to the cases of Beri-Beri at present in the Hospital and on the proposition of Mr. McNeill seconded by Mr. McRowley the following resolution was passed.

"That we the Galway Port Sanitary Authority ask the Local Government Board for Ireland for permission to pay interest on the overdraft that may be necessary to meet the expenses incurred in the treatment etc., of the cases of Beri-Beri at present in the Intercepting Hospital."

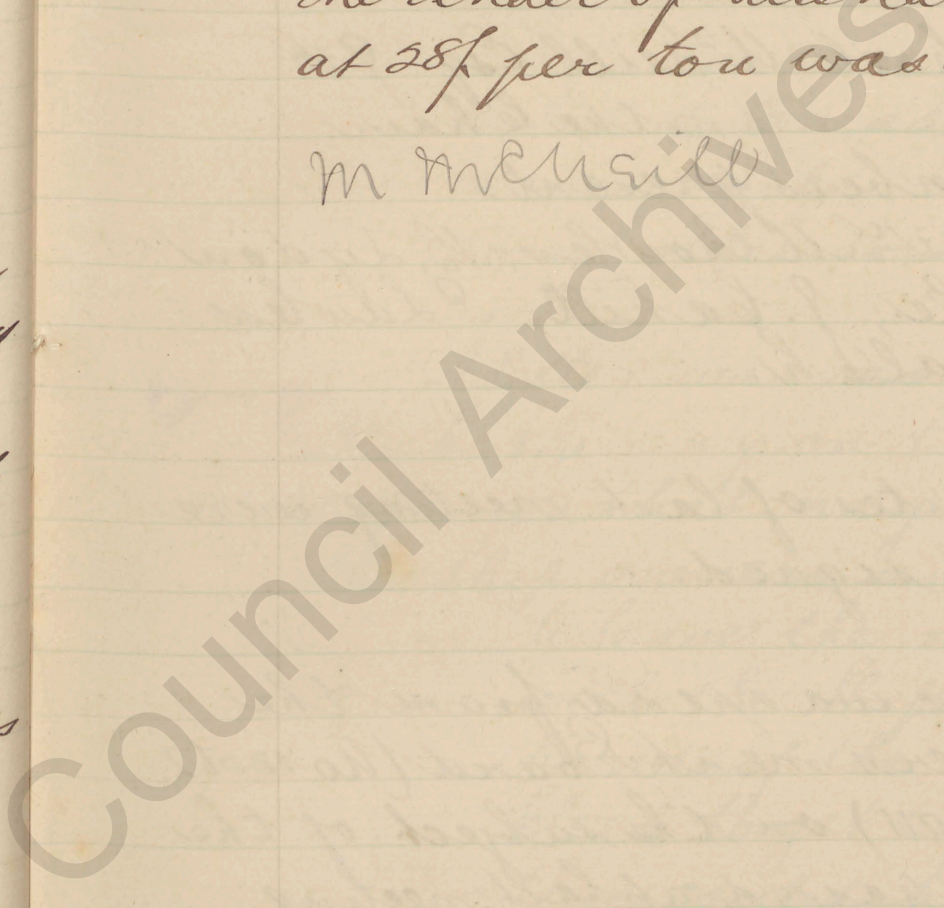

A letter was read from the Local Government Board (No. 12562. 21 March 1911) on the subject of the Resolution passed at last meeting asking for sanction of the Local Government Board to pay interest on overdraft required to meet expenses of cases of *Scrubberia* at present in the Intercepting Hospital and stating that the Board are not possessed of any powers enabling them to sanction the payment of interest on an overdraft and suggesting that the Port Sanitary Authority might obtain the necessary money by way of an advance from one or more of the contributory authorities.

The Chairman having explained that the contributory authorities had now framed and adopted their estimates for

the current year and had not made provision for any advance to the joint Board and accordingly they could not be asked to make any advance. The Clerk was directed to make inquiries if the money could be obtained from some other source.

A letter was read from Mess^{rs} Blake & Kenny on the subject of the expenses that may be recovered from the Ship owners, and it was decided to leave the matter of arranging with the Ship's Captain in the hands of the Solicitors and Clerk to get the best terms they could from the Ship owners.
