several classes of patients who
suffer from Peripheral Neuritis
and after some discussion it
was decided to send a copy of
D^r Sandys report to the Guardians
for consideration

M^r Cooke inquired if a person who
was not a trained nurse could be
got to look after the patient and
thereby lessen the expense, and
D^r Sandys stated ~~it~~ would not be
safe to put him in charge of a
person who was not properly
trained in as much as he still
required hospital treatment and
the two nurses were necessary.

D^r Sandys having stated the patient was not now suffering from an infectious disease, and that it would be quite safe to discharge him. It was unanimously agreed that the patient be discharged, and it was ordered that the Board of Guardians be replied to stating that the Port Sanitary Authority were

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not responsible for the enormous expense that had been incurred, as they had done their utmost to have the patients treated at least expense possible.

Mr Lawless' notice of motion "That the claim of the Rev P. J. Newell V.P. to the Chaplaincy of the Intercepting Hospital be considered" being moved. Mr Lawless suggested that a sum of £10. be allowed to Father Newell. It was agreed not to consider the question of appointing a Chaplain to the Hospital, and on the motion of D^r Walsh seconded by Mr M. J. Cooke it was agreed that a sum of £3.3.0 be allowed to Father Newell for his attendance at the Hospital subject to the sanction of the Local Government Board.

D^r Sandys asked for directions as regards treatment of future cases of Beri Beri that may reach the Port, and the matter was postponed for the present.
