The Clerk reported that as a consequence of a report that Plague infected rats having been found at Liverpool a very strict examination of ships from that port was being maintained until the possibility of infection was reported over and that he had taken steps suggested by the Port Medical Officer of Health for trapping of rats, and the Sanitary Sub Officer had kept some of them for some days before being destroyed for the purpose of seeing if they showed any signs of disease.

The Sanitary Sub Officer reported that he had examined 42 vessels arriving from foreign ports during the year to the 31st March 1936.

Revision of Bonus.

I am instructed by the Minister for Local Government and
Public Health to advert to Circular Letter of the 30th June
last (G.73/38) regarding the revision of the cost of living bonus.

The bonus for the period 1st January to 30th June, 1939,
in the case of Government employees, will be based on an average
cost of living figure of 75, the same as obtained for the six
months which commenced on the 1st July last.

Bonus calculated on the basis of the average cost of
living figure applies only in cases in which remuneration has
been expressly fixed by way of basic salary or wages, with
bonus varying from time to time in accordance with variations
in the average cost of living, and the maximum amount of bonus
payable to any officer or employee of a local authority is that
shown in the official Ready Reckoner published by the Stationery
Office for the computation of bonus on the basis of the average
cost of living figure of 75, as being applicable to his basic
salary.

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
