Importation of Foreign Meat.

The following is the copy of a letter on the subject of the importation of foreign meat sent to the Authority by the Local Government Board:—

"Sir,—I am directed by the Local Government Board for Ireland to forward herewith for the inspection of the Port Sanitary Authority a copy of a letter issued by the Local Government Board, Whitehall, London, with regard to the inspection of certain kinds of foreign meat under the regulations made with respect thereto under the Public Health (Regulations as to Food) Act, 1907. I am to add that the new official certificate in connection with foreign meat imported into Ireland from the Netherlands was circulated by the Local Government Board for Ireland on the 1st of May, 1909.—I am, sir, your obedient servant, J. E. Devlin, Assistant Secretary.

Appended to the letter was a form of label for attachment to all consignments of foreign meat. Should meat arrive at any port minus this label, which was also a certificate of *bona fides* of the class of meat imported, the Customs' Authorities at such port must report such defalcation to the Clerk of the Port Sanitary Authority, who forthwith shall cause an examination to be made by the Port Medical Officer, who, if he considers same unfit for human use, may cause its immediate destruction.

The Galway Port Sanitary Order (Adaptation) Order, 1932.

WHEREAS by provisional order called the Galway Port Sanitary Order, 1902, as confirmed by the Local Government Board (Ireland) Provisional Orders Confirmation (No.4) Act, 1902, (which Order and Act are respectively referred to in this Order as "the Order of 1902" and "the Confirming Act") a port sanitary authority was constituted for that part of the customs port of Galway described in the Order of 1902, by forming a joint board under the name of the Galway Port Sanitary Authority consisting of seventeen representative members of the several component authorities specified therein, being sanitary authorities of sanitary districts forming part of or abutting on the said part of the said port:

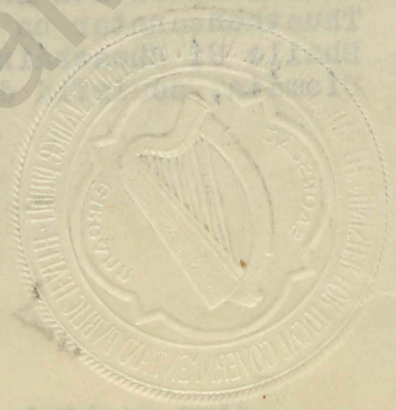
AND WHEREAS the said component authorities comprised the Council of the Urban District of Galway and the Councils of the Rural Districts of Galway, Gort, Ballyvaghan, Oughterard and Ennistymon, and by article 3 of the Order of 1902, it was provided that of the members of the said joint board eight should be elected by the Council of the Urban District of Galway, four by the Council of the Rural District of Galway, two by the Council of the Rural District of Gort and one each by the Councils of the Rural Districts of Ballyvaghan, Oughterard and Ennistymon:

AND WHEREAS under and by virtue of the Local Government Act, 1925, the Councils of the Rural Districts of Galway, Gort and Oughterard have ceased to exist and the said Rural Districts have been merged in the County Health District of Galway:

AND WHEREAS under and by virtue of the Local Government Act, 1925, the Councils of the Rural Districts of Ballyvaghan and Ennistymon have ceased to exist and the said Rural Districts have become merged in the County Health District of Clare:

AND WHEREAS in pursuance of section 5(2) of the Local Government Act, 1925, the duty of the Councils of the Rural Districts of Galway Gort and Oughterard to elect members of the Galway Port Sanitary Authority is now the duty of the Council of the Administrative County of Galway; and the like duty of the Councils of the Rural Districts of Ballyvaghan and Ennistymon is now the duty of the Council of the Administrative County of Clare:

AND WHEREAS the Confirming Act is an existing enactment within the meaning of section 86 of the Local Government Act, 1925, relating to matters dealt with or affected by that Act and it appears to the Minister for Local Government and Public Health necessary or expedient for carrying the Local Government Act, 1925, into effect to make the adaptations hereinafter appearing of the Confirming Act:

 - (1) The Council of the Administrative County of Galway and the Council of the Administrative County of Clare shall be component authorities of the Galway Port Sanitary Authority.
 - (2) The Galway Port Sanitary Authority shall consist of seventeen members who shall be elected by the respective component authorities from among persons who at the time of such election are members of their own bodies as follows:-
 - Eight by the Council of the Urban District of Galway;
 - Seven by the Council of the Administrative County of Galway;
 - Two by the Council of the Administrative County of Clare.
 - (3) Notwithstanding anything contained in article 20 of the Order of 1902, the proportions in which the component authorities shall contribute to the expenses of the Galway Port Sanitary Authority shall, unless and until the Minister for Local Government and Public Health otherwise directs by order under seal, be as follows:

Urban District of Galway	fifty per centum
Administrative County of Galway ..	forty-one per centum
Administrative County of Clare ..	nine per centum
 - (4) The contribution of the Council of the Administrative County of Galway shall be raised by means of the poor rate as a district charge equally over the County Health District of Galway and the contribution of the Council of the Administrative County of Clare shall be raised in the like manner equally over the County Health District of Clare.

NOW THEREFORE the Minister for Local Government and Public Health in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 88 of the Local Government Act, 1925, does by this his Order, order as follows, that is to say:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Galway Port Sanitary Order (Amendment) Order, 1932, and shall take effect as from the date hereof.

2. The continuing Act in so far as it relates to the Order of 1902, shall be applied in the manner and to the extent necessary to give effect to the following provisions:

(1) The Council of the Administrative County of Galway and the Council of the Administrative County of Clare shall be component authorities of the Galway Port Sanitary Authority.

(2) The Galway Port Sanitary Authority shall consist of seventeen members who shall be elected by the respective component authorities from among persons who at the time of such election are members of their own bodies as follows:-

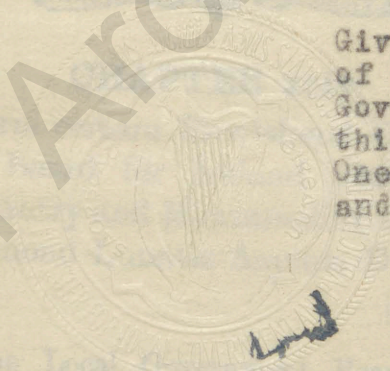
Eight by the Council of the Urban District of Galway;
Four by the Council of the Administrative County of Galway;
Five by the Council of the Administrative County of Clare.

(3) Notwithstanding anything contained in article 50 of the Order of 1902, the expenses in which the component authorities shall contribute to the expenses of the Galway Port Sanitary Authority shall, unless and until the Minister for Local Government and Public Health otherwise directs by order under seal, be as follows:-

Urban District of Galway Fifty per cent.

WHEREAS the Port of Galway is a port established for the purposes of the laws relating to the customs of the United Kingdom:

And whereas the urban sanitary district of Galway forms part of or abuts upon the part of the said port herein-after described and the council of the said urban district are a sanitary authority of the said part of the said port:

And whereas each of the rural districts mentioned in the first column of the schedule hereto is a sanitary district and forms part of or abuts upon the said part of the said port and each of the councils of the said districts is a sanitary authority of the said part of the said port:

And whereas the council of the urban district of Galway have presented a petition in pursuance of the Public Health (Ireland) Acts 1878 to 1896 to the Local Government Board for Ireland (in this Order referred to as the Local Government Board) praying that they may be constituted the port sanitary authority of the said port:

The joint board shall be a body corporate by the name of the Galway Port Sanitary Authority and shall consist of seventeen members to be elected by the respective component authorities from among the persons who at the time of such election are members of their own bodies and the said authorities shall elect respectively the number of members specified in the second column of the schedule hereto.

Constitution of joint board.

4. The first election of members of the joint board shall take place at a meeting duly convened of each of the component authorities held within six weeks after the appointed day or within such further time as the Local Government Board may allow.

First election of members of joint board.

5. The clerk to each of the component authorities shall notify the Local Government Board in writing within seven days after such first election has taken place the names address and occupation of each person elected by such authority as a member of the joint board.

Notification of members elected.

6. The several members of the joint board shall go out of office and their successors shall come into office on the first day of April in each year provided that the members of the joint board elected at the first election shall continue in office until the first day of April one thousand nine hundred and four. The election in each year of members for the ensuing period of office by any component authority shall take place at a meeting of such authority held within the month next preceding such date or at such meeting as the Local Government Board may appoint.

Date of commencement of office.

7. Every member of the joint board shall continue in office until the day on which the several members of the joint board go out of office as provided by Article six of this Order or until he dies or resigns or becomes disqualified for holding office or vacates his seat for absence.

Duration of office.

8. Casual vacancies among the members of the joint board shall be filled as follows. The component authority by which the member causing the vacancy was elected shall at a meeting to be held within one month after such vacancy has taken place or within such further period as the Local Government Board may direct (of which meeting seven days' notice in writing shall be given by the clerk to such authority to each member of such

(4) Notices of all meetings of the joint board shall be delivered or sent by post so as to reach the last known place of abode or business of each member of the joint board in the case of an ordinary meeting two clear days before the day of such meeting and in the case of an extraordinary meeting one clear day before the day of such meeting or in either case at such earlier time as the joint board may direct.

Chairman and vice-chairman.

11. At the said first meeting and at the annual meeting the members of the joint board shall appoint one of their members chairman and another member vice-chairman of the joint board. Such chairman and vice-chairman shall hold office until the next annual appointment of chairman or vice-chairman unless he has previously died resigned or otherwise ceased to be a member of the joint board. In the event of the death or resignation of such chairman or vice-chairman or of his otherwise ceasing to be a member of the joint board the joint board at the next meeting after such vacancy has taken place shall appoint another member of the joint board to fill the vacancy.

Conduct of business at meetings.

12. At all meetings of the joint board the chairman or in his absence the vice-chairman shall preside and if at the commencement of the meeting the chairman and vice-chairman are both absent the members of the board who are present shall elect one of their number to preside at such meeting until the chairman or vice-chairman takes the chair.

Decision of questions at meetings.

Every question at any meeting of the joint board shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the members present and in any case in which there is an equality of votes on any question that question shall be deemed to be lost provided that where there is an equality of votes at the election of

And whereas the councils of the said county borough and counties (in this Order referred to as "the county councils") acting through the joint committee for the said asylum require to purchase and take the lands described in the schedule hereto or easements or rights over those lands for the purpose of providing an additional supply of water for the said asylum at Portrane in the county of Dublin:

And whereas it is alleged that the said lands are demesne lands:
