large Schoolhouse, and the strong objection, used by the Trustees we do resolve to tent a shed in the rear of the Workhouse to contain one hundred beds for fever patients, and to commence the building immediately.

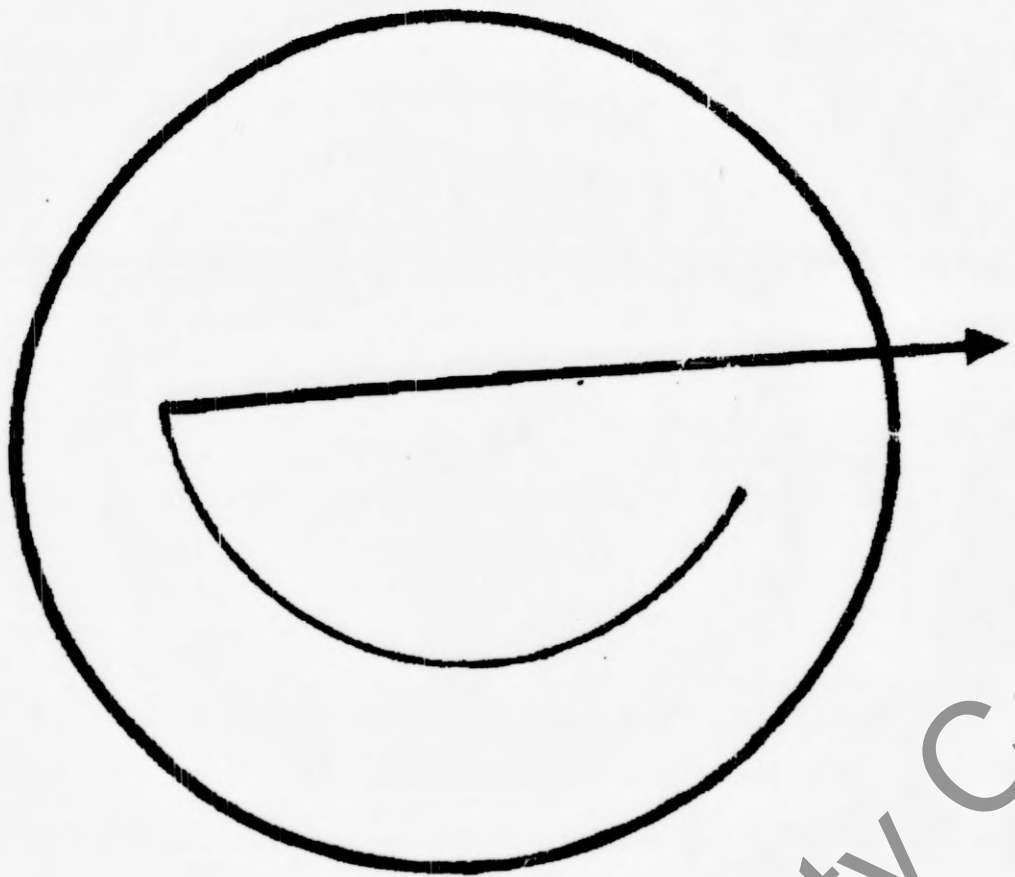
