The Reports of the Master and other Officers were read and Orders made thereon as follows:

The Clerk reports that in the week ending 11th Dec 1858 an entry has been made in the Provision Account by the Master of his having received Rice Meal & Barley Meal from John Riedy of Galway amounting to £2. 6. 3 for which the Master presented a Bill to the Board on the 15th March 1859. The Board on that day gave a cheque for the amount in favour of John Riedy, and the Master obtained the cheque from the Clerk, by stating that he had paid Riedy in cash and that he would get Riedy's receipt. The Clerk has several times since demanded the receipt from the Master but did not get it. When the Master was ill in June the Clerk applied to Riedy for a receipt, when Riedy told him he did not deliver any Meal to the workhouse since the time of the late Master.

The Clerk further reports that in the week ending 17th Mar 1859 an entry appears in the Master's Provision Account of Indian Meal and oatmeal to the amount of £2. 18. 9. The Clerk cannot tell from whom this has been received. He hopes the Master will be able to explain all to the Board - The Clerk would have made an earlier report only for the Master's late and protracted illness.

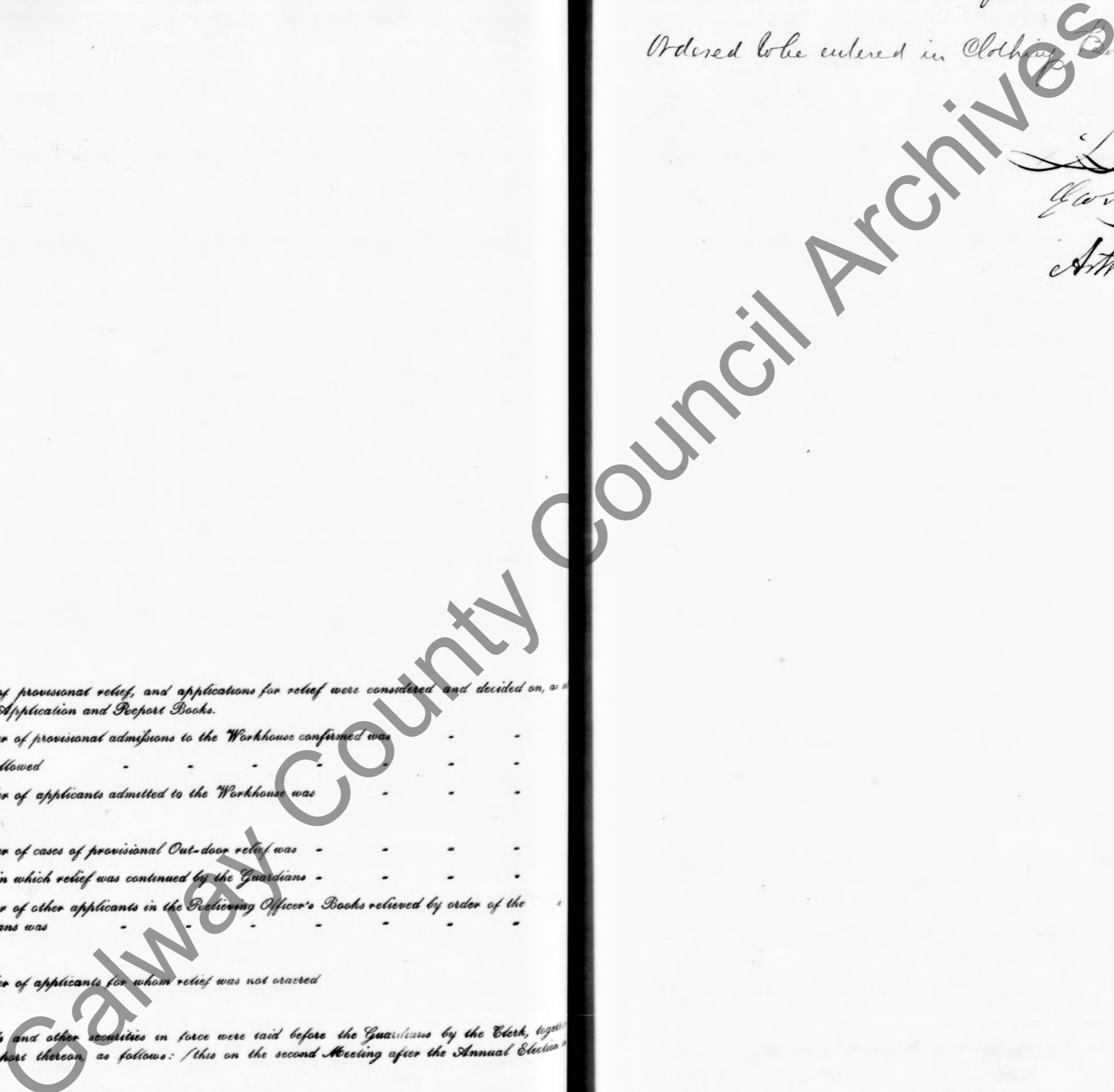

In reply to the Letter of the Poor Law Commissioners of 9th Inst N^o 15547, requesting to be informed of the circumstances under which the Guardians were presented with a Bill by the Workhouse Master for payment instead of passing thro the hands of the Clerk.

I beg to state that it is on Board day when the business of the Board is proceeding the Members of the Finance Committee present and examine Bills presented for payment and the Committee draw up a list with the parties names and amount of Bills passed for Cheques which list is then handed some and the Cheques filled accordingly. The Bill in question was laid before the Committee by the Master, it represented a special purchase of Meat made by him and the Committee considered all right and therefore passed the Bill without any reference to me.

I beg to observe that it is the practice here when provisions are exhausted and the Commissary (situated in Queen's 15 miles distant) delays the supply the Master purchases Meat at a Shop in the town and in the Bill for payment. The Bill in question was only one I know of which was passed by the Committee without my signature.

As regards the second query relating to persons who have been retained in the Relief list after leaving the workhouse. I have to state that the Books presented out the number of persons which should be in the house, and when the Master took the oath with the assistance of the Station Comptrol the Sumate in the house, the Supriary and House Hospital and it was then and only by that means, I discovered that persons who had left were not entered on the Discharge side of the Admission and Discharge Book.

The charge against the Master was investigated before the Resident Magistrate at Petty Sessions on the 9th Inst. and Informations taken against him.

Returnable to the Assizes of Galway.

I have to report that the late Master before he left made erasures and alterations in the Provision Check Account, and Relief List. The alterations in the Provision Check Account appear to be in the consumption of Bread and Milk in the Infirmary in which his Mother in law is Nurse. I believe those alterations were made in consequence of a difference between the Rates who had charge of the Provision, during the Master's illness and the Hospital Nurse who denies having received quantities which the Rates states he issued.

The other portion of the Provision Check appears all right. The alterations in the Relief list are made by entering days for Paupers who were discharged from the list by me during the late Master's illness. I have corrected the list the other Books are all right.

The Board will recollect that I have given them notice two attempts, of fraud and perjury which he absconded. On being of the opinion that he had received from Mary Molony, a box of Soap alleged to have been received from the Hallows. These articles were not delivered to the parties and were accordingly deducted from their Bill.

I have reason to believe that these reports, and the late one of fraud and forgery caused a great deal of trouble to me, and I am certain he made the alterations in the Books to cause confusion in the accounts, when I was keeping them and thereby place me in a difficulty as he made use of threats before he absconded. The Provision Check or the Abstract of the Relief list are not affected by the alterations.

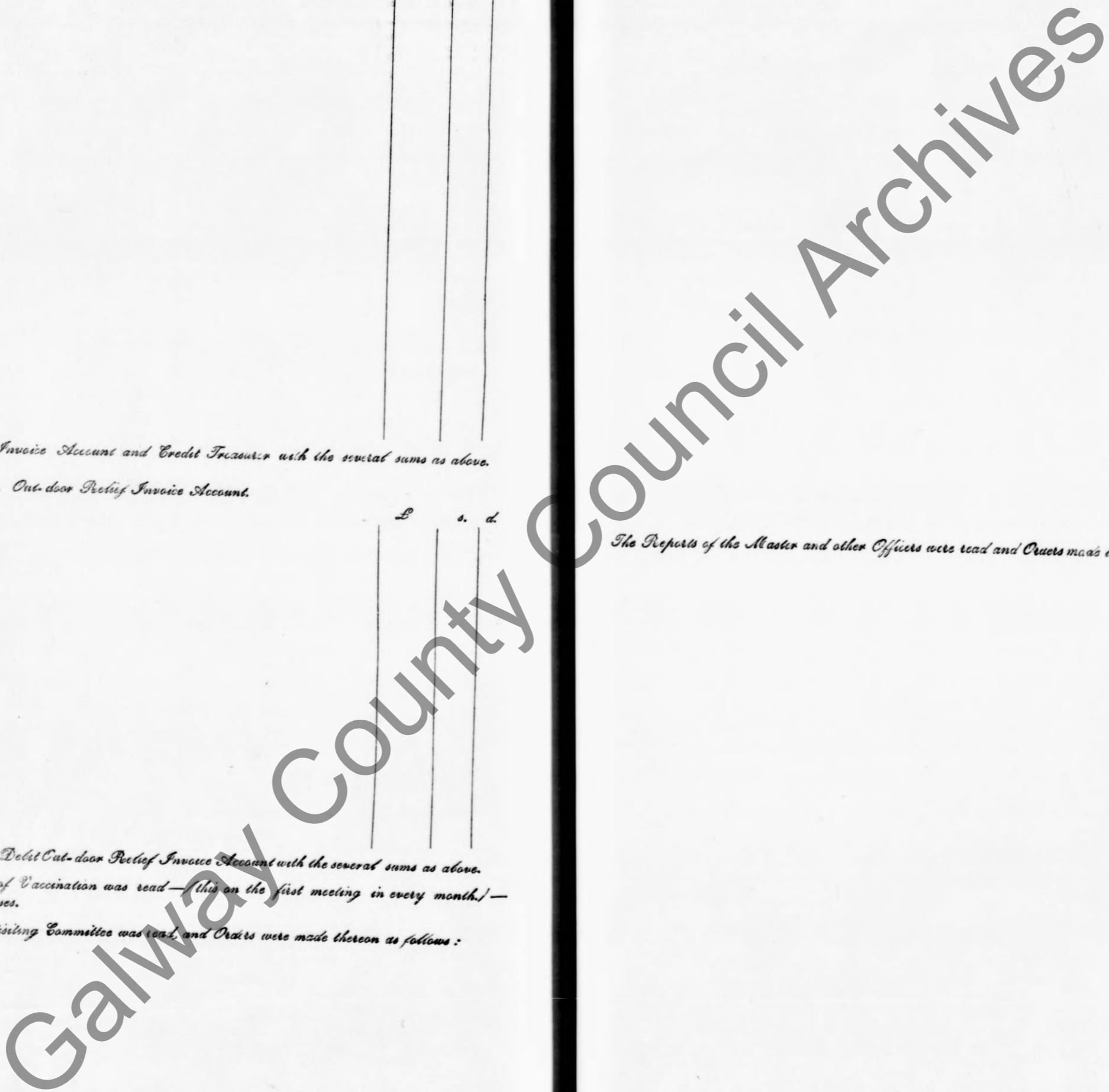
