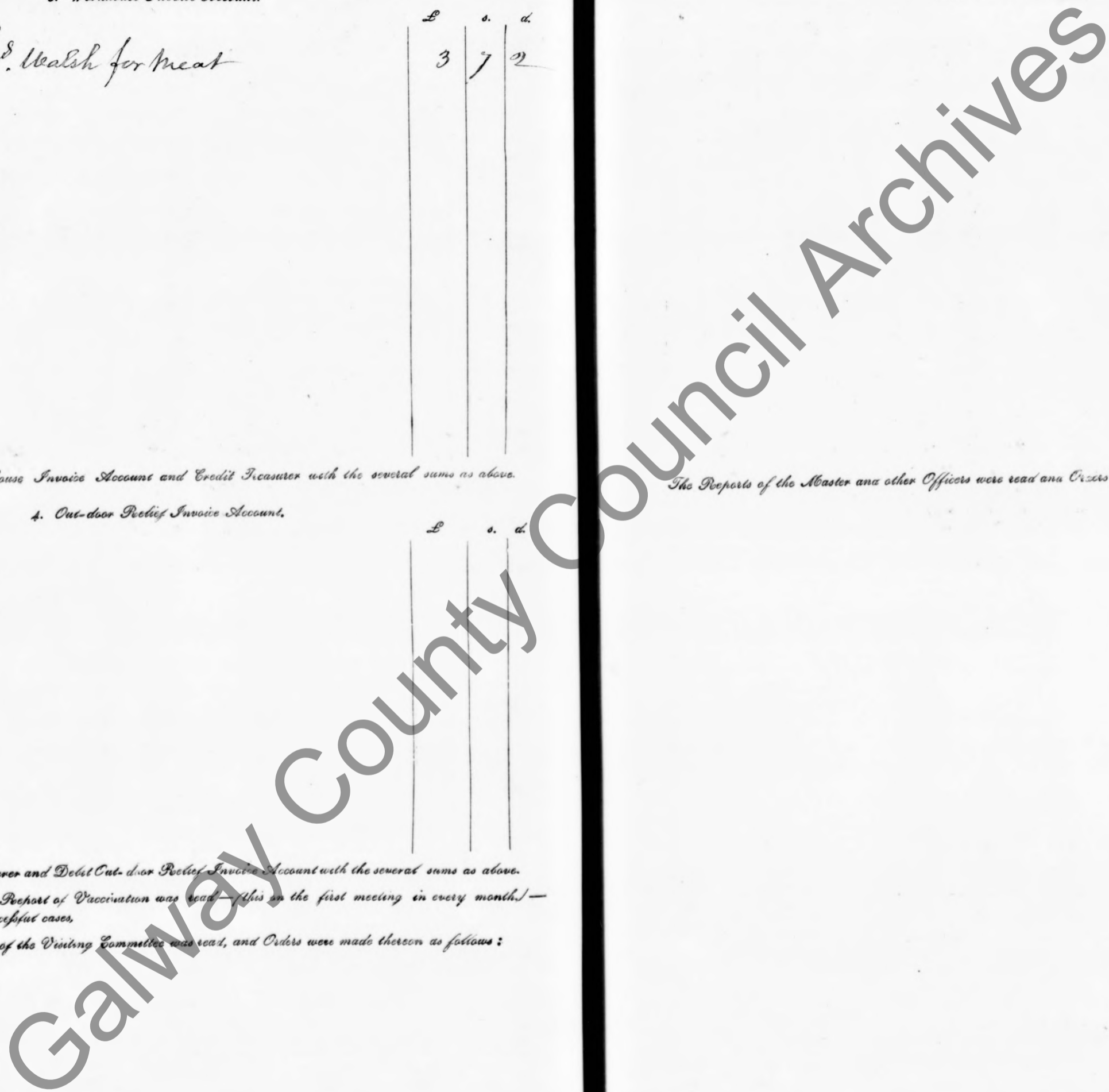

Resolved that an advertize for a Schoolmistress at a salary of £6 per annum with an apartment and Rations, and in addition to the ordinary duties, the person appointed will be required to instruct the young females in Needle work. Tenders to be received on the 1st prox.
