Letter from Poor Law Commissioners No 9917. 5 May 1862 relating to a Report of the Master of the Workhouse on the 29th Ult^o as to the absence of two paupers from the Workhouse without leave, and in reference to the Minute that the inmates in question be confined for six hours each day for four days, and that their allowance of milk be stopped for that period, the Commissioners state that the 11th Article of the Workhouse Regulations does not authorize the stoppage of Milk for more than two days, and they request to be informed by explanation from the Workhouse officers, as to the manner in which the parties evaded the usual precautions against quitting the premises.

The Master states, that the Pauper (O'Brien) Reported to the Board on the 29th Ult^o was placed by him outside the Gate leading to the Male Yard, for the purpose of watching the Vegetable grounds, he being unable to perform any other work, the lower part of his Body being almost paralysed, and tho' he left the part of the ground where he was placed, Fairyhill where he went to was not more than five hundred Yards from it, and also within the Workhouse grounds. — The female pauper was sent on the Workhouse grounds for sand which was required for scouring.
