Letter from Poor Law Commissioners, No 19642, 23 Sept 1863 relating to a reduction of twenty per cent which the Guardians resolved to take off the Clerk's estimate for a new Rate, and requesting to be informed of the grounds for making so large a reduction, and requesting the Guardians to reconsider the subject.

Ordered that the Commission be informed that in consequence of the remunerative employment about being given to labourers in the Govt Union, arising to the construction of a line of Railway through nearly the entire extent of it, and in consequence of the present abundant Harvest so favorably contrasting with the deficient ones of the last three years, the Guardians are of opinion that it would be strange if a sum of more than £100 should be required this year over last year, the estimated expenditure for last year was, £2322.17.0, and that for this year no less a sum than £2484, and therefore the Guardians are clearly of opinion, that in the

estimate sanctioned by them this month they have made complete provision for the requirements of the Union,
