The proficiency of the pupils, in all subjects, except Grammar, is fairly satisfactory; and in Grammar, none but the second class exhibit any decided defect; while in Arithmetic most classes go beyond the Programme. Their progress however has been hardly so rapid as I should have expected from the exertions of the Teacher. This I attribute chiefly to the unscientific and unmethodical arrangement of the former Time Table. The present one if faithfully carried out, will enable the Teacher so to economize her efforts, as with less labour to produce a greater effect.

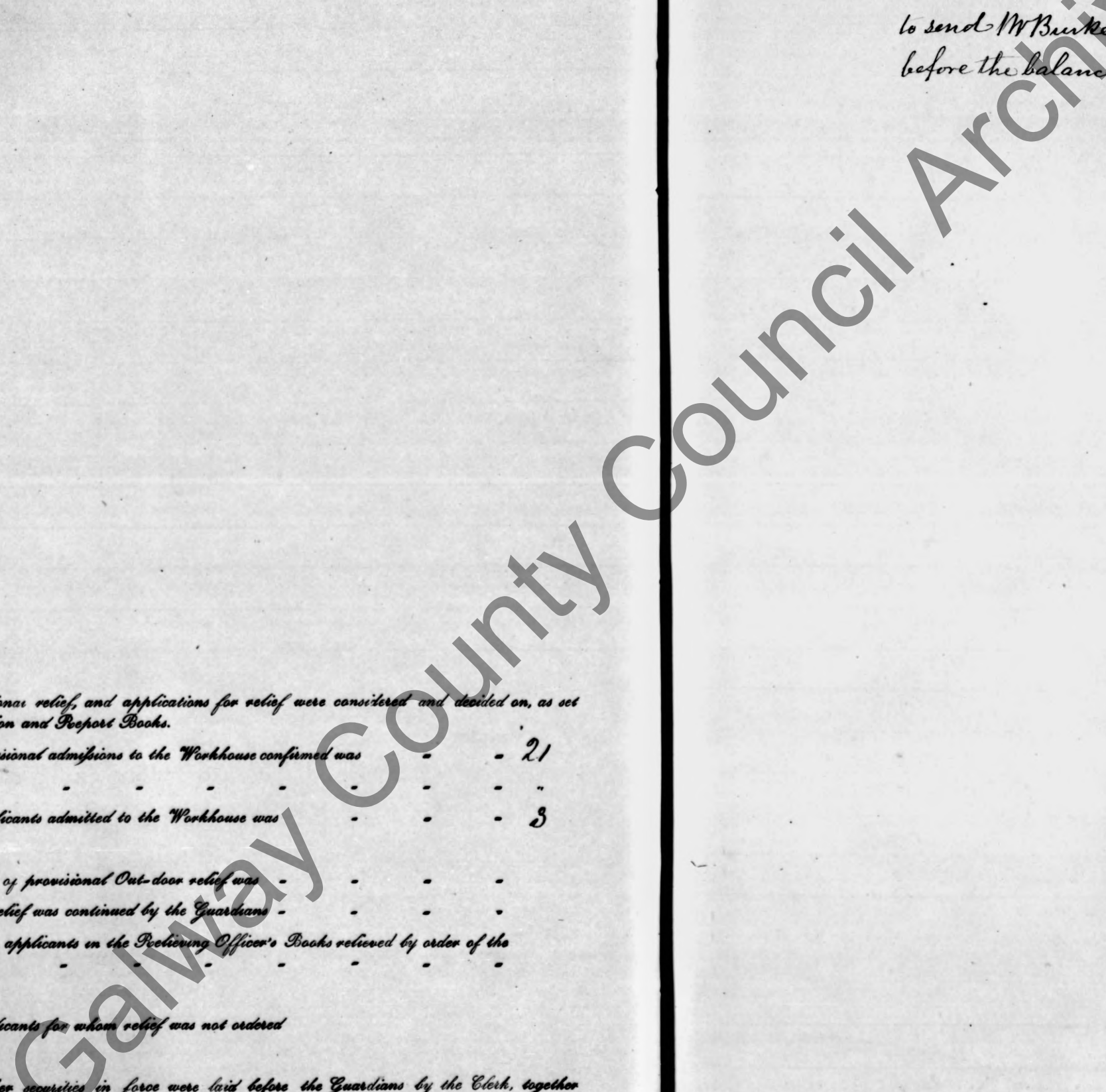
