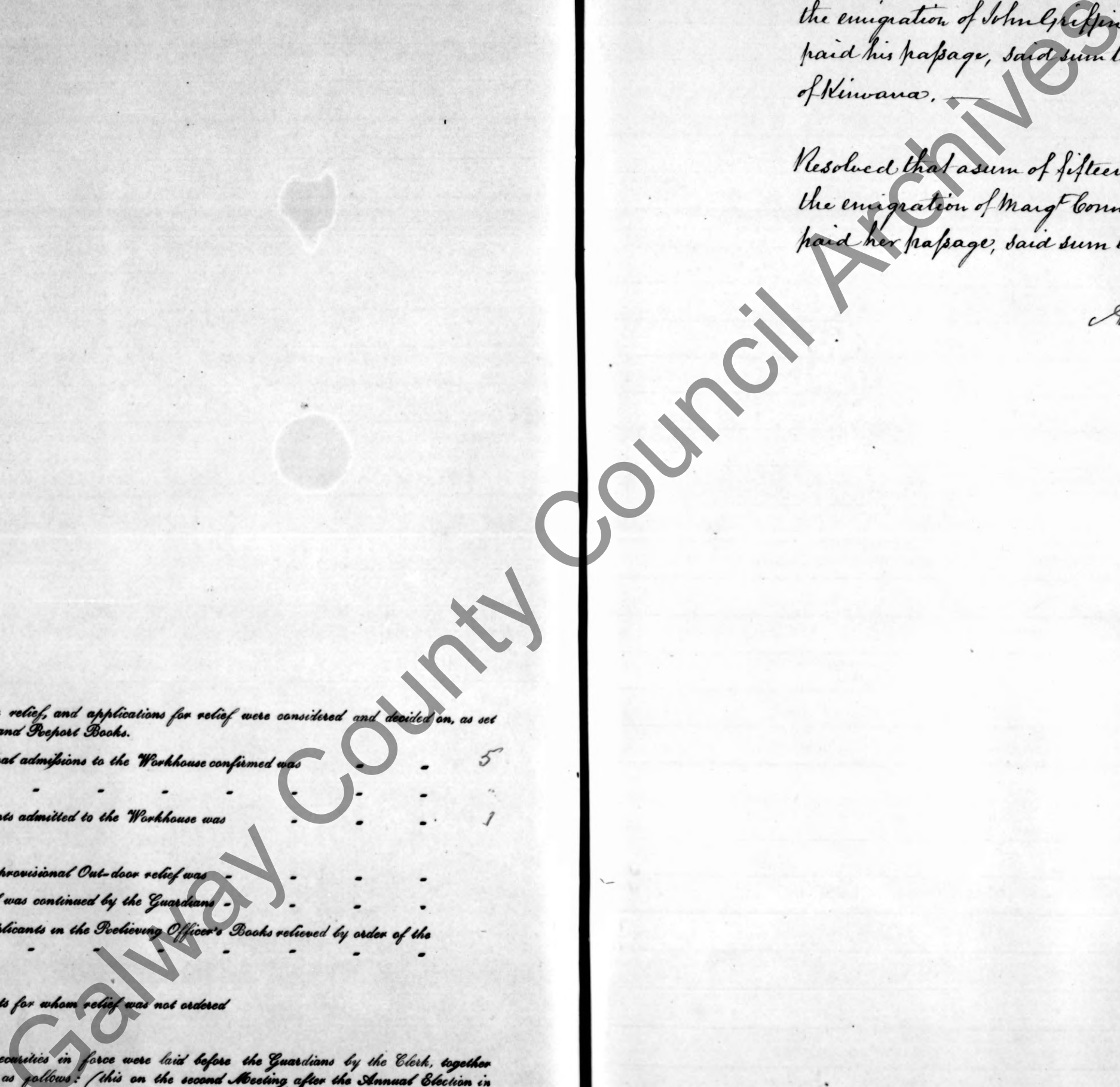

In reference thereto the Commissioners desire to state, that as the attention required by an Infant must necessarily occupy much of the Nurse's time, which should all be given up to her duties towards the sick, it appears to be advisable to take into consideration what steps the Guardians are called on to adopt under the circumstances,

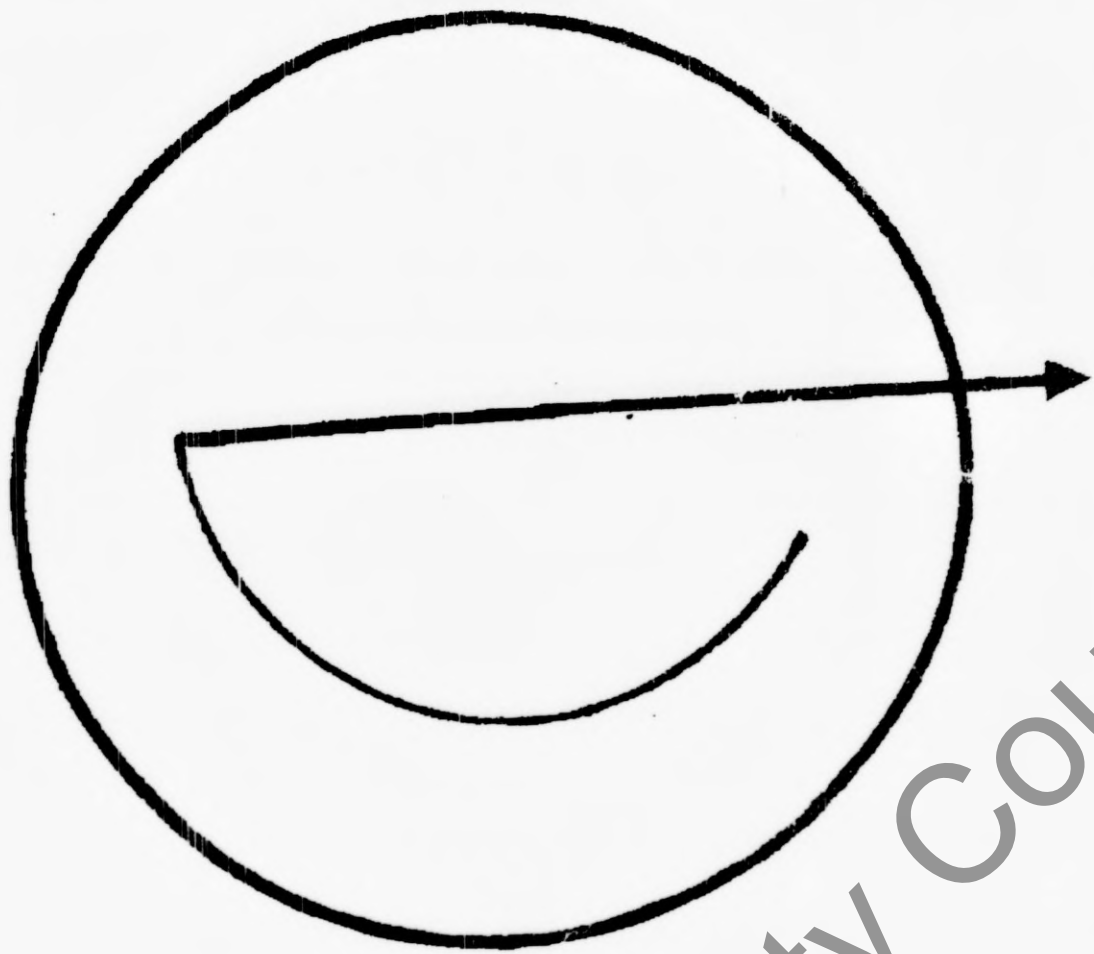
