Letter from Local Government Board: no 14232 — dated 5<sup>th</sup> inst. Stating with reference to the Master's report on the previous Board-day, — by which it appears that a man named Patrick Tracey attempted to commit an indecent assault on a female inmate named Mary. For a woman of weak intellect in the coal house, where she had been sent for coal out of which Tracey had chosen; that the circumstances under which this woman was permitted to go to the coal-house call for explanation, as the coal should be

be distributed by some of the male inmates every morning under the supervision of the Master or the Porter.

The following is the Master's explanation:—

With reference to the Local Government Board's letter no 14232 — the Master begs to explain that the coal is given out each morning under the supervision of the Porter, but on the occasions referred to the supply fell short in the kitchen where this woman was assisting, but in future the Master will take every precaution to prevent an recurrence of the kind.

Ordered.

The Guardians consider the Master's explanation satisfactory and are of opinion that in case the coals fall short the Master or the Porter should be present at the giving out of them.

The Medical Officer of the Workhouse applied for one month's leave of absence from the 8<sup>th</sup> inst and recommended Dr Stafford (RCS), L.R.C.P., & Lic. Midwifery Dublin, to discharge his duties while he is away.


