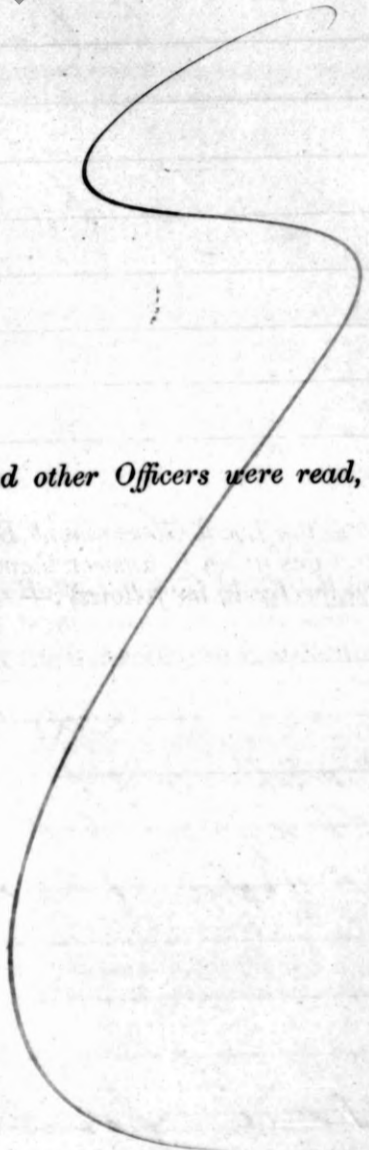

The Collection is not satisfactory,
especially in Mr. Corbett's district of
Collection. At time of my present
Audit he has upwards of £500
uncollected. There is no use in having
Bonds for collectors if such latitude
in regard to extension of their time for
Collection is given and the system of
paying poundage before the Collection
is closed tends to make collectors
indifferent as to their obligations. It is
only fair to say Mr. Hardaman has lodged
all but £10 of his Collection of Poor Rate
and all but £140 of the Poor Rate, at
the same time the whole Collection
should be closed before the 29th Sep.
and arrears brought into new Rate.

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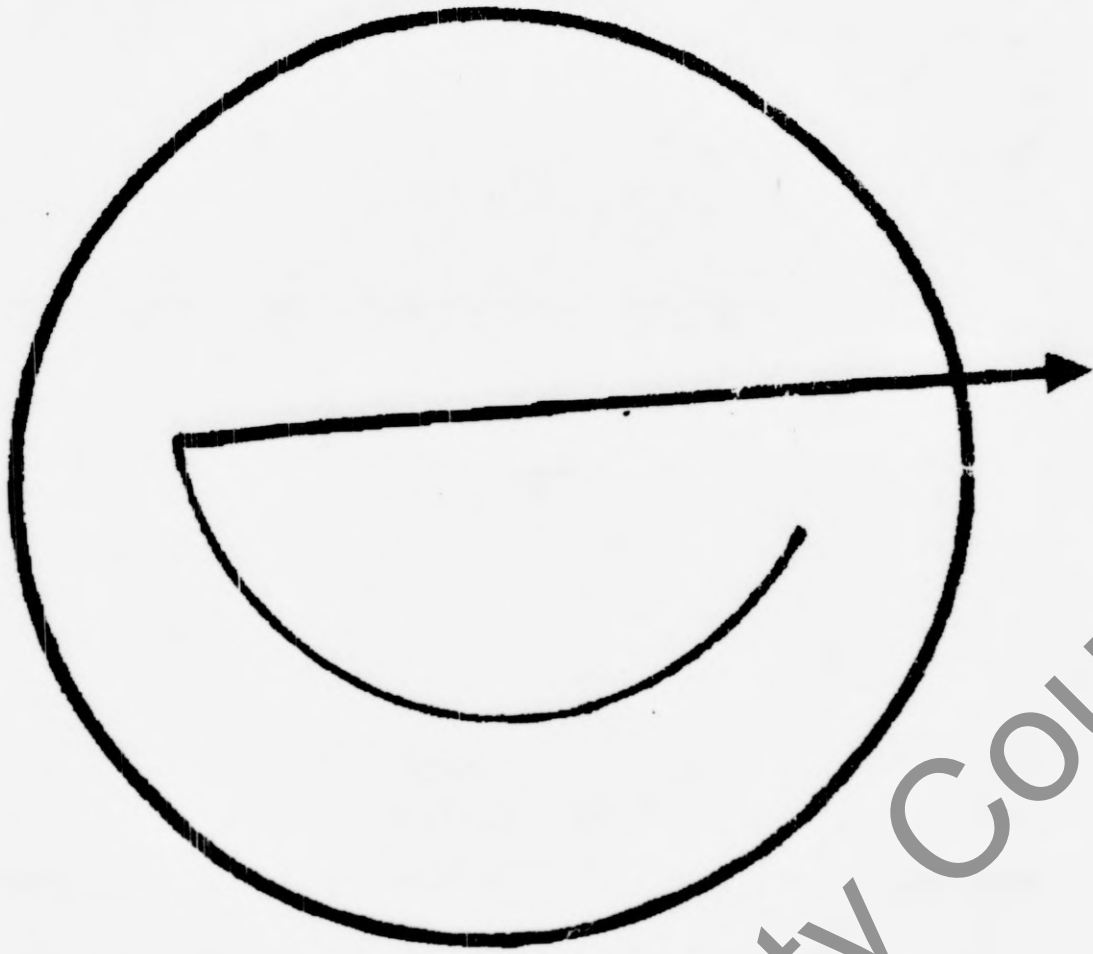
