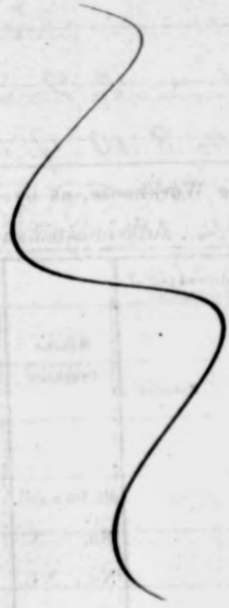

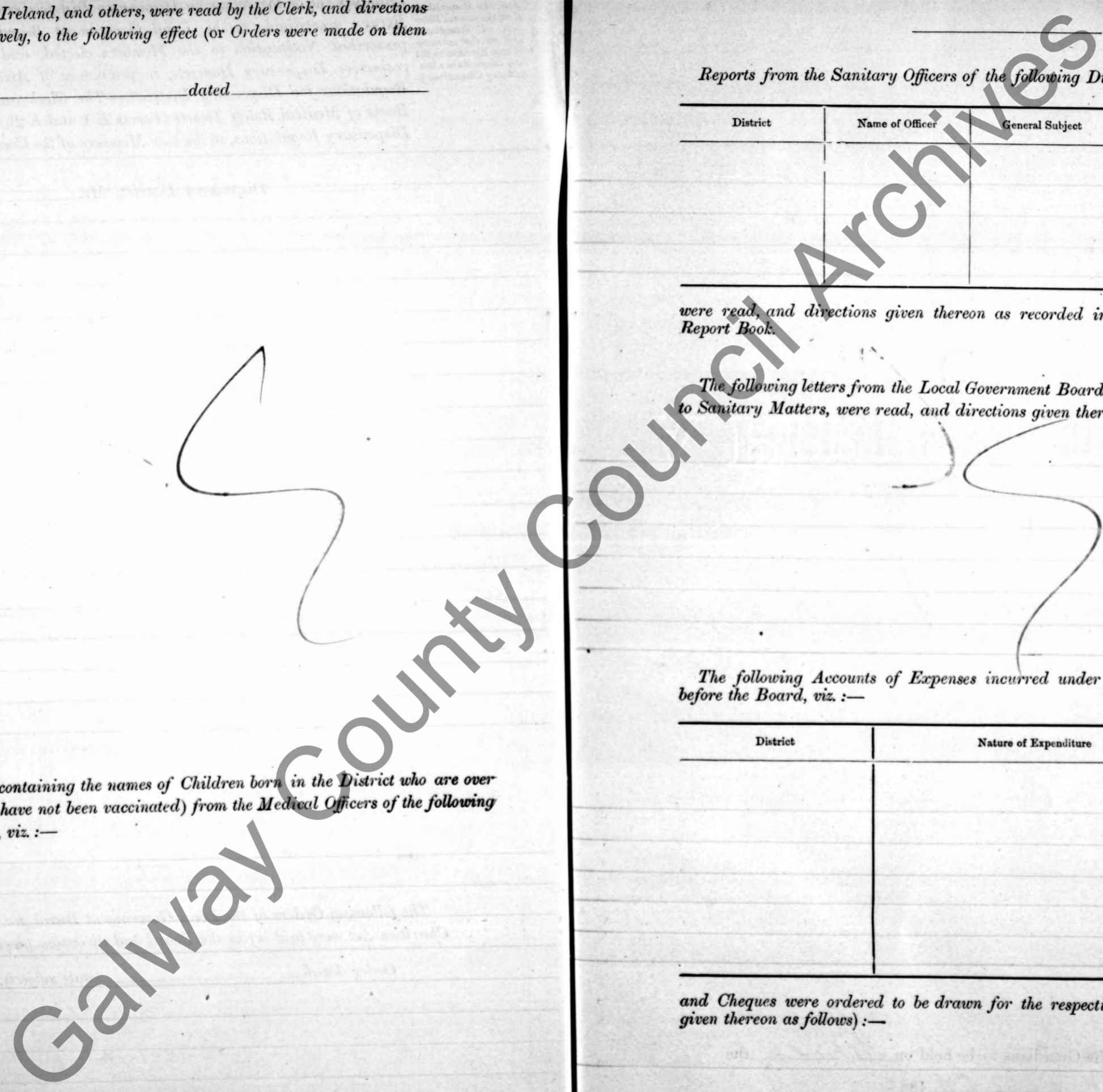

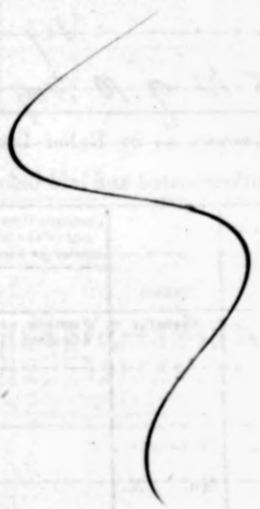

That Mr. D. F. Burke be asked to supply the articles for which Mrs. Moloney was contractor as she has retired from business.
