I was obliged on my part by the enormous rate of the guardians to retain my services. Since that time the Board imposed on me a great amount of extra work in the way of carrying a large

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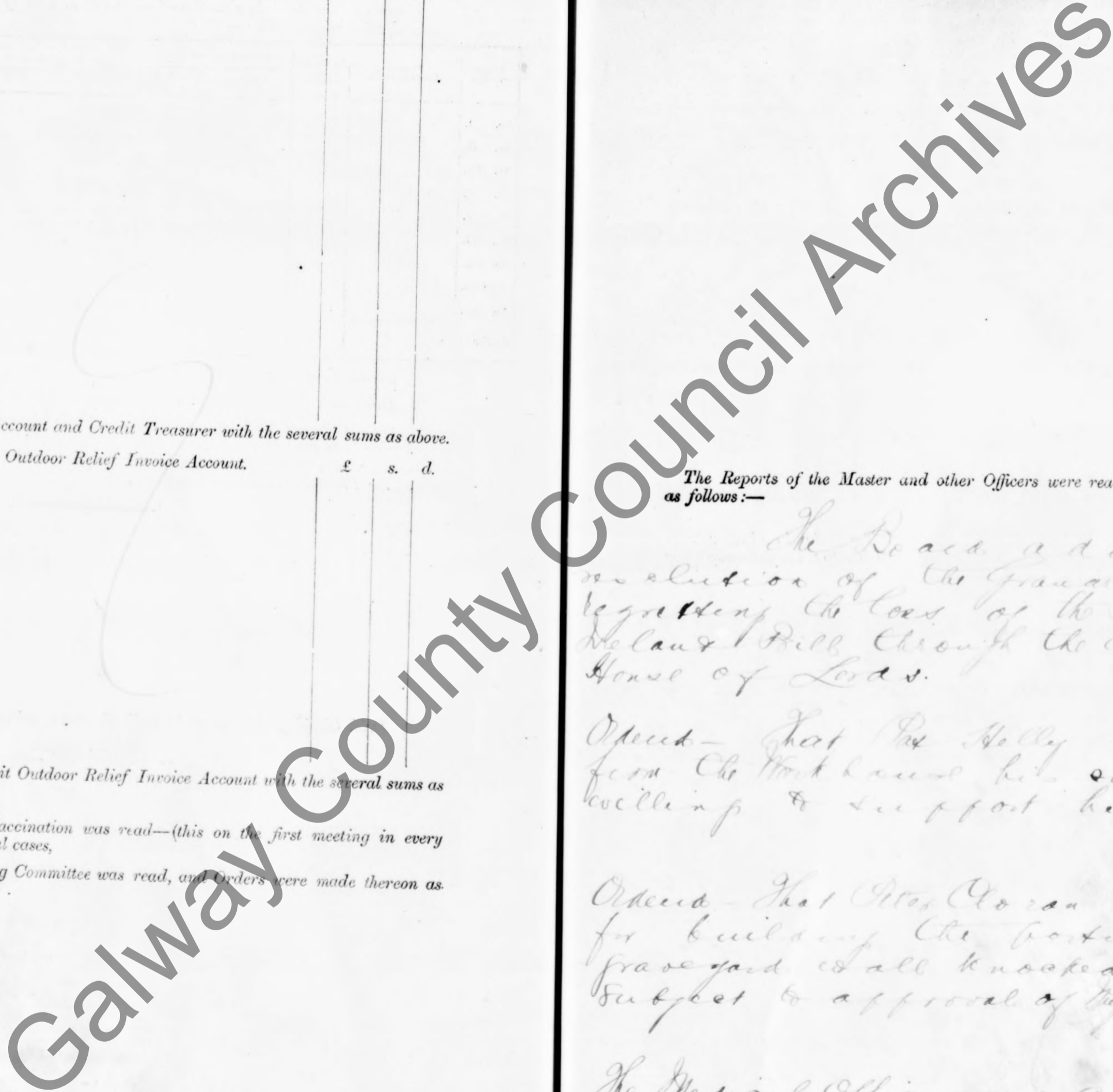
