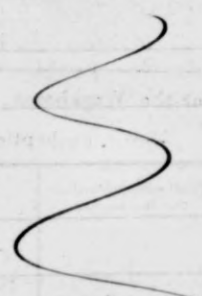

He recommends that the place be closed up, if it cannot be roofed & thoroughly cleaned. It is a source of great danger to the neighbourhood.



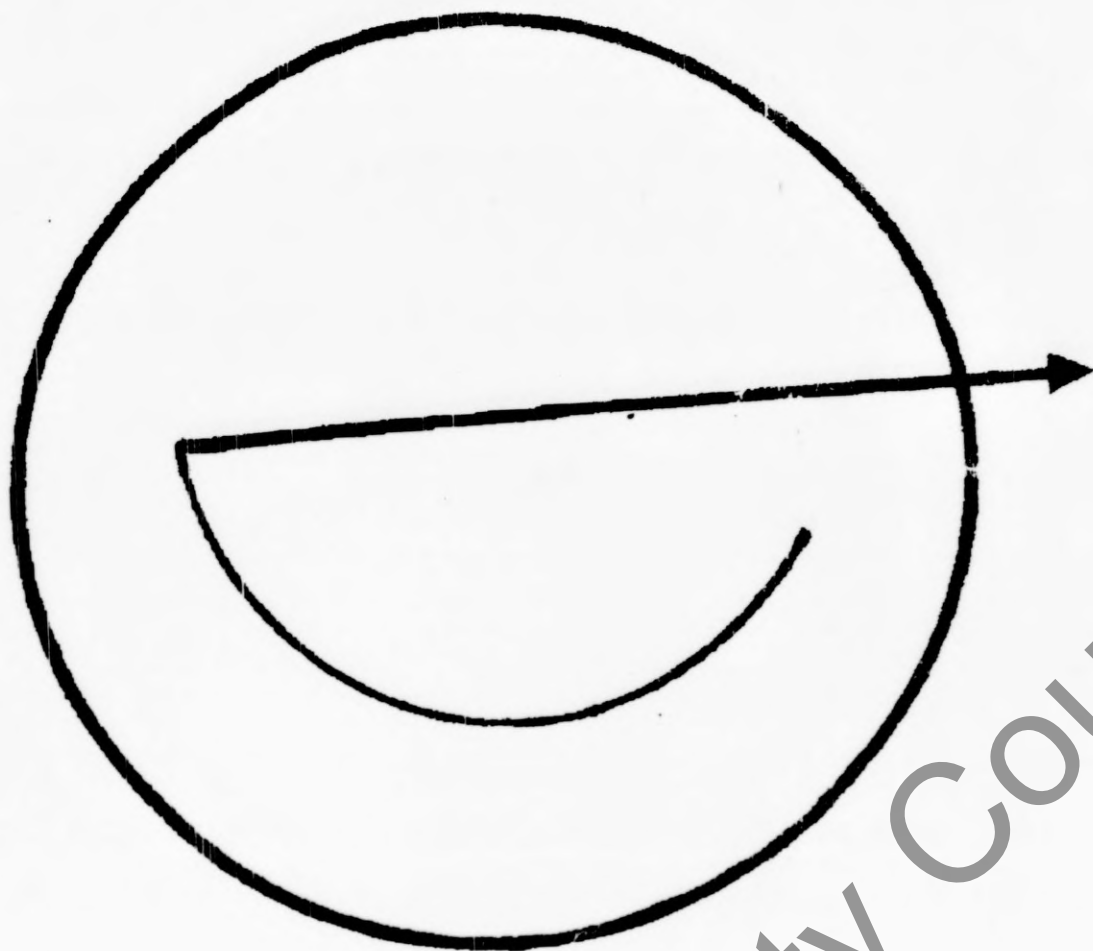
