The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland and others were read by the Clerk, and directions given to answer them respectively, to the following effect (or orders made on them respectively, as follows):—

Letter from Local Gov<sup>t</sup> Board dated 25<sup>th</sup> inst approving of the appointment of M<sup>r</sup> Michael Heada as Rate Collector at a forwarding of 6<sup>p</sup> on all rates collected and lodged by him to the credit of the Union within 6 months from the date of his warrant.

The Board accepted John Mulker's tender for conveyance of patients to the Workhouse and doing all horse work required for the Workhouse or farm as directed by the Master, for 12 months to 25<sup>th</sup> March 1899, for £18.

Read letter from Local Gov<sup>t</sup> Board dated 25<sup>th</sup> inst authorising the Guardians to administer relief out of the Workhouse in food or fuel to such destitute persons as they may consider require it whether in the occupation of land or not, for a period of two months from that date.

The Board add that it is incumbent on the Guardians to press forward the collection of the rates so that they may be in a position to meet any increased demand for relief that may occur.

Resolutions of the Guardians of Tuam, Mountmelick, Bandon, & Edenderry inquis on the subject of the Local Government Bill were submitted & read.

The Guardians adopted a resolution expressing sympathy with the National Teachers in their unjust & uncalled for treatment by a recent change in the Pension rules which compels them to pay premiums of more than 150 per cent in excess of those provided by an Act of Parliament passed in 1879.

On the recommendation of the Medical Officer two inmates named John McCarthy and Bridget Finnigan, chargeable to the Union at Large and Fort Division respectively, were ordered to be sent to Galway Hospital for treatment. McCarthy to be allowed 3/4 railway fare.



A shirt & pair of trousers <sup>(5/-)</sup> were allowed to Peter Milau on leaving the house

Ordered - That the inmates be supplied with the usual tea breakfast with eggs, and meat dinners on Easter Sunday. Two cent. of pork to be substituted for beef for dinners the Medical Officer not having any objection.
