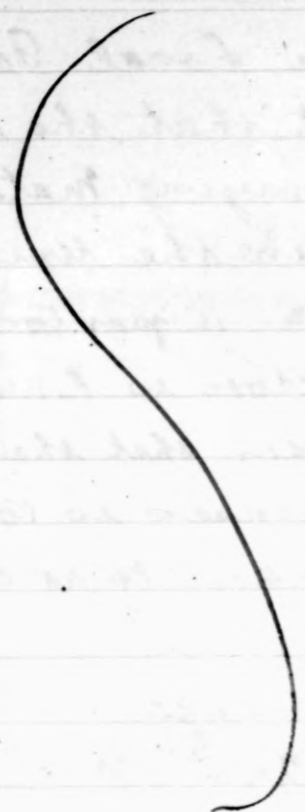

Miss M. Greene, night nurse wrote resigning her position and it was ordered to advertise for another night nurse at same salary and rations

Read letter from Local Govt Board, dated 22nd inst. stating that they have received the half yearly report of their Inspector, Major Rutledge Fair, on the Union, which is satisfactory as regards its financial condition.

The collection of the rate is somewhat slow, and the Board trust the Guardians will rigidly enforce their order directing the Collectors to lodge certain amounts each week. Major Rutledge Fair reports that pauper helpers are still employed in the Infirmary and that they sleep and have their meals there. The Board would draw the attention of the Guardians to their sealed order respecting the employment of pauper attendants on the sick, and also to the workhouse rules as regards classification. He also recommends the employment of additional paid ward helpers, to replace the pauper help.

He further reports that he had been informed by the Medical Officer that on several occasions the patients meals were very indifferently cooked.

The Board regret to observe from the report that nothing has been done to provide bath rooms, water-closets and additional day room accommodation for convalescing patients and also the defective state of the hot <sup>water</sup> boiler in the Infirmary and <sup>their Inspector</sup> recommends that a new range with boiler be provided.

Major Rutledge Fair also mentions that the following matters require attention:—

The floor of the men's dayroom is very defective and should be relaid with concrete.

Many of the windows let in the rain, and are defective and the Infirmary windows should be replaced as soon as possible. External and Internal painting is much needed.

It appears that the visiting Committee never meet. Stock of the provisions, clothing, &c. has not been taken since August 1897, and the Board desire to draw the Guardians attention to article 64 No 24 of the Workhouse Rules with respect to this matter.

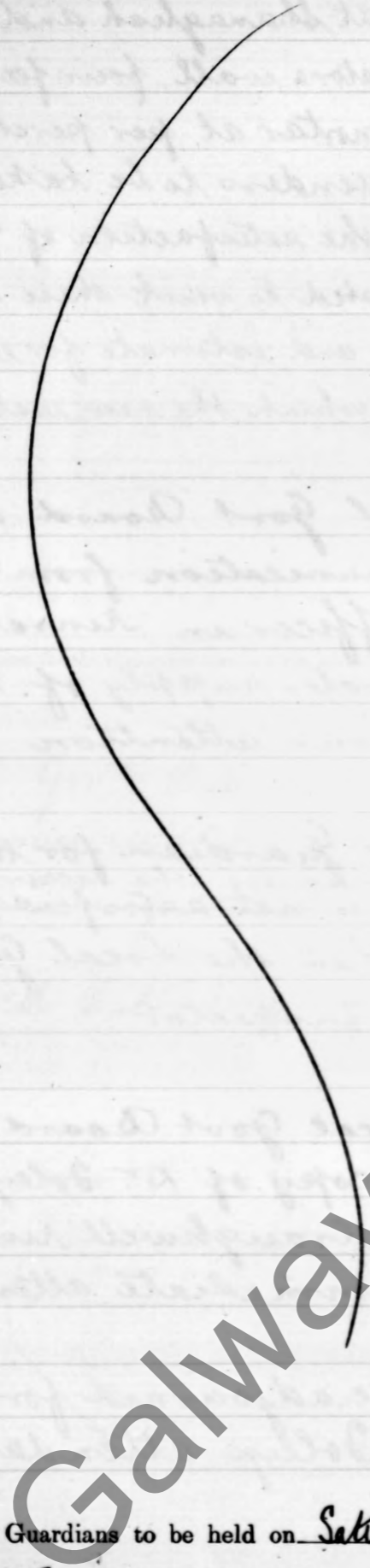
