Ordered — Advertise for tenders for the usual yearly supplies for this day month.

The Clerk was allowed a fortnight's leave of absence during which his Assistant, Mr. John Gormally, will discharge his duties. The leave will be availed of at times most convenient to the Guardians and will not be taken together, but it may be necessary for him to be absent on next Board day.

The Master reported that he inspected a cargo of coal at Clarecastle and saw bill of lading to which he found correct. Out of this cargo the contractor has only delivered 11 waggons which would leave about 50 tons still due. He requested directions as to whether he should pay another visit when the next cargo arrives.

Ordered — Inspect again.

The Master was allowed 7 or 8 days leave of absence during which the Matron aided by the Porter will discharge his duties.
