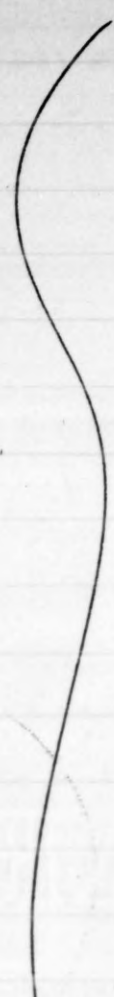

From same dated 10th May requesting the Guardians will take immediate steps to procure a four wheeled fever ambulance of a suitable modern type, and forwarding a sketch of a vehicle of which they have approved.

Ordered:—

The Guardians think the ambulance sketched would not be at all suitable for the roads in this Union. The Local Gov. Board are requested to forward the sketch of a two wheeled vehicle

From same dated 7th inst - No. 12541 - sanctioning the appointment of Christina Lee as Cook & Wardenmaid in the Infirmary at a salary of £8 a year with rations.

Submitted letters from Local Gov Board dated 7th inst - Nos 30,495 and 30,292 - acknowledging receipt of replies to their inquiries respecting the proposed appointment of Annie Gibbs as Wardmaid in the Fever Hospital, and Thomas Flanagan as Wardmaster in the Infirmary and stating they could sanction the proposed appointments only on condition that these persons will not be permitted to discharge any nursing duties, and the Medical Officer will be held responsible for taking care that they do not discharge nursing as distinguished from menial duties.

Ordered - "These Officers will not be employed in nursing"

The Board accepted Mr. J. P. Kennedy's tender for Whitehaven Coals (Esc Ship) according to the terms of advertisement at 27/4 per ton provided Contractor agrees to supply only 100 tons or any further quantity that may be required to 1st July 1902.

Ordered - Write to the adjoining Unions to know the dimensions of their turf bosc measures and the contract price per bosc at which they obtain their supplies of turf.

Read letter from Mr. Glynn, Solicitor, stating that he notified Callanan on the 21st May to proceed with his contract for new buildings in the Workhouse. He cannot sue on the bond yet as Callanan has up to October to do the work.

Read letter from the Nurse in the Infirmary asking that a new Range be provided for the Hospital Kitchen. The front of the old range (which is in use for the past 25 years) is broken and continually falling out and the girl in charge is in danger of being burnt.

Ordered - Referred to Visiting Committee.

An inmate named Mrs. Jordan was granted a fortnights' pass to enable her to go to Co Mayo to see his daughter who is seriously ill.

The Master was directed to supply, out of the cancelled articles, an old tick of straw and a couple of rugs to a woman who has 3 small children without bed or covering for them.

A suit of clothes, not to exceed 10/-, was ordered for a boy named Hyres on leaving the Workhouse.

Ordered - That Pat McGrath admitted on the 7th inst be only charged 6^d per day for his maintenance on consideration that he does some work daily same as the other inmates.

Ordered - That James Halloran, a pensioner, be only charged 5^d per day for his maintenance in consequence of his making himself very useful in carrying the cows &c.

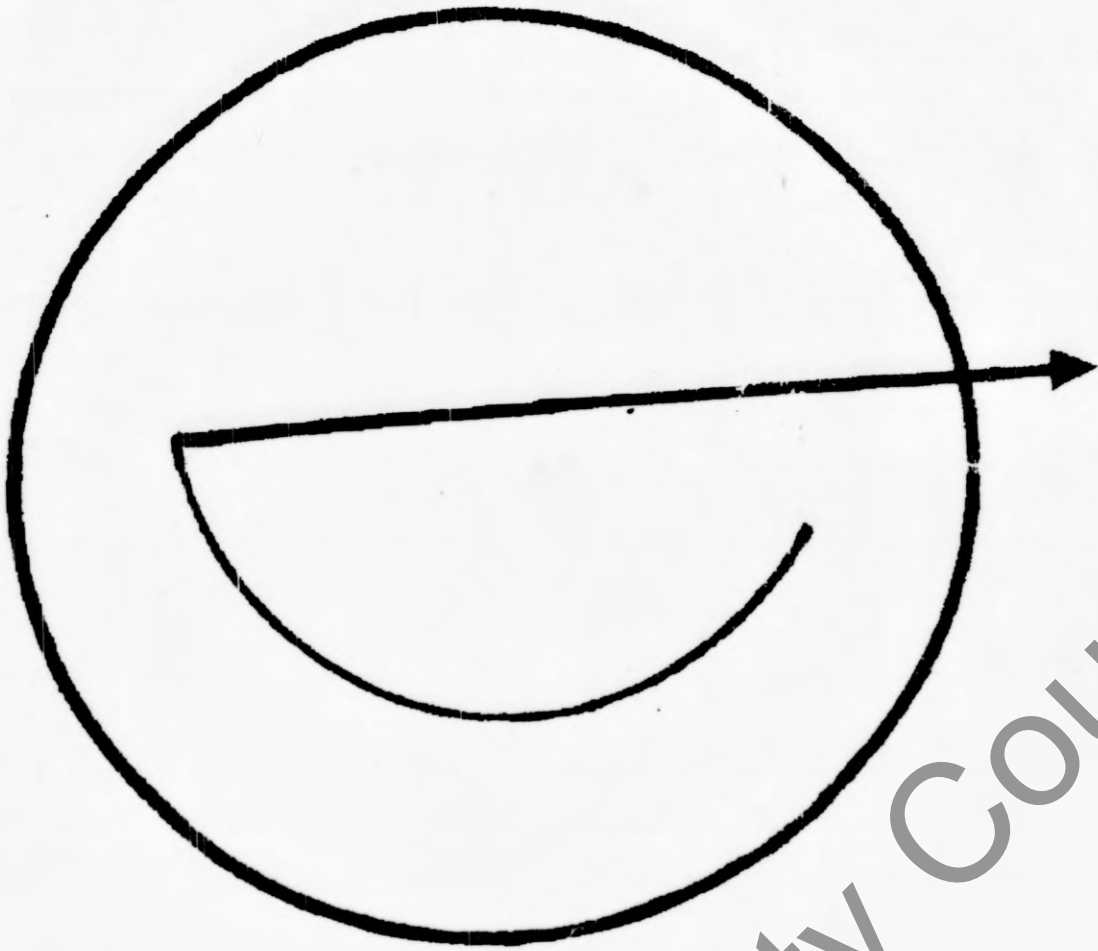
