Read letter from Mr Henry Conannon, Solicitor, cautioning the Guardians against entering into any other contract for the supply of meat as Mr McNamara is prepared to carry his out, and will hold the Board to their contract.

Tenders for the supply of meat were received from Mr J McNamara and Mr Patrick Burke, the former being the lowest, but both were considerably higher than the prices in the existing contract.

Resolved: - Acting on Mr Conannon's warning on behalf of Mr McNamara the Guardians agreed not to disturb the existing contract with Mr McNamara and hereby approve of his sureties Messrs Martin Goen and John McNamara (Queen St. Gort) and direct that the Union Seal be affixed to the agreement & Bond.

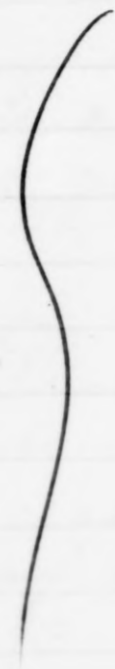
