The following letter was received from Nurse Gibbs as her, and the Attendants, reply to the Master's report of 30 March:-
Gentlemen,

The Attendant and I went to the devotions on Good Friday night. I left the Wardsman in charge of a Cancer patient that did not require any special care in my absence. The man in charge I could depend on as he looked after several Fever patients & was appointed by the Guardians about 13 years ago.

Myself pays him a small sum quarterly. Coming to the front gate the Attendant passed on and I turned back to speak to one of my friends when Master Nelly asked me why did I run when I saw him, and why I went out without his leave. I said I never asked the former Master for leave to go to my religious duties. Next he said I was drunk & he would send for the Police to remove me & so he did. I thought that a great indignity. I walked after him & asked him to explain himself & went after him to the Office in order that I might see the D. as I heard he was in the house. I never used a filthy word in my life and lost my temper under great provocation and so would any innocent person. The audience at the gate were a side-car & horse & man & some children.

The

The Attendant never took intoxicating drink since she was born, and the expressions used were that we should have a Master with a better head & not show off his new-fledged authority before outsiders
