Read letter from Local Gov^t Board dated 27th ulto. forward copy of the Auditor's ^{report} on the audit of the accounts for the half years ended 30th Sept. 06. and 31st March 1907.

The Auditor calls attention to the following matters:—

I An improvement in the reports of the Relieving Officers.
 II Relieving officer formally when granting provisional relief gives a stereotyped order for the same kind and value of goods, irrespective of the circumstances of each case.

III Relieving officer formally is surcharged with a sum of 13/- given by him in excess of authority.

IV The Petty Cash accounts must be kept by the clerk and not by the Master. Some £ 130 Petty Cash passed through the Master's hands in the course of one half year principally in connection with the farm, a large proportion of this sum should have been paid by cheque.

V The classification of inmates, as shewn on the admission and discharge Book, did not agree with that shewn on the Diet class Book. Any discrepancy of this nature is a serious matter, and the Master must by means of a careful roll-call, correct and adjust the books immediately.

VI The clerk had not regularly checked the diet class numbers in the Provision check account.

VII The Inventory Book is kept in an elaborate but confusing manner, and must in future be kept as explained.
