No 1, This bread was made from inferior flour. It was dark in colour and sour. It contained the very high proportion of 59% of water in the soft part, and 15.16% in the crust. There were no adulterants present.

No 2, was made from a better quality of flour. It was not sour. It contained the very high proportion of 62.03% of water. No adulterants in this bread.

The water in each loaf was very, and unusually, large in amount. It evaporated very quickly. After the first determination the water was estimated on the following day and was found to be 38.59% in the soft of No 1 and 40.3% in the soft of No 2.

A loaf purchased when quite fresh from a Dublin Bakery contained 41% of water in the soft part (about an average for bread) and on the following day 23.5% or less.

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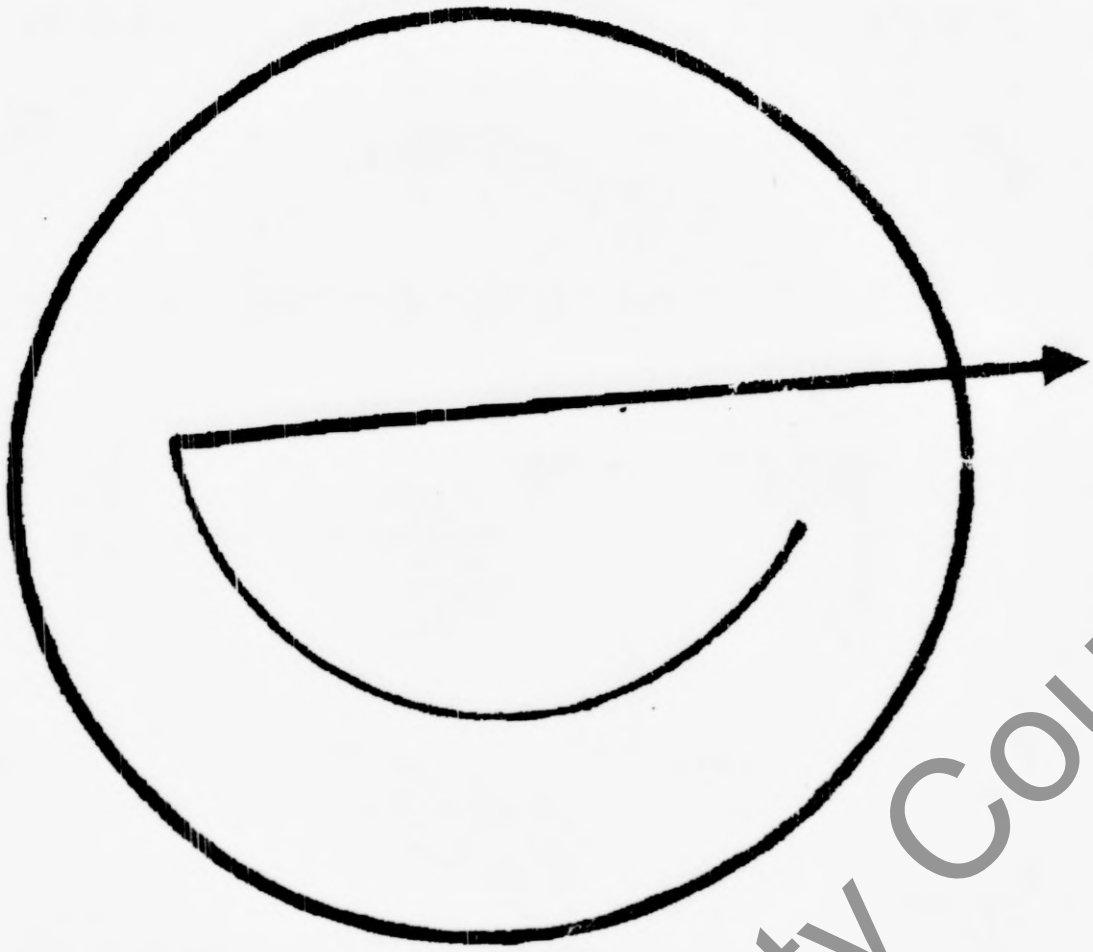
