Place a sheet of one-sided carbon paper, face downwards, between the first and second leaves, and then the sheet of black board after the Duplicate. Write upon the first leaf with a Duplicator or Manifold Slip Pen, and two copies will be the result.

In the case of a Triplicate Book, a sheet of two-sided carbon paper is placed between the 2nd and 3rd leaves, and then proceed as above.

A CARBO-PLATE can also be supplied to take the place of the black board. This is a plate which grips the carbon, and at the same time provides an extra hard plate, made of aluminium, which gives an extra clear copy, and enables the carbon paper and support to be placed in position for writing and withdrawn without touching the carbon with the hands.



#### Report of the Committee appointed by the Guardians on the 8th October, to consider the question of Boarding Out, Sc., of the Workhouse Children. :-

Children. :--We have visited the Children's ward in the Union, and we find there are to children (8 boys and 10 girls), the eldest 10 years old, and the youngest of whom 2 boys and 5 girls are over 7 years of age. The parents, or one of the parents, of seven of these children are in the house. As regards these (if egilible), and also all the other children in the house, we recommend that applications be invited from suitable persons for their boarding out. We find the average cost of each child in the workhouse amounts to about the estimate at about 25 each, making a total of say £14. a year per child, we find that ten children are at present boarded out at an average charge of £4, net including clothes, which amounts to from 20s to 80s. per an um of £4 for board and 30s, for clothes be adopted, as the normal allowance for the obsider now to be boarded-out, the allowance for clothes not 50 be paid to the foster parents, that to be experded by the Guardians. In the case of Mary, Bridget, and John, Huriey, Bridget Kally, Michael Glynn, and Michael Bermingham, we are it formed that one or both of the parents live in the Town of Gort, or the neighbourhood, and we recommend that they be called on to remove the children within a week from the workhouse, or that the Guardians will exercise their boarding out powers.

In the case of ohildren not applied for, we recommend that those under the sge of 7 years (both boys and girls), be sent to the Convent Infant School, and the girls over 7 be also sent to the Convent National School, Boys not taken at Infant School to be sent to the Convent National School, under the charge of Mrs Curtin, who is now in charge of the children, and that she also bring them back, and take full charge of them in the work-house, at her present salary of \$1 per month? We also recommend that suitable clothes be provided for the enildren at a reasonable rate, not ex-ceeding 10s. for each child per summ.

Should these recommendations be adopted, we estimate that Schools mistress' salary of 430, and rations, say £30, total \$60, will be saved forth-with, against which, in the case of children going to school. the only extra expenditure will be a slightly in crassed cast for the cothing, and the payment of allowance of £1, per month, to Mrs Curtin for taking charge of the children.

In the case of children boarded out, we estimate a direct saving of £8 10s. per child, per annum,


