



The Clerk begs to submit the following Memorandum with reference to the Guardians proposal to adopt a Scale of Allowances for maintenance of children boarded out in the Union.

The average sum allowed in Gort Union for maintenance (exclusive of clothing) is a little over £4 a year, and this is given for a child of any age up to 15 years.

It is intended that this amount shall still represent the average expenditure, but the Guardians think it might vary somewhat with the age of , the child.

It is believed that young children require a great deal of care and attention without making any return in the way of usefulness, whereas, with increasing years, their services are of some value and they do not need the attention of the earlier periods.

The average allowance in other unions in the South and West of Ireland appears to be about £6 10s, but in 14 of these unions only £4 and £5 are given.

The following scale has been adopted in Glenamaddy Union :-

Under 2 years, £10 a year.

,, 69 ,, 2 to 5 £8 9 to 15

In the amalgamated Unions of Scariff and Tulla the sums are:-

Under 9 years, £6 a year. Over 9 years, 5s a year.

The total cost of maintenance (exclusive of 30s each for clothing) of 19 children now bearded out in Gort Union is about 476 a year, and if the following scale was adopted in regard to these 19 children the gross expenditure would be practically the same:—

Children of 14 years should cease to be "boarded out," and ought to be placed on the "hired cut" list.

Besides the ninetcen children referred to, there are now in the Workhouse sixteen others, of whom it might be possible to board out eleven, whose ages are from six months to twelve years.

If these were boarded out at the present rate of £4 each, the cost would be £44; but if the allowance was regulated by the suggested scale the cost would be much more, viz:

Under 4 years .. £59 fas award

The increase is, however, necessary, as foster parents cannot be found for the very young children at £4 a year.

Should there 11 children remain in the Workhouse, they will cost over £120 a year (more than double), though this includes the value of clothing, which is excluded in all the other figures.

A Committee of the Board of Guardians recently recommended that applications should be invited for the boarding out of all children in the Workhouse qualified in that respect, and this should now be done. It will, however, be necessary to obtain the Local Government Board's consent to placing them in towns, should the applicants reside in such.
