Gentlemen,
I beg to acknowledge the receipt (through your clerk) of a letter from the Local Government Board referring to my recent appointment as Medical Adviser to the National Health Insurance Commissioners and inquiring what arrangements I had proposed to make for the discharge of my Dispensary duties during my absence on Insurance business.

It may enable the Board to form a better opinion as to the adequateness of those arrangements if I first state the nature of my duties as Medical Adviser:— I have only to attend an applicant for sick benefit when asked to do so by the Insurance Society; and only in cases where there may be a doubt as to the nature of the illness. It may give you an idea of the frequency of such calls when I state that though I am on duty since 1st August I have not yet a single call up to the present (23rd inst).

(2) At least two days must elapse from the time I get an order to examine to the day of my actual visit thus giving me ample time to make arrangements for discharge of my District duty. In all cases where possible if the applicant for sick benefit will attend at my house.

The longest distance I have to travel to an insured person is - I am credibly informed - not more than 6 or 7 miles outside my District & not more than 10 miles from my home.

The longest time I would be absent would be 2 1/2 or 3 hours and always in telegraphic communication with my home.

Now gentlemen I presume you would not - in face of these facts - require me to procure an Assistant to reside in Lincoln to act as my locum tenens for such short occasional absences with such ample notice given to me - I guarantee to make similar arrangements to those I have hitherto made in similar circumstances, and during my 13 years as your Medical Officer there has been no complaint of neglect although I had to be frequently from my District on other business.

I think you will observe that the duties of my Office are not nearly so arduous nor do they take up so much time as you might be led to believe in reading statements made in the Public Press.

It would just be as logical to require me to make any extraordinary arrangements for the discharge of my duties as Dispensary Doctor today and every other day I attend this Board as to ask me to do so for my position as Medical Adviser to the National Health Insurance Commission
